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# AMENDED AND RESTATED DECLARATION OF CONDOMINIUM OWNERSHIP AND OF EASEMENTS, RESTRICTIONS AND COVENANTS FOR THE BARCELONA APARTMENT HOMES BUILDING NO. 5 CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATION

This Amended and Restated Declaration of Easements, Restrictions and Covenants is made and entered into by the Board of Managers of the Barcelona Apartment Homes – Building No. 5 Condominium Association in accordance with Section 27(b) of the Illinois Condominium Property Act [765 ILCS 605/27] (the "Act") whereby the Foard of Managers by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote can amend the Declaration in a der to conform to the Act. In accordance with Article XIII, Section 13.08 of the Association & Declaration whereby this Declaration may be amended by the approval of the owners having at least three-fourths (3/4) of the total vote.

This Amended and Restated Declaration of Easements, Restrictions and Covenants was approved on the lower day of September, 2008, by an instrument in writing signed by no less than three-fourths (3/4) of the owners in the Association. In accordance with Article XIII, Section 13.08 of the Association's Declaration whereby this Declaration may be amended by the approval of the owners having at least three-fourths (3/4) of the total vote.

This Amended and Restated Declaration of Easements, Restrictions and Covenants incorporates all of the changes in the law in plemented since the adoption of the Original Declaration. Such changes that supersede provisions of the Original Declaration are incorporated herein.

#### RECITALS:

The Declaration of Condominium Ownership and of Easements, Restrictions and Covenants for the Barcelona Apartment Homes – Building No. 5 Condominium vas registered in Cook County, Illinois as Document No. T2723071 (the "Original Declaration"), thus creating the Barcelona Apartment Homes – Building No. 5 Condominium Association ("Association").

Since the filing of the Original Declaration, the Illinois Condominium Property Act has been amended on numerous occasions. Many of these amendments to the Act contradict or modify provisions of the Declaration. This Amended and Restated Declaration of Easements, Restrictions and Covenants (hereafter "Declaration") is intended to bring the governing documents of the Association into conformance with the Act. Further, the Board of Directors and no less than three-fourths (3/4) of the unit owners have deemed it to be in the best interest to amend certain other provisions of

the Declaration in order to provide for the orderly and efficient management and operation of the Association.

This Declaration was approved by no less than three-fourths (3/4) of the unit owners in the Association, as evidenced by the ballots and petitions attached hereto. Also attached to this document is an exhibit containing an affidavit by an officer of the Board of Managers certifying that a copy of this document has been mailed by certified mail to all mortgagees having bona fide liens of record against any Unit.

Accordingly, the Declaration is hereby amended and restated to be and read, in its entirety as follows:

# ARTICLE I DEFINITIONS

- 1.01 Act. The Condominium Property Act of the State of Illinois, as amended from time to time.
- **1.02** <u>Association</u>. The Barcelona Apartment Homes Building No. 5 Condominium Association, an Illinois not-for-profit corporation, its successors and assigns.
- 1.03 <u>Board</u>. The Board of Managers of the Association, as constituted at any time or from time to time.
- **1.04 Building**. The building or buildings located on the parcel and forming part of the Property and containing the Units as indicated by the Plat.
- 1.05 By-Laws. The By-Laws of the Association which are attached hereto as
- 1.06 <u>Common Elements</u>. All portions of the property except the individual Units, as more fully described in Section 3.01 herein.
- 1.07 <u>Common Expenses</u>. The expenses of administration (including management and professional services), maintenance, operation, repair, and replacement of the Common Elements, the cost of additions, alterations, or improvements to the Common Elements; the cost of insurance required or permitted to be obtained by the Board herein; utility expenses for the Common Elements; any expenses designated as Common Expenses by the Act, this Declaration, or the By-Laws; if not separately metered or charged to the Owners, the cost of waste removal, scavenger services, water, sewer, or other necessary utility services to the Property; and any other expenses lawfully incurred by or on behalf of the Association for the common benefit of all of the Owners.

- 1.08 <u>Declaration</u>. This instrument with all Exhibits hereto, as amended from time to time.
- **1.09** <u>First Mortgage</u>. A bona fide first mortgage, first trust deed or equivalent security interest covering a Unit Ownership.
  - 1.10 First Mortgagee. The holder of a First Mortgage.
- **1.11 Garage**. That portion of the Property so designated on the Plat as being for the parking of passenger vehicles.
- Limited Common Elements. A portion or portions of the Common Elements which are designated by this Declaration as being a Limited Common Element appurt and to and for the exclusive use of Owners of one or more, but less than all, of the Units. Without limiting the foregoing, the Limited Common Elements assigned and appurte rant to each Unit shall include the following (1) perimeter windows and the exterior surfaces of doors which serve the Unit, (2) the exterior surface of perimeter walls which define the boundary planes of the Unit, and (3) any system or component part thereof which serves the Unit exclusively to the extent that such system or component part is located outside the boundaries of the Unit. All balconies and patios, if any, shall be a part of the Coromon Elements and not a part of any individual Unit; however, each Unit Owner shall be entitled to the exclusive use and possession of that balcony and patio or those balconies and patios, if any, direct access to which is provided from his respective Unit and which is or are located outside of and adjoining his respective Unit; until such time as the Board or Association, as hereinafter provided, determines to the contrary, each Unit Owner shall be responsible for repair, maintenance and appearance of the patios and-balconies, the exclusive use and possession whereof is extended hereby, at his own experice, including (without limitation) responsibility for breakage, damage, malfunction and ordinary wear and tear.
- 1.13 <u>Majority or Majority of the Unit Owners</u>. The Owners of more than 50% in the aggregate in interest of the undivided ownership of the common elements. Any specified percentage of the Unit Owners means such percentage in the aggregate in interest of such undivided ownership. "Majority" or "majority of the members of the Board of Managers" means more than 50% of the total number of persons constituting such Board pursuant to the By-Laws. Any specified percentage of the members of the Board of Managers means that percentage of the total number of persons constituting such Board pursuant to the By-Laws.
- **1.14** Occupant. A person or persons, other than an Owner, in possession of one or more Units.
- 1.15 Owner or Unit Owner. A Record Owner, whether one or more Persons, of fee simple title to any Unit, including contract sellers, but excluding those having such interest merely as security for the performance of an obligation.

