#### RESTRICTIVE COVENANT

WHEREAS, the American National Bank of Chicago, as Trustee, Trust No. 122569-05 ("Owner") (beneficiary, 400 North Ashland Partnership-whose partners own Consolidated Chemical Works, Ltd. and PortionPac Chemical Corp.) ("Owner"), holds legal title to certain parcels of real property ("Abutting Property") which are located at 400 to 432 North Marshfield Avenue, 401 to 421 North Marshfield Avenue, 1625 West Hubbard Street, 1600 to 1618 West Kinzie Street and 1624 to 1632 West Kenzie Street, in the County of Cook, State of Illinois, and which are currently used for the manufacturing (including production, processing, cleaning, servicing, testing and repair) of materials, goods or products only, and for those structures and additional uses which are reasonably necessary to permit such in mifacturing use including the location of necessary facilities, storage, employee and customer parking, and other similar uses and facilities; and

WHEREAS, on September 29, 1999, the City Council of the City of Chicago approved an ordinance (C.J. pp. 12570-75), a copy of which is attached as Exhibit A and which is hereby incorporated ("Ordinance") which Ordinance provided for the vacation of North Marshfield Avenue lying between the south line of West Hubbard Street and the north line of West Kinzie

particularly described in Exhibit A which is attached and incorporated; and

WHEREAS, the vacation provided in the Ordinance is conditioned upon the execution and recording by the Owner of a restrictive covenant running with the land that provides that the Subject Premises shall be used only for manufacturing (including production, processing, cleaning, servicing, testing and repair) of materials, goods or products only, and for those structures and additional uses which are reasonably necessary to permit such manufacturing use including the location of necessary facilities, storage, employee and customer parking, and other similar uses and facilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PASSAGE AND APPROVAL OF THE VACATION ORDINANCE AND THE VESTING OF TITLE IN THE OWNER, WITHOUT THE REOUTEMENT THAT THE OWNER PAY COMPENSATION TO THE CITY, THE OWNER LOES HEREBY AGREE WITH AND COVENANT TO THE CITY OF CHICAGO AS FOLLOWS:

described Subject Premises shall not be used for any use or purpose other than those which are set forth in Exhibit B, which is attached and incorporated, and for those uses and purposes which are accessory to such activities, including, but not limited to, the location of necessary and appropriate offices and facilities, storage, employee and customer parking and other similar uses and facilities. The consideration for such covenant, which is deemed and agreed to be valuable and sufficient, is the vacation by the City of Chicago of the Subject Premises for the benefit of Owner without the requirement that the Owner pay compensation to the City.

burdens of the covenant herein contained shall run with the Subject Premises. The benefits of such covenant shall be deemed in gross to the City of Chicago, its successors and assigns. The covenant shall be binding on the Owner, its successors and assigns, and shall be enforceable by the City, its successors and assigns. The covenant may be released or abandoned only upon approval of the City Council of the City of Chicago which may condition its approval upon the payment of such additional compensation by the Owner or any persons claiming under the Owner, which said City Council of the City of Chicago deems to be equal to the benefits accruing because of the release or abandonment of the covenant.

#### 3. VIOLATION OF RESTRICTIONS.

(a) Reversion. In the event that the Owner causes or permits a violation of a restriction contained herein, the C ty of Chicago may serve the Owner with a written notice entitled NOTICE OF VIOLATION setting forth the violations.

Such notice shall be sent to Owner, care of Warren B. Weisberg at 400 North Ashland Avenue, Chicago, Illinois 60622, with copy to Henry Waller at 120 North LaSalle Street, Suite 2900, Chicago, Illinois, 60602 or at such other address as parties may hereinafter designate by written notice to the other. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of said Notice of Violation, Owner shall cause the correction of or cure the violations set forth therein. In the event that Owner shall fail or refuse to cause the correction of or cure such violations within the period of thirty (30) days, the City of Chicago may then record with the Cook County Recorder of Deeds a copy of the Notice of Violation, proof of service of the Notice of

Violation and a Notice of Reversion. Upon the recording of the aforementioned documents by the City of Chicago, the Subject Premises shall be deemed to be conveyed by Owner to the City of Chicago. In the event that the City does not exercise its right of reversion as stated in this Section 3(a) within twenty (20) years from the date of execution and recording of this Covenant, then the provisions of this Section 3(a) shall be deemed null and void.

(b) Enforcement. In addition to the foregoing, this Covenant shall be enforceable by all remedies available in law or in equity, including injunctive relief.

