Section 3-4 of the Illinois Statutory Short Form Power of Attorney for Property Law.

Section 3-4. Explanation of powers granted in the statutory short form power of attorney for property. This Section defines each category of powers listed in the statutory short form power of attorney for property and the effect of granting powers to an agent. When the title of any of the following categories is retained (not struck out) in a statutory property power form, the effect will be to grant the agent all of the principal's rights, powers and discretions with respect to the types of property and transactions covered by the relained category, subject to any limitations on the granted powers that appear on the face of the form. The agent will have authority to exercise each granted power for and in the name of the principal with respect to all of the principal's interests in every type of property or transaction covered by the granted power at the time of exercise, whether the principal's interest are direct or indirect, whole or fractional, logal, equitable or contractual, as a joint tenant or tenant in common or held in any other form; but the agent will not have power under any of the statutory categories (a) through (o) to make gifts of the principal's property, to exercise powers to appoint to others or to change any beneficiary whom the principal has designated to take the principal's interests at death under any will, trust, joint tenancy, beneficiary form or contractual arrangement. - (b) Pinancial institution transactions. The agent is authorized to: open, close, continue and control all accounts and deposits in any type of financial institution (which tear includes, without limitation, banks, trust companies, savings and building and loan associations, credit unions and brokerage firms); deprisit it and withdraw from and write checks on any financial institution account or deposit; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to financial institution transactions which the principal could if present and under no disability.
- (c) Stock and bond transactions. The agent is authorized to: buy and sell all types of securities (which term includes, without limitation, stocks, bonds, mutual funds and all other types of investment securities and financial instruments); includes, without limitation, stocks, bonds, mutual funds and all other types of investment securities and other evidences of collect, hold and safekeep all dividends, interest comings, proceeds of sale, clambutions, shares, certificates and other evidences of ownership paid or distributed with respect to securities; exercise all voting rights with respect to securities enter into voting trusts and consent to limitations on the right to vote and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to securities which the principal could if present and under no disability.
- (d) Tangible personal property transactions. The agent is authorized to: prepare, sign and title any claim or application for Social Security, unemployment or military service benefits; sue for, settle or abandon any claims to any benefit or assistance under any federal, state, local or foreign statute or regulation; control, deposit to any account, collect, receipt for, and take title to and hold all benefits under any Social Security, unemployment, military service or other state, federal, local or foreign statute or regulation; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to Social Security, unemployment, military service and governmental benefits which the principal could if present and under no disability.
- (i) Tax matters.