- **1.16** Parcel. The lot or lots, tract or tracts of land, described in the Declaration, submitted to the provisions of the Act.
- 1.17 Parking Area. The area provided for parking of passenger vehicles and automobiles as shown or referred to on the Plat.
- **1.18 Person**. A natural individual, corporation, partnership, trustee or other legal entity capable of holding title to real property.
- 1.19 Plat. A plat or plats of survey of the Parcel and of all Units in the property submitted to the provisions of the Act, which may consist of a three-dimensional horizontal and vertical delineation of all such units.
- 1.20 Property. All the land, property and space comprising the Parcel, all improvements and structures erected, constructed or contained therein or thereon, including the building and all easements, rights and appurtenances belonging thereto, and all fixtures and equipment intended for the mutual use, benefit or enjoyment of the Unit Owners, submitted to the provisions of the Act.
- 1.21 Record. To record in the office of the recorder or the county wherein the Property is located.
- 1.22 <u>Resident</u>. An individual who resides in a Unit and who is either an Owner, a tenant of the Owner, a contract purchaser of the Unit, or a relative of any such Owner, tenant or contract purchaser.
- 1.23 <u>Undivided Interest</u>. The percentage of Ovine ship interest in the Common Elements appurtenant to a Unit as allocated in the original Declaration of Condominium Ownership, amended from time to time thereafter.
- **1.24 Unit**. A part of the property within the Building including one or more rooms, occupying one or more floors or a part or parts thereof, and designed and intended for independent use as a residential apartment by one family.
- 1.25 <u>Unit Ownership</u>. A part of the Condominium Property consisting of one (1) Unit and its Undivided Interest in the Common Elements appurtenant thereto.
- **1.26** <u>Voting Member</u>. An individual who shall be entitled to vote in person or by proxy at meetings of the Owners, as more fully set forth herein.

# ARTICLE II UNITS; SUBMISSION TO ACT

**2.01** Submission of Property to the Act. The Property was submitted to the provisions of the Illinois Condominium Property Act

- 2.02 <u>Units; Description and Ownership</u>. The legal description of each Unit shall consist of the identifying number or symbol of such Unit as shown on the Plat. Every deed, lease, mortgage or other instrument may legally describe a Unit by its identifying number or symbol as shown on the Plat, and every such description shall be deemed good and sufficient for all purposes, as provided in the Act. Each Unit shall consist of the space enclosed and bounded by the horizontal and vertical planes set forth in the delineation thereof as shown on the Plat. Except as otherwise provided by the Condominium Property Act, no Unit Owner shall, by deed, plat or otherwise, subdivide or in any other manner cause his Unit to be separated into any tracts or parcels different from the whole Unit as shown on the Plat.
- 2.03 <u>Certain Structures Not Constituting Part of a Unit</u>. Except as a tenant-in-common with all other Unit Owners, no Unit Owner shall own any pipes, wires, conduits, public utility lines or structural components running through his Unit and serving more than his Unit, whether or not such items shall be located in the floors, ceilings or perimeter or interior walls of the Unit.

# ARTICLE III COMMON ELEMENTS

- 3.01 <u>Description</u>. Except as cinerwise in this Declaration provided, the Common Elements shall consist of all portions of the Property, except the individual Units. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the Common Elements shall include the land, outside walks and driveways, randscaping, corridors, halls, elevators, stairways, courtyards, entrances and exits, balconies lobbies, laundry, parking area, storage lockers or areas, basement, roof, mail boxes, pipes, ducts, flues, chutes, electrical wiring and conduits, central heating, public utility lines and other utility installations to the outlets, such component parts of air conditioning sleeves, floors, ceilings and perimeter walls not located within the Unit boundaries as shown on the Plat, and structural parts of the Building, including structural columns located within the boundaries of a Unit.
- and own an undivided interest in the Common Elements as a tenant-in-common with all other Owners of the Property, and, except as otherwise limited in this Declaration, shall have the right to use the Common Elements for all purposes incident to the use and occupancy of such Owner's Unit as a place of residence, and such other incidental uses permitted by this Declaration, which right shall be appurtenant to and run with his Unit. The extent or amount of such ownership shall be expressed by a percentage amount and once determined shall remain constant, and may not be changed without unanimous approval of all Unit Owners. The developer determined each Unit's corresponding percentage of ownership in the Common Elements as set forth in the schedule attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by reference as though fully set forth herein.

3.03 No Partition of Common Elements. There shall be no partition of the Common Elements through judicial proceedings or otherwise until this Declaration is terminated and the Property is withdrawn from its terms or from the terms of any statute applicable to condominium ownership; provided, however, that if any Unit Ownership shall be owned by two or more co-Owners as tenants-in-common or as joint tenants, nothing herein contained shall be deemed to prohibit a voluntary or judicial partition of said Unit Ownership as between such co-Owners.

# ARTICLE IV GENERAL PROVISIONS AS TO UNITS AND COMMON ELEMENTS

Mo Severance of Ownership. No Owner shall execute any deed, mortgage, lease or other instrument affecting title to his Unit Ownership without including therein both his interest in the Unit and his corresponding percentage of ownership in the Common Elements, it being the intention hereof to prevent any severance of such combined ownership. Any such deed, mortgage, lease or other instrument purporting to affect the one without including also the other shall be deemed and taken to include the interest so omitted even though the latter is not expressly mentioned or described therein

### 4.02 Use of the Common Elements.

- General. Subject to the provisions of this Declaration, each Unit Owner shall have the nonexclusive right to use the Common Elements (except the Limited Common Elements and portions of the Property subject to leases, easements or licenses made by or assigned to the Board) in common with the other Unit Owners, as may be required for the purrose of ingress and egress to, and use, occupancy and enjoyment of, the respective Unit Ownership owned by such Unit Owner, and such other incidental uses as are permitted by this Declaration. Use of Limited Common Elements shall be governed by this Declaration. Such rights to use and possess the Common Elements, including the Limited Common Elements, shall be subject to and be governed by the provisions of the Act, this Declaration, and rules and regulations of the Association. In addition, the Association shall have the authority to lease, grant licenses or concessions, or grant easements with respect to parts of the Common Elements, subject to the provisions of the Declaration and By-Laws. All income derived by the Association from leases, licenses, concessions or other sources shall be held and used for the benefit of the members of the Association, pursuant to such rules, resolutions or regulations as the Board may adopt or prescribe.
- (b) <u>Guest Privileges</u>. The aforedescribed rights shall extend to the Unit Owner and Occupants, members of the immediate family, guests, visitors, agents, servants, invitees, customers and licensees of the Unit Owner, subject to reasonable rules and regulations adopted or prescribed by the Association with respect thereto.

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(c) <u>Disclaimer of Bailee Liability</u>. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Declaration, neither the Board, the Association nor any Unit Owner shall be considered a bailee of any personal property stored in the Common Elements and shall not be responsible for the security of such personal property or for any loss or damage thereto, whether or not due to negligence.

