SECTION 3-4 of the Illinois Statutory Short Form Power of Attorney for Property Law

Section 3-4. Explanation of powers granted in the statutory short form power of attorney for property. This Section defines cach category of powers listed in the statutory short form power of attothey for property and the effect of granting powers to an agent. When the title of any of the following categories is retained (not struck out) in a statutory property power form, the effect will be to grant the agent all of the principal's rights, powers and discretions with respect to the types of property and transactions covered by the retained extegory, subject to any limitations on the granted powers that appear on the face of the form. The agent will have authority to exercise each granted power for and in the name of the principal with respect to all of the principal's interests in every type of property of transaction covered by the granted power at the time of exercise, whether the principal's interests are direct or indirect, whole or fractional, legal, equitable or contractual, as a joint tenant or tenant in common or held in any other form; but the agent will not have power under any of the statutory exceptions (a) through (c) to make gifts of the principal's property, to exercise powers to appoint to others or to change any beneficiary whom the principal has designated to take the principal's interests at death under any will, trust, joint tenancy, beneficiary form or contractual arrangement. The agent is authorized to: open, close, continue and control all actionnes and deposits in any type of financial institutuion (which cere includes, without limitation, banks, trust companies, savings and building and load associations, credit unions and brokerage firms); which in and withraw from and write checks on any financial institution account or deposit; and, in general, exercise all powers with represent and under no distability.

(e) Stock and bond transactions. The agent is suchorized to: buy and sell all types of securities (which term includes, without limitation, stocks, bads, mutual funds and all other types of investment securities and financial instruments); collect, hold and safekeep all dividends, interest, earnings, proceeds of sale, on the includes, certificates and other-evidences of ownership paid or distributed with respect to securities; exercise all voting rights with respect to securities in person or by proxy, enter imp voting trusts and consent to limitations on the right to vote and, in general, or vice all powers with respect to securities which the principal could if present and under no disability.

(d) Tangible personal property transactions. The agent is authorized 13: buy and sell, lease, exchage, collect, possest and take title to all cangible personal property; move, store, thip, restore, maintain, repair, improve, manage, preserve, insuce and sufcheep cangible personal property; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to tan tible personal property which the principal could if present and under no disability.
