SECTION 3-4 of the Illinois Statutory Short Form Power of Attorney for Property Law

Section 3-4. Explanation of powers granted in the state of short form power of attorney for property. This Section defines each category of powers listed in the statutory short form power of interney for property and the effect of granting powers to an agent. When the title of any of the following categories is related (not strick out) in a statutory property power form, the effect wil be to grant the agent all of the principal's rights, powers and discretions with respect to the types of property and transactions covered by the retained category, subject to any limitations on the granted powers on the face of the form. The agent will have authority to exercise each granted power for and in the name of the principal with respect to all of the principal's interests in every type of property or transaction covered by the granted power at the time of exercise whether the principal's interests are direct or indirect, whole or fractional, legal, equitable or contractual, as a joint tabant or terms in common or held in any other form; but the agent will not have power under any of the statutory coregories (a) through (e) to make sifts of the principal's property, to exercise powers to appoint to others or to change any beneficiary whom the principal has designated to take the principal's interests at death under any will, trust, joint tenancy, beneficiary form or contractual arrangement. - (b) Financial institution transactions. The agent is authorized to: open, close, continue and control all accounts and deposits in any type of financial institution (which term includes, without limitation, banks, trust companies, savings and building and loan associations, credit unions and brokerage firms); deposit in and withdraw from and write checks on any financial institution account or deposit; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to financial institution transactions which the principal could if present and under no disability.

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- (c) Stock and bond transactions. The agent is authorized to: buy and sell all types of securities (which term includes, without limitation, stocks, bonds, mutual funds and all other types of investment securities and financial instruments); solisot, hold and safakeep all dividends, interest, earnings, proceeds of sale, distributions, shares, certificates and other syldences of ownership paid or distributed with respect to securides; exercise all voting rights with respect to securides in person or by praxy, unter into voding trusts and someon to limitations on the right to vote; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to securities which the principal could if present and under no disability.
- (d) Tangible personal property transactions. The agent is authorized to: buy and sail, lease, exchange, collect, posess and take title to all tangible personal property; move, store, ship, restore, maintain, repeir, improve, manage, preserve, insure and safekeep tangible personal property; and, in general, excretee all powers with respect to tangible personal property which the principal could if present and under no disability.
- (e) Safe deposit you transactions. The agent is authorized to: open, continue and have access to all safe deposit boxes; sign, renew, release or terrupate any safe deposit contract, drill or surrender any safe deposit box; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to safe deposit contars which the principal could if present and under no disability.
- (f) Insurance and annuly transactions. The agent is authorized to: procure, acquire, continue, renew, terminate or adictwise deal with any type of insurance or annuity contract (which terms include, with limitation, life, accident, health, disability, automobile casualty, property or liability insurance); pay premiums or essessments on or surrender and collect all distributions, proceeds or benefits payable under any insurance or annuity contract; and in general, exercise all powers with respect to insurance and annulty contracts which the principal would if present and under no disability,
- (g) Retirement plan transactions. The igent is authorized to: contribute to, withdraw from and deposit funds in any type of retirement plan (which terms include, with limits too, any tax qualified or nonqualified pension, profit sharing, stock bonus, employee savings and other retirement plan, individual re-irement secount, deferred compensation plan and any other type of employee plan); select and change payment options for the principal under any retirement plan; make rollover contributions from any retirement plan to other retirement plans or individual retirement, exercise all investment powers available under any type of self-directed retirement plan; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to retirement plans and retirement plans. balances which the principal could if present and under so dirability.
- (h) Social Security, unemployment and military service benefits. The agent is authorized to: prepare, sign and file any claim or application for Social Security, unemployment or military service of settle; sue for, settle or abandon any claims to any benefit or assistance under any federal, state, local or foreign statute or regulation, contract, deposit to any account, collect, receipt for, and take title to and hold all benefits under any Social Security, unemployment, military service and governmental benefits which the principal could if present and under no disability.
- (i) Tax matters. The agent is authorized to: sign, verify and file all the principal state and local income, gift, estate, property and other tax returns, including joint returns and declarations of estimated tex, pay all taxes; plains, sue for and receive all tax refunds; examine and copy all the principal's tax returns and records; represent the principal before any federal, state or local revenue agency or taxing body and sign and deliver all tax powers of attorney on behalf of the principal that may be necessary for such purposes; waive rights and sign all documents on behalf of the principal as required to settle, par and determine all tax liabilities; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to tax matters which the principal could if present published no disability.
- (I) Claims and litigation. The agent is authorized to: institute, prosecute, defend, abandon, compromise, arbitrate, scrile and dispose of any claim in favor of or against the principal or any property interests of the principal; collect any occipt for any claim or settlement proceeds and waive or release all rights of the principal; employ attorneys and other and enter into contingency agreements and other contracts as recessary in connection with litigation; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to claims and litigation which the principal could if present and under no disability.