## 4.03 Maintenance, Repairs and Replacements.

- (a) By the Association. The Association, at its expense, shall be responsible for the maintenance, repair, and replacement of those portions, if any, of each Unit which contribute to the support of the Buildings but excluding, however the interior surfaces of walls, ceilings and floors. In addition, the Association, shall maintain, repair, and replace all pipes, wires, conduits, ducts and other facilities for the furnishing of utility services which may be located within the Unit soundaries and forming part of any system servicing more than one Unit, exclusive of any portions of the foregoing which may be located at or beyond the wall outlets, or which may be the responsibility of an individual Unit Owner under paragraph (b) pelow, or any other provision of this Declaration. Maintenance, repairs, and replacements of the Common Elements shall be furnished by the Association acting by and through the Board as part of the Common Expenses, subject to the Py-i aws or rules and regulations of the Association.
- (b) By the Unit Owner. Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (a) above or paragraph (c) below, each Unit Owner shall furnish and be responsible for, at his own expense:
  - (1) All of the maintenance, repairs and replacements within his own Unit, all interior doors appurtenant thereto, all windows and screens, including the glass surfaces, and all internal installations of such Unit such as refrigerators, ranges, and other kitchen appliances lighting fixtures and other electrical fixtures and plumbing, and any portion of any other utility service facilities located within the Unit; provided, however, that such maintenance, repairs and replacements as may be required for the bringing of water and electricity to the Units, shall be furnished by the Board as part of the Common Expenses.
  - (2) All of the decorating within his own Unit (initially and thereafter from time to time), including painting, wall papering, washing, cleaning, paneling, floor covering, draperies, window shades, curtains, lamps and other furnishings and interior decorating. Each Unit Owner shall be entitled to the exclusive use of the interior surfaces of the common walls and the interior surfaces of the vertical perimeter walls, floors and ceiling of his Unit, and such Unit Owner shall maintain such portions in good condition at his sole expense as may be required from

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time to time. Each Unit Owner who shall elect to alter his Unit by installing in any portion of his Unit (other than in bath and powder rooms) hard surface floor covering (i.e., wood, tile, slate, ceramic, parquet, etc.) shall be first required to install a sound absorbent undercushion of such kind and quality as to prevent the transmission of noise to another Unit or as may otherwise be required by the Association. The Board may, in addition to exercising all of the other remedies provided for in this Declaration for breach of any of the provisions hereof, require such Unit Owner to cover all non-conforming work with carpeting, or may require removal of such non-conforming work, at the expense of the offending Unit Owner. The interior surfaces of all windows forming part of a perimeter wall of a Unit shall be cleaned or washed by and at the expense of each respective Unit Owner. The use of and the covering of (hr interior surfaces of such windows, whether by draperies, shades, or other items visible on the exterior of the Building shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the Board as may be imposed from time to time, which snall provide for notice to the management company prior to any such installation and the management company's approval of the method of installation prior to any such installation.

- All of the maintenance, repair, and replacements of the Limited Common Elements benefiting his Unit, in whole or in part, except to the extent as otherwise directed by the Board or as is otherwise provided herein. The foregoing cotwithstanding, at the discretion of the Board, the Board may perform, or cause to be performed, such maintenance, repairs, and replacements of the Limited Common Elements and the cost thereof shall be assessed in whole or in part to Unit Owners benefited thereby, and further, at the discretion of the Board, the Board may direct such Unit Owners, ir. the name and for the account of such Unit Owners, to arrange for such maintenance, repairs, and replacements, to pay the cost thereof with the funds of the Unit Owner, and to procure and deliver to the Board such lie i waivers and contractor's or subcontractor's sworn statements as may be required to protect the Property from all mechanics' or materialmen's lien claims that may arise therefrom. In addition, each Unit Owner shall be individually responsible for the repair, maintenance and replacement of all door and window locks and hardware with respect to which each Unit Owner is entitled to the exclusive use.
- (c) In the event that any repair or replacement to the Common Elements (including the Limited Common Elements) is made necessary by reason of any act or occurrence for which insurance is maintained by the Board pursuant to Article IX hereof and for which insurance proceeds are available as provided thereof, the Association, at its expense to the extent of such proceeds, and shall be responsible for the repair or replacement of such Common

- to impose a contractual liability upon the Association for maintenance, repair and replacement of the Common Elements or the Units or any portion or parts thereof, but the Association's liability shall be limited to damages resulting from negligence. The respective obligations of the Association and Unit Owners set forth in this Declaration shall not be limited, discharged or postponed by reason of the fact that any such maintenance, repair or replacement is required to cure a latent or patent defect in material or workmanship in the construction of the Building, nor because they may become entitled to proceeds under policies of insurance. In addition, and notwithstanding anything hereinabove to the contrary, no Unit Owner shall have a claim against the Board or Association for any work ordinarily the responsibility of the Board or Association, but which the Unit Owner himself has performed or paid for, unless the same shall have been agreed to in advance by the Board or Association.
- 4.04 <u>Negligence of Unit Owner</u>. If, due to the willful misconduct or negligent act or omission of a Unit Owner, or of a member of his family or household pet or of a guest or other authorized occurant or visitor of such Unit Owner, damage shall be caused to the Common Elements or to a Unit owned by others, or maintenance, repairs or replacements shall be required which would otherwise be charged as a Common Expense, then such Unit Owner shall pay for such damage and such maintenance, repairs and replacements as may be determined by the Board.
- 4.05 <u>Joint Facilities</u>. To the extent that equipment, facilities and fixtures within any Unit or Units shall be connected to similar equipment, facilities or fixtures affecting or serving other Units or the Common Elements, then the use thereof by the individual Unit Owner shall be in all respects reasonable as it affects the other Unit Owners.

## 4.06 Additions, Alterations or Improvements.

- (a) The Board may authorize and charge as a Common Expense (or in the case of Limited Common Elements may charge the Unit Owners renefited thereby) the cost of the additions, alterations, or improvements to the Common Elements. The cost of any such work to the Common Elements may be paid out of a special assessment.
- (b) Except as otherwise provided herein, no additions, alterations or improvements shall be made by a Unit Owner to any part of the Common Elements and no additions, alterations or improvements shall be made by a Unit Owner to his Unit where such work alters the wall or partition, configuration, ceiling, perimeter doors or windows, terrace, floor load or otherwise affects the structure of the Unit or increases the cost of insurance required to be carried by the Board hereunder without the prior written consent of the Board. Any addition, alteration or improvement of a Unit by the Unit Owner which shall affect the structure of the Unit or the Common Elements shall, further, conform to structural

or engineering drawings prepared or reviewed and approved by an architectural or engineering firm selected by the Board. The cost of such drawings or review and approval shall be paid by the Unit Owner. The Board may (but shall not be required to) condition its consent to the making of an addition, alteration or improvement by a Unit Owner under this Section 4.06(b) upon the Unit Owner's agreement either (i) to be solely responsible for the maintenance of such addition, alteration or improvement, subject to such standards as the Board may from time to time set, or (ii) to pay to the Association from time to time the additional costs of maintenance or insurance as a result of the addition, alteration or improvement. If an addition, alteration or improvement is made by a Unit Owner without the prior written consent of the Board, then the Board may, in its discretion, take any of the following actions, which actions shall not be exclusive of the lenedies available to the Board under Article XII hereof:

- Require the Unit Owner to remove the addition, alteration or improvement and restore the Property to its original condition, all at the Unit Owner's expense; or
- (2) If the Unit Owner refuses or fails to properly perform the work required under (1), the Board may cause such work to be done and may charge the Unit Owner for the cost thereof as determined by the Board; or
- (3) Ratify the action taken by the Unit Owner, and the Board may (but shall not be required to) condition such ratification upon the same conditions which it may impose upon the giving of its prior consent under this Article.
- otherwise provided herein, management, repair, alteration and improvement of the Common Elements shall be the responsibility of the Board or Association Each Unit Owner shall pay his proportionate share of the expenses of maintenance, repair, replacement, administration and operation of the Common Elements, which expenses are hereinafter referred to collectively as "Common Expenses". Such proportionate share shall be in the same ratio as his percentage of ownership in the Common Elements as set forth in Exhibit B. Payment thereof shall be in such amount and at such times as may be provided by the By-laws and/or rules and regulations of the Association. In the event of the failure of a Unit Owner to pay such proportionate share when due, the amount thereof shall constitute a lien on the interest of such Unit Owner, as provided by the Act.