WHEREAS, The City of Chicago ("City") is a home rule unit of local government pursuant to Article VII, Section 6 (a) of the 1970 Constitution of the State of pursuant, as such, may exercise any power and perform any function perform to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS The City has experienced a significant loss of industry and jobs in recent years, accompanied by a corresponding erosion of its tax base, due in part in industrial firms' inability to acquire additional property needed for their continued viability and growth; and

WHEREAS, Many firms edjoin streets and alleys that are no longer required for public use and might more productively be used for plant expansion and modernization, employee parking, improved security, truck loading areas or other industrial uses; and

WHEREAS, The City would benefit from the vacation of these streets and alleys by reducing City expenditures on maintenance, repair and replacement; by reducing fly dumping, vandalism and other criminal activity; and by expanding the City's tax base; and

WHEREAS, The City can strengthen established industrial areas and expand the City's job base by encouraging the growth and modernization of existing industrial facilities through the vacation of public streets and alleys for reduced compensation; and

WHEREAS, The properties of 400 to 432 North Marshfield Avenue, 401 to 421 North Marshfield Avenue, 1625 West Hubbard Street, 1600 to 1618 West Kinzie Street and 1624 to 1632 West Kinzie Street are owned by the American National Bank of Chicago, as Trustee, Trust Number 122569-05; and

WHEREAS, The American National Bank of Chicago, as Trustee, Trust Number 122569-05 (beneficiary: 400 North Ashland Partnership -- whose partners own Consolidated Chemical Works, Ltd. and PortionPac Chemical Corp.) employs forty-three (43) individuals in the production, packaging and distribution of cleaning solvents; and

WHEREAS, The City Council of the City of Chicago, after due investigation and consideration, has determined that the nature and extent of the public use and the public interest to be subserved is such as to warrant the vacation of parts of public street described in the following ordinance; now, therefore,

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. All that part of North Marshfield Avenue conveyed as sublots by cleed, from Helen Shepard Gage to the City of Chicago, said deed recorded January 20, 1898 in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds of Cook County, Illinois as Document Number 2640194, said land, now known as North Marshfield Avenue and being described in said deed as "Sublots 8½ and 8¾ in Lot 5 in Block 32 in the Canal Trustees' Subdivision Section 7-39-14", said Sublots 8½ and 8¾, also described and Lots 8½ and 8¾ in Block 5 in J. W. herein vacated, as a right-of-way for and existing water main and appurtenances thereto, and for the installation of any additional water mains or other municipally-owned service facilities now located or which in the future may be located in those parts of public street as herein vacated, and for the maintenance, renewal, and reconstruction of such facilities, with the right of ingress and egress at all times upon reasonable notice. It is further provided that no buildings or other structures shall be erected on the said right-of-way herein reserved or other use made of said area, which in the judgment of the municipal officials having control of the aforesaid service facilities would interfere with the use, maintenance, renewal or reconstruction of said facilities, or the construction of additional municipally-owned service facilities.

The vacations here in provided for are made upon the express condition that the American National Sank of Chicago, as Trustee, Trust Number 122569-05, shall agree to accept and maintain as private sewers all existing sewers and appurtenances thereto which are located in those parts of public street as herein vacated.

SECTION 3. The City of Chicago hereby reserves for the benefit of Commonwealth Edison Company, Ameritech Illinois and Prime Cable of Chicago, Inc., their successors or assigns, an ease nent to operate, maintain, construct, replace and renew overhead poles, wires and associated equipment and underground conduit, cables and associated equipment for the transmission and distribution of electrical energy, telephonic, telecommunications and associated services under, over and along those parts of public street as herein vacated, with the right of ingress and egress.

SECTION 4. The vacations herein provided for are made upon the express condition that within one hundred eighty (180) days after the passage of this ordinance, The American National Bank of Chicago, as Trustee, Trust Number 122569-05 shall deposit in the City Treasury of the City of Chicago a sum sufficient to defray the costs of removing paving and curb returns and constructing sidewalk and curb across the entrances to North Marshfield avenue hereby vacated, similar to the sidewalk and curb along the south side of West Hubbard Street and along the north side of West Kinzie Street. The precise amount of the sum so deposited shall be ascertained by the Commissioner of Transportation after such investigation as is requisite.

SECTION 5. The Commissioner of Transportation is hereby authorized to accept, subject to the approval of the Corporation Counsel as to form and legality, and on behalf of the City of Chicago, the benefits of a covenant or similar instrument restricting the use of the public way vacated by this ordinance to the manufacturing (including production, processing, cleaning, servicing, testing and repair) of materials, goods or products only and for those structures and

additional uses which are reasonably necessary to permit such manufacturing use including the location of necessary facilities, storage, employee and customer parking, and similar other uses and facilities. Such covenant shall be enforceable in law or in equity and shall be deemed to provide for reconveyance of property to the city upon substantial breach of the terms and conditions thereof. The benefits of such covenant shall be deemed in gross to the City of Chicago, its successors and assigns, and the burdens of such covenant shall run with the burden the public way vacated by this ordinance. The covenant may be released or abandoned by the City only upon approval of the City Council which may condition its approval upon the payment of such additional compensation which it deems to be equal to the benefits accruing because of the release or abandonment.

SECTION 5. The vacation herein provided for is made upon the express condition that within one hundred eighty (180) days after the passage of this ordinance, The American National Bank of Chicago, as Trustee, Trust Number 122569-05, shall like or cause to be filed for record in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds of Cook Courty Illinois, a certified copy of this ordinance, together with a restrictive covenant complying with Section 5 of this ordinance, approved by the Corporation Counsel and an attached drawing approved by the Superintendent of Maps.

SECTION 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
