Penalties

If upon petition by the City for indirect criminal contempt, Defendants is found beyond a reasonable doubt to have wilfully refused to comply vith the Court's order, Defendant will be subject to a fine and/or incarceration, which fine or period of incarceration will not be affected by Defendant's subsequent compliance with the Agreed Order.