#### 4.08 Easements.

(a) <u>Encroachments:</u> In the event that by reason of the construction, settlement or shifting of the Building, or the design or construction of any Unit, any part of the Common Elements encroaches or shall hereafter encroach upon

any part of any Unit, or any part of any Unit encroaches or shall hereafter encroach upon any part of the Common Elements or any other Unit, or, if by reason of the design or construction or utility systems any main pipes, ducts or conduits, serving more than one Unit encroach or shall hereafter encroach upon any part of any Unit, valid easements for the maintenance of such encroachment are hereby established and shall exist for the benefit of such Unit and the Common Elements, as the case may be, so long as all or any part of the Building containing such Unit shall remain standing; provided, however, that in no event shall a valid easement for any encroachment be created in favor of the Owner of any Unit or in favor of the Owners of the Common Elements if such encroachment occurred due to the willful conduct of said Owner or Owners.

- Balconies and Patios. All balconies and patios, if any, shall be a (b) part of the Common Elements and not a part of any individual Unit; however, each Unit Owner shall be entitled to the exclusive use and possession of that balcony and patio or those balconies and patios, if any, direct access to which is provided from his respective Unit and which is or are located outside of and adjoining his respective Unit; until such time as the Board or Association, as hereinafter provided, determines to the contrary, each Unit Owner shall be responsible for repair, maintenance and appearance of the patios and-balconies, the exclusive use and possession whereof is extended hereby, at his own expense, including (without limitation) responsibility for breakage, damage, malfunction and ordinary wear and lear. A Unit Owner shall not paint or otherwise decorate or adorn, or change the appearance of any such balcony or patio, in any manner contrary to such rules and regulations as may be established by the said Board or Association. In the event any such balcony or patio shall be appurtenant to more than one Unit, ther all rights and obligations of the Owners of each such Unit with respect to the use, maintenance and repair of such balcony or patio shall be joint, common and indivisible, and shall not be subject to partition through judicial proceedings or otherwise.
- granted for utility purposes, including the right to install, lay, maintain repair and replace water mains and pipes, sewer lines, gas mains, telephone wires and equipment, and electrical conduits, wires and equipment over, under, along and on any part of the Common Elements, as they exist on the date of the recording of the original Declaration thereof. The Board or Association may hereafter grant other or additional easements for utility purposes for the benefit of the Property over, under, along and on any portion of said Common Elements, and each Unit Owner hereby grants the Board or Association an irrevocable power of attorney to execute, acknowledge and record or register, for and in the name of such Unit Owner, such instruments as may be necessary to effectuate the foregoing. Easements are also hereby declared and granted to install, lay, operate, maintain, repair and replace any pipes, wires, ducts, conduits, public utility lines or structural components running through the walls of a Unit, whether or not such walls lie in whole or in part within the Unit boundaries.

- (d) <u>Easements for Common Elements</u>. A valid easement is hereby declared and established for the benefit of all the Units located in the Building, and the Owners thereof (to the exclusion of Owners of Units in other buildings) consisting of the exclusive right to use and occupy the following portions of the Common Elements located within such building: the laundry rooms, elevators, bicycle and all other storage areas, hallways, lobbies, trashrooms, the office and the meeting room; provided, however, that the use and occupancy of such portions of the Common Elements shall comply with all rules and regulations of the Association.
- (d) Easements to Run with Land. All easements and rights described herein are easements appurtenant, running with the land, and shall inure to the benefit of and be binding on the Association, its successors and assigns, and any Owner, purchaser, mortgagee and other person having an interest in said land, or any part or portion thereof. Reference in the respective deeds of conveyance, or in any mortgage or trust deed or other evidence of obligation, to the easements and rights described in this Declaration, shall be sufficient to create and reserve such easement, and rights to the respective grantees, mortgagees and trustees of such parcels as fully and completely as though such easements and rights were created fully and set forth in their entirety in such documents.
- 4.09 Parking Area; Parking. Any garage in the Building and any Parking Area or other portion of the Property allocated to pairing purposes shall be part of the Common Elements and not part of any individual Unit. The Developer of the Property sold and granted to certain Unit Owners the perpetual and exclusive use of at least one designated parking space (but not more than two such exclusive parking spaces for any Unit Owner), which exclusive use is deemed to be appurtenant to and pass with the title to the Unit to which appurtenant (and in no other manner) even though not expressly . mentioned in the document passing title to the Unit. The Developer gave the Board or Association notice thereof and the name of the Unit Owner to whom the Developer granted the exclusive use, which notice is conclusive upon the Board of Association and all Unit Owners as to the rights of the Unit Owner designated in such notice. Subject to the foregoing, the Board or Association may determine to grant exclusive use and possession to designated parking stalls in any portion of the Property allocated to parking purposes to Unit Owners, and the Board or Association may in any event prescribe such rules and regulations with respect to such Parking Areas as the Board may deem fit subject to the provisions of thi Declaration and may, additionally, operate any Parking Areas itself or lease any Parking Areas for operation by others upon such terms as it may deem fit. As a point of clarification, any and all parking or garage spaces that have been allocated to a particular unit shall be deemed to be assigned parking spaces, not a deeded parcel that has been sold to a particular unit owner. All revenue received by the Association from any said Parking Areas, less operation expenses thereof, if any, shall be applied in accordance with the By-laws. Such exclusive use and possession given a Unit Owner or Owners shall be subject to such rules and regulations as the Board may deem fit, including the requirement that such

exclusive use and possession encompass the obligation to clean and maintain that portion of the Common Elements subject thereto as an expense of a Unit Owner rather than a Common Expense. The Board retains the exclusive right and authority to reassign parking spaces in the Association in order to accommodate a request by a homeowner or occupant for a reasonable accommodation pursuant to the Americans With Disabilities Act or Fair Housing Act, or as otherwise required by law. The Parking Areas and Garage shall be used exclusively for the parking of automobiles, specifically passenger vehicles, and shall not be used for storage of any items, however, the storage or parking of trailers, recreational vehicles, boats or other items may be permitted subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Association.

- 4.10 <u>Storage or Locker Areas</u>. Storage or Locker areas in the Building outside of the respective Units shall be part of the Common Elements and the use thereof shall be allocated among the Unit Owners as the Board or Association may by its rules and regulations prescribe.
- 4.11 <u>Separate Mcrigages of Units</u>. Each Unit Owner shall have the right to mortgage or encumber his own respective Unit, together with his respective ownership interest in the Common Elements. No Unit Owner shall have the right or authority to mortgage or otherwise encumber in any manner whatsoever the property or any part thereof, except his own Unit and his own respective ownership interest in the Common Elements as aforesaid.
- 4.12 <u>Separate Real Estate Taxes</u>. Each Unit Owner shall pay his proportionate share thereof in accordance with his respective percentage of ownership interest in the Common Elements.
- 4.13 <u>Utilities</u>. Each Unit Owner shall pay for his own telephone, electricity and other utilities which are separately metered or billed to each use; by the respective utility the Common Expenses.

#### ARTICLE V ADMINISTRATION

5.01 Administration of the Property. The administration of the Property shall be vested in a Board of Managers consisting of the number of persons and who shall be elected in the manner provided in the By-Laws. The duties and powers of the Association and its Board shall be those set forth in its Articles of Incorporation, the By-Laws and this Declaration, provided, however, that (a) the terms and provisions of the Act shall control in the event of any inconsistency between the Act, on the one hand, and this Declaration, the Articles of Incorporation and the By-Laws on the other hand, and (b) the terms and provisions of this Declaration shall control in the event of any inconsistency between this Declaration, on the one hand, and the Articles of Incorporation and the By-Laws on the other hand. The Association shall not be deemed to be conducting a business of any kind, and all funds received by the Association shall

be held and applied by it for the use and benefit of Unit Owners in accordance with the provisions contained herein. Each Unit Owner shall be a member of the Association so long as he shall be a Unit Owner, and such membership shall automatically terminate when he ceases to be a Unit Owner, and upon the transfer of his ownership interest the transferee thereof shall likewise succeed to such membership in the Association. The Association shall have one class of membership.

- 5.02 <u>General Powers of the Board</u>. The Board shall have the following general powers:
  - (a) The Board may engage the services of an agent to manage the Property for which the Board is responsible pursuant to this Declaration, to the extent deemed advisable by the Board. The Board shall insure that the management agent is protected by a fidelity bond in such amounts and with such provisions as contained in Article IX hereof.
  - (b) The Board or its agents, upon reasonable notice, may enter any Unit when necessary in connection with any maintenance, repair or replacement or construction for which the Board is responsible or to make emergency repairs as may be necessary to prevent damage to the Common Elements or to any other Unit or Units.
  - (c) The Board shall have no authority to acquire and pay for from the maintenance fund any improvements or upgrades to the property in excess of \$250,000 without in each case the prior approval of the Voting Members representing at least two-thirds (2/3) of the Unit Owners at a special meeting of the Owners called for that purpose.
  - (d) All agreements, contracts, deeds, leases, vouchers for payment of expenditures and other instruments shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the Board and in such manner as from time to time shall be determined by written resolution of the Board. In the absence of such determination by the Board, such documents shall be signed by the President of the Board and countersigned by the Treasurer or Secretary.
  - (e) The Board shall have the power and duty to provide for the designation, hiring, and removal of employees and other personnel, including lawyers and accountants, engineers, or architects to engage or contract for the services of others, and to make purchases for the maintenance, repair, replacement, administration, management, and operation of the Property, and to delegate any such powers to the manager or managing agent (and any such employees or other personnel as may be employees of the managing agent).
  - (f) The Board shall have the power to exercise all other powers and duties of the Board of Directors or Unit Owners as a group referred to in this Declaration or the Act. More specifically, the Board shall exercise for the

Association all powers, duties and authority vested in it by law or the Declaration except for such powers, duties and authority reserved thereby to the members of the Association. The powers and duties of the Board shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following matters:

- (1) Operation, care, upkeep, maintenance, replacement and improvement of the Common Elements in a neat and orderly manner;
- (2) Preparation, adoption and distribution of the annual budget for the Property;
- (3) Levying of assessments and collection thereof from Unit
  - (4) Borrowing funds;
- (5) Employment and dismissal of the personnel necessary or advisable for (ne maintenance and operation of the Common Elements;
  - (6) Obtaining adequate and appropriate kinds of insurance;
- (7) Purchasing and receiving conveyances of Unit Ownerships and owning, conveying, mortgaging, encumbering, leasing and otherwise dealing with Unit Ownerships conveyed to or purchased by it;
- The Board may, from time to time, adopt or amend such rules and regulations governing the operation, maintenance, beautification and use of the Common Elements and the Units not inconsistent with the terms of this Declaration, after a meeting of the Coit Owners called for the specific purpose of discussing the proposed rules and regulations, notice of which contains the full text of the proposed rules and regulations and conforms to the procedural requirements for the calling of a regular or special meeting of the Association. No quorum is required at this meeting of Unit Owners. However, no rules or regulations may impair ary lights guaranteed under the First Amendment to the Constitution of the United States or Section 4 of Article I of the Illinois Constitution. Subsequent to Board action adopting or amending the rules and regulations, the Board shall given written notice of such rules and regulations to all Owners and occupants, and the entire property shall at all times be maintained subject to such rules and regulations. Any violation of such rules or regulations shall be deemed a violation of the terms of this Declaration.
- (9) Subject to the provisions of Article IV hereof, the Board may number and assign to any Unit Owner the exclusive privilege to use for storage purposes any portion of the building designated for such purposes. All property stored in any storage or locker area shall be at the

sole risk of the respective Unit Owner who has the privilege to use the same and neither the Board nor any other Unit Owner shall be considered a bailee or otherwise be responsible therefore.

- (10) Keeping of detailed, accurate records of the receipts and expenditures affecting the use and operation of the Property;
- (11) To have access to each Unit from time to time as may be necessary for the maintenance, repair or replacement of any Common Elements (to the extent the Association is responsible for such maintenance, repair or replacement) therein or accessible therefrom, or for making repairs therein necessary to prevent damage to the Common Elements or to other Unit or Units;
- special taxes or charges of the State of Illinois or of any political subdivision thereof, or other lawful taxing or assessing body, which are authorized by law to be assessed and levied upon the real property of the condominium and are not payable by Unit Owners directly, with such payments being made either directly to the appropriate governing body;
- (13) Impose charges for late payments of a Unit Owner's proportionate share of the Common Expenses, or any other expenses lawfully agreed upon, and after ratice and an opportunity to be heard, levy reasonable fines for violation or this Declaration and rules and regulations of the Association;
- (14) By a majority vote of the entire Board, assign the Association's right to future income from Common Expenses or other sources, and mortgage or pledge substantially all of the remaining assets of the Association;
- (15) Record the dedication of a portion of the Common Elements to a public body for use as or in connection with a street or utility where authorized by the Unit Owners under the provisions of Section 4.9 hereof;
- (16) Record the granting of an easement pursuant to the provisions of Article IV hereof and any instruments required under Section 5.6 hereof or elsewhere in this Declaration;
- (17) Except to the extent limited by this Declaration and the Act, the Board shall have the power and duty to exercise the rights of, and perform all of the covenants and obligations imposed upon, the Association or the Unit Owners, and to execute any and all instruments required pursuant thereto;

- (18) To reasonably accommodate the needs of a handicapped Unit Owner as required by the federal Civil Rights Act of 1968, the Illinois Human Rights Act and any applicable local ordinances in the exercise of its powers with respect to the use of the Common Elements or approval of modifications in an individual Unit
- (g) The Board shall acquire and make arrangements for and pay for out of the maintenance fund, in addition to the manager, managing agent or other personnel above provided for, the following:
  - (1) Water, waste removal, heating, electricity and telephone and other necessary utility service for the Common Elements and such services to the Units as are not separately metered or charged to the Owr.ers thereof.
  - (2) Such insurance as the Board is required or permitted to obtain as hereinafter provided.
  - (3) Landscaring, gardening, snow removal, painting, cleaning, tuckpointing, maintenance, decorating, repair and replacement of the Common Elements (but not including the interior surfaces, windows and doors of the Unit, which the respective Unit Owner shall paint, clean, decorate, maintain and repair further to the provisions herein) and such furnishings and equipment for the Common Elements as the Board shall determine are necessary and proper, and the Board shall have the exclusive right and duty to acquire the same for the Common Elements.
  - (4) Any other materials, supplies, furr.iture, labor, services, maintenance, repairs, structural alterations, or assessments which the Board deems necessary or proper for the maintenance and operation of the property as a first class Residential project or for the enfo cement of any restrictions or provisions contained herein.
  - other encumbrance levied against the property or any part thereof which may in the opinion of the Board constitute a lien against the property or against the Common Elements, rather than merely against the interest therein of particular Unit Owners. Where one or more Unit Owners are responsible for the existence of such lien, they shall be jointly and severally liable for the cost of discharging it and any costs incurred by the Board by reason of said lien or liens shall be specially assessed to said Unit Owners and shall, until paid by such Unit Owners, constitute a lien on the interest of such Unit Owners in the property, which lien may be perfected and foreclosed in the manner provided in Section 9 of the

Condominium Property Act with respect to liens for failure to pay a share of the common expenses.

- the property which one or more Unit Owners are obligated to maintain or repair under the terms hereof, if such maintenance or repair is necessary, in the discretion of the Board, to protect the Common Elements, or any other portion of the property, and the Owner or Owners of said Unit or Units have failed or refused to perform said maintenance or repair within a reasonable time after written notice of the necessity of said maintenance or repair delivered by the Board to said Unit Owner or Owners, provided that the Board shall levy a special assessment against such Unit or Units for the cost of said maintenance or repair and the amount of such special assessment shall constitute a lien on the interest of such Unit Owner or Owners in the property, which lien may be perfected and foreclosed in the manner provided in Section 9 of the Condominium Property Act with respect to liens for failure to pay a share of the common expenses.
- (h) The Board by a vote of at least two-thirds (2/3rds) of its members, shall have the authority to lease or to grant licenses, concessions, easements, leases and contracts with respect to any part of the Common Elements, all upon such terms as the Board deems appropriate.
- (i) The Board shall have the power to bid for and purchase any Unit Ownership at a sale pursuant to a mortgage foreclosure, or a foreclosure of the lien for Common Expenses under the Act, or at a sale pursuant to an order of direction of a court, or other involuntary sale, upon the consent or approval of Voting Members representing not less than two-thirds (2/3rds) of the total votes.
- (j) The Association shall have no authority to forebear the payment of assessments by any Unit Owner.
- 5.03 Collection of Assessments. All funds collected by the Association shall be held and expended for the purposes designated herein and in the Articles of Incorporation and the By-Laws. All such funds (except for such special assessments as may be levied against less than all the Unit Owners and for such adjustments as may be required to reflect delinquent or prepaid assessments) shall be deemed to be held for the benefit, use and account of each of the Unit Owners in the same percentage as his Ownership, from time to time, in the Common Elements.
- **5.04** Determination of Board to be Binding. In the event of any dispute or disagreement between any Unit Owners relating to the property, or any question of interpretation or application of the provisions of the Declaration, the determination thereof by the Board shall be final and binding on each and all of such Unit Owners.

# 5.05 Books and Records of the Association - Availability For Examination.

- (a) In addition to the provisions contained herein, the managing company or the Board shall maintain the following records of the Association available for examination and copying at convenient hours of weekdays by the Unit Owners or their First Mortgagees and their duly authorized agents or attorneys:
  - (1) the Association's Declaration, By-Laws, plats of survey, and all amendments of these;
    - (2) the rules and regulations, if any;
  - (3) if the Association is incorporated as a corporation, the articles of incorporation of the Association and all amendments to the articles of incorporation;
  - (4) minutes of all meetings of the Association and its Board of Managers for the immediately preceding seven (7) years;
    - (5) all current priicies of insurance of the Association;
  - (6) all contracts, leases, and other agreements then in effect to which the Association is a party or under which the Association or the Unit Owners have obligations or liabilities,
  - (7) a current listing of the names, addresses, and weighted vote of all Owners entitled to vote:
  - (8) ballots and proxies related to ballots for all matters voted on by the Unit Owners of the Association during the immediately preceding twelve (12) months, including but not limited to the election of members of the Board of Managers; and
  - (9) the books and records of account for the Association's current and ten (10) immediately preceding fiscal years, including but not limited to itemized and detailed records of all receipts and expenditures.
- (b) Any Unit Owner shall have the right to inspect, examine, and make copies of the records described in subparagraphs (1), (2), (3), (4), and (5) of subsection (a) of this Section, in person or by agent, at any reasonable time or times, at the Association's principal office. In order to exercise this right, the Unit Owner must submit a written request to the Board, or its authorized agent, stating with particularity the records sought to be examined. Failure of the Board to Unit Owner's written request shall be deemed a denial.

Any Unit Owner who prevails in an enforcement action to compel examination of records described in subparagraphs (1), (2), (3), (4), and (5) of subsection (a) of this Section shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorney's fees and costs from the Association.

- Except as otherwise provided in subsection (e) of this Section, any Unit Owner of the Association shall have the right to inspect, examine, and make copies of the records described in subparagraphs (6), (7), (8), and (9) of subsection (a) of this Section, in person or by agent, at any reasonable time or times but only for a proper purpose, at the Association's principal office. In order to exercise this right, the Unit Owner must submit a written request to the Board or its authorized agent, stating with particularity the records sought to be examine 1 and a proper purpose for the request. Subject to the provisions of subsection (c) of this Section, failure of the Board to make available all records so requested vithin thirty (30) business days of receipt of the Unit Owner's written request shall be deemed a denial; provided, however, that if the Association has adopted a secret ballot election process as provided in Section 18 of the Act shall not be deemed to have denied a Unit Owner's request for records described in subparagraph (8) of subsection (a) of this Section if voting ballots, without identifying unit rumbers, are made available to the requesting Unit Owner within thirty (30) days of receipt of the Unit Owner's written request. In an action to compel examination of records described in subparagraphs (6), (7), (8), and (9) of subsection (a) of this Section, the burden of proof is upon the Unit Owner to establish that the Unit Owner's request is based on a proper purpose. Any Unit Owner who prevails in an enforcement action to compel examination of records described in subparagraphs (c), (7), (8), and (9) of subsection (a) of this Section shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorney's fees and costs from the Association only if the court finds that the Board acted in bad faith in denying the Unit Owner's request.
- (d) The actual cost to the Association of retrieving and making requested records available for inspection and examination under this Section shall be charged by the Association to the requesting Unit Owner. If a Unit Owner requests copies of records requested under this Section, the actual costs to the Association of reproducing the records shall also be charged by the Association to the requesting Unit Owner.
- (e) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (c) of this Section, unless otherwise directed by court order, the Association need not make the following records available for inspection, examination, or copying by its Unit Owners:
  - (1) documents relating to appointment, employment, discipline, or dismissal of Association employees;

- (2) documents relating to actions pending against or on behalf of the Association or its Board of Managers in a court or administrative tribunal;
- (3) documents relating to actions threatened against, or likely to be asserted on behalf of, the Association or its Board of Managers in a court or administrative tribunal:
- (4) documents relating to common expenses or other charges owed by a Unit Owner other than the requesting Unit Owner; and
- (5) documents provided to the Association in connection with the lease, sale, or other transfer of a unit by a Unit Owner other than the requesting Unit Owner.
- 5.06 Real Estate Taxes. Real estate taxes, special assessments, and any other special taxes or charges of the State of Illinois or any duly authorized subdivision or agency thereof, are to be separately taxed to each Owner for his Unit Ownership, as provided in the Act. Upon the affirmative vote of Voting Members representing a majority of the votes in the Association or the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the Board, the Board, on he half of all the Owners, shall have the authority to seek relief for the Owners from any such taxes, special assessments or charges, and any expenses incurred in connection therewith shall be Common Expenses.
- or, in the case of an emergency, may without notice, enter any Unit, including any of the appurtenant Limited Common Elements in connection with any maintenance, repair and replacement for which the Board is responsible. Such entry shall be made with as little inconvenience to the Owners as practicable, and any damage caused thereby shall be repaired by the Board, as a Common Expense. In the event the association is forced to break into a Unit to perform emergency repairs, maintenance or other action, and the Owner has not provided the Association with (a) a key to the Unit or (b) the name of a costs shall be the responsibility of the Unit Owner.
- 5.08 Sale of Association Owned Unit. In the event the Board is desirous of selling an Association owned Unit, the Board shall obtain the approval of 2/3rds of the members present in person or by proxy at a special meeting called for that purpose. Thereafter, the Board may sell said Unit and the percentages of ownership shall be recalculated to assimilate the added Unit, which is currently classified as part of the Common Elements.

#### ARTICLE VI ASSESSMENTS - MAINTENANCE FUND

### 6.01 Preparation of Estimated Budget

- Each year on or before December 1, the Board will estimate the total amount necessary to pay the cost of wages, materials, insurance, services and supplies which will be required during the ensuing calendar year for the rendering of all services, together with a reasonable amount considered by the Board to be necessary for a reserve for contingencies and replacements, and shall, on or before December 15, notify each Owner in writing as to the amount of such estimate, with reasonable itemization thereof. Said "estimated cash requirement" shall be assessed to the Owners according to each Owner's percentage of ownership in the Common Elements as set forth in Exhibit B attached hereto. On or before January 1 of the ensuing year, and the first of each and every rionth of said year, each Owner shall be obligated to pay to the Board, or as it may direct, one-twelfth (1/12th) of the assessment made pursuant to this Section. On or before the date of the Annual Meeting of each calendar year, the Board shall sur ply to all owners an itemized accounting of the maintenance expenses for he preceding calendar year actually incurred and paid, together with a tabulation of the amounts collected pursuant to the estimates provided, and showing the net amount over or short of the actual expenditures, plus reserves. Any amount accumulated in excess of the amount required for actual expenses and reserves shall be credited according to each Owner's percentage of ownership in the Common Elements to the next monthly installments due from Owners under the current vear's estimate, until exhausted, and any net shortage shall be added according to each Owner's percentage of ownership in the Common Elements to the installments due in the succeeding six (6) months after rendering of the accounting.
- (b) If an adopted budget requires assessment against the Unit Owners in any fiscal or calendar year exceeding one hundred fifteen percent (115%) of the assessments for the preceding year, the Board of Managers, upor, written petition of Unit Owners with twenty percent (20%) of the votes of the Association Gwners within fourteen (14) days of the Board action, shall call a meeting of the Unit Owners within thirty (30) days of the date of filing of the petition to consider the budget. Unless a majority of the votes of the Unit Owners are cast at the meeting to reject the budget, it shall be deemed ratified whether or not a quorum is present. In determining whether assessments exceeds one hundred fifteen percent (115%) of similar assessments in prior years, for purposes of this subparagraph, any authorized provisions for reasonable reserves for repair or replacement of the condominium property, and any anticipated expenses by the Association which are not anticipated to be incurred on a regular or annual basis, shall be excluded from the computation.

- up and maintain a reasonable reserve for contingencies and replacements. Extraordinary expenditures not originally included in the annual estimate which may become necessary during the year, shall be charged first against such reserve. If said "estimated cash requirement" proves inadequate for any reason, including non-payment of any Owner's assessment, the Board may, at any time, levy a further assessment, which shall be assessed to the Owners according to each Owner's percentage ownership in the Common Elements. The Board shall serve notice of such further assessment on all Owners by a statement in writing giving the amount, and reasons therefor, and such further assessment shall become effective with the monthly maintenance payment which is due more than ten (10) days after the delivery or mailing of such notice of further assessment. All Owners shall be obligated to pay the adjusted monthly amount.
- prepare or serve the annual or adjusted estimate on the Owner shall not constitute a waiver or release in any manner of such Owner's obligation to pay the maintenance costs and necessary reserves, as herein provided, whenever the same shall be determined, and, in the absence of any annual estimate or adjusted estimate, the Owner shall continue to pay the morthly maintenance charge at the then existing monthly rate established for the previous period until the monthly maintenance payment which is due more than ten (10) days after such new annual or adjusted estimate shall have been mailed or delivered.
- 6.04 Status of Collected Funds. All funds collected hereunder shall be held and expended for the purposes designated herein, and (except for such special assessments as may be levied hereunder against less than all the Unit Owners and for such adjustments as may be required to reflect delinquent or prepaid assessments) shall be deemed to be held for the benefit, use and account of all the Unit Owners in the percentages set forth in Exhibit B.
- the monthly payment of the aforesaid charges or assessments for thirty (36) days, the Board may bring suit for and on behalf of itself and as representative of all owners, to enforce collection thereof or to foreclose the lien therefor as hereinafter provided; and there shall be added to the amount due the costs of said suit, together with legal interest and reasonable attorneys' fees to be fixed by the court. To the extent permitted by any decision or any statute or law now or hereafter effective, the amount of any delinquent and unpaid charges or assessments, and interest, costs and fees as above provided, shall be and become a lien or charge against the Unit Ownership of the Owner involved when payable and may be foreclosed by an action brought in the name of the Board as in the case of foreclosure of liens against real estate. Unless otherwise provided in this Declaration, the members of the Board and their successors in office, acting on behalf of the other Unit Owners, shall have the power to bid in the interest so foreclosed at foreclosure sale, and to acquire and hold, lease, mortgage and convey the same. Said lien shall take effect and be in force when and

as provided in the Act; provided, however, that encumbrances owned or held by any bank, insurance company or savings and loan association shall be subject as to priority after written notice to said encumbrancer of unpaid Common Expenses only to the lien of all Common Expenses on the encumbered Unit which become due and payable subsequent to the date said encumbrancer either takes possession of the Unit, accepts a conveyance of any interest therein, or has a receiver appointed in a suit to foreclose his lien. Any encumbrancer may, from time to time, request in writing a written statement from the Board setting forth the unpaid Common Expenses with respect to the Unit covered by his encumbrance, and, unless the request shall be complied with within twenty (20) days, all unpaid Common Expenses which become due prior to the date of the making of such request shall be subordinate to the lien of such encumbrance. Any encumbrancer holding a lien on a Unit may pay any unpaid common expenses payable with respect to such Unit and upon such payment such encumbrancer small have a lien on such Unit for the amounts paid at the same rank as the lien of his encumbrance

- 6.06 Amendments. Except for such amendments as may be required to conform any provision of this Declaration to the requirements of law, all amendments to this Article VI shall only be effective upon unanimous written consent of the Owners, and their mortgagees. No Owner may waive or otherwise escape liability for the assessments provided for herein by non-use of the Common Elements or abandonment of his or their Unit.
- 6.07 Statement of Account. Upon ler (10) days notice to the Board and payment of a reasonable fee, any Unit Owner shall be furnished a statement of his account setting forth the amount of any unpaid assessments or other charges due and owing from such Unit Owner.
- 6.08 Payment of Assessments. All monthly assessments and any special assessments or other lawful charges of the Association are due and payable on the first (1st) day of each month. Any payment of the foregoing which is received after the fifteenth (15th) day of the month shall be considered late. The Board may establish service charges, fines or other charges for late payments or non-payment or the foregoing obligations of a Unit Owner, including interest on any unpaid balance. Any such service charge, fine or other charge shall be added to and be deemed a part of the Unit Owner's share of the common expense. The Board shall have the authority to credit back any late charges which may have been added to a Unit Owner's account under appropriate circumstances. In addition to any remedies or liens provided by law, if a Unit Owner is in default in the monthly payment of the aforesaid charges or assessments for thirty (30) days, the Board may bring suit for and on behalf of itself and as representative of all Unit Owners, to enforce collection, for possession or to foreclose the lien and there shall be added to the amount due the costs of said suit, together with legal interest and reasonable attorneys' fees. In addition, the Board may also take possession of such defaulting Unit Owner's interest in the property and maintain an action for possession of the Unit in the manner provided by law. No Owner may waive

or otherwise escape liability for the assessments provided for herein by non-use of the Common Elements or abandonment of his or her Unif

6.09 Lien for Unpaid Assessments. Any first mortgage or first trust deed made, owned or held by a bank, savings and loan association, insurance company or real estate investment trust and recorded prior to the recording or mailing of a notice by the Board of the amount owing by a Unit Owner who has refused or failed to pay his share of the monthly assessment or any special assessment when due shall be superior to the lien of such unpaid common expenses set forth in said notice and to all assessments for common expenses which become due and are unpaid subsequent to the date of recording of such first mortgage or first trust deed, provided, however, that after written notice to the holder of any such mortgage or trust deed, such mortgage or payable subsequent to the date when such holder takes possession of the Unit, accepts a conveyance of such Unit, or has a receiver appointed in a suit to foreclose the lien of such mortgage or trust deed.

# ARTICLE VII COVENANTS AND RESTRICTIONS AS TO USE AND OCCUPANCY

## 7.01 Use and Occupancy.

- (a) Residential Purposes. No part of the Property shall be used for other than housing and related common curposes for which the Property was designed. Each Unit or any two or more adjoining Units used together shall be used as a residence for a single family or such other uses permitted by this Declaration and for no other purpose. That part of the Common Elements separating any two or more adjoining Units used together as aforesaid may be altered to afford ingress and egress to and from such adjoining Units in such manner and upon such conditions as shall be determined by the Board in writing.
- (b) Obstruction of Common Elements. There shall be no obstruction of the Common Elements, nor shall anything be stored in the Common Elements without the prior consent of the Board, except as hereinafter expressly provided. Each Owner shall be obligated to maintain and keep in good order and repair his own Unit.
- (c) <u>Hazardous Uses and Waste</u>. Nothing shall be done or kept in any Unit or in the Common Elements which will increase the rate of insurance on the Building, or contents thereof, applicable for residential use, without the prior written consent of the Board. No Owner shall permit anything to be done or kept in his Unit or in the Common Elements which will result in the cancellation of insurance on the Building, or contents thereof, or which would be in violation of any law. No waste shall be committed in the Common Elements.

- (d) Exterior Exposure of Building. Owners shall not cause or permit anything to be hung or displayed on the outside of windows or placed on the outside walls of the Building, and no sign, awning, canopy, shutter, radio or television antenna shall be affixed to or placed upon the exterior walls or roof or any part thereof, without the prior consent of the Board.
- (e) Pets. No animals, rabbits, livestock, fowl or poultry of any kind shall be raised, bred, or kept in any Unit or in the Common Elements. In accordance with an Amendment recorded against the Original Declaration on November 14, 1990, only a Unit Occupant on or before that date was permitted to keep an existing pet in their Unit, until one of the following occurred:
  - (1) the death or removal of the pet,
  - (2) sale of the unit, or
  - (3) termination of a lease after November 14, 1990.

No subsequent Occupants or Owners are permitted to keep pets in their Units. No pet may be replaced upon its death or removal.

No visiting pets are permitted and no Unit Occupant is permitted to perform pet sitting services.

Any pet kept in violation of the limitations of this paragraph or in violation of the rules and regulations adopted by the Board or causing a nuisance or unreasonable disturbance shall be permanently removed from the property upon three (3) days' written notice from the Board. The Board of Directors shall have the authority to levy fines against the Unit Owner for violations of this section or any of the provisions of this Declaration, By-Laws or rules and regulations of the Board and late fees for the non-payment of any fine.

Prior to the levy of a fine, the Unit Owner will be notified of the pendency of the fine and shall have an opportunity to be heard at the next scheduled Board meeting. All findings of the Board relative to fines shall be sent in writing to the appropriate parties. Failure to remove a pet in accordance with the foregoing may result in a fine of up to \$25.00 per day until the offending pet is removed.

- (f) <u>Nuisances</u>. No noxious or offensive activity shall be carried on in any Unit or in the Common Elements, nor shall anything be done therein, either willfully or negligently, which may be or become an annoyance or nuisance to the other Owners or Occupants.
- (g) Impairment of Structural Integrity of Building. Nothing shall be done in any Unit or in, on or to the Common Elements which will impair the structural integrity of the Building or which would structurally change the Building except as is otherwise provided herein. No Unit Owner shall overload the electric wiring in the Building, or operate any machines, appliances, accessories or equipment in

such manner as to cause, in the judgment of the Board, an unreasonable disturbance to others.

- (h) <u>Laundry or Rubbish</u>. No clothes, sheets, blankets, laundry, of any kind or other articles shall be hung out or exposed on any part of the Common Elements. The Common Elements shall be kept free and clear of rubbish, debris and other unsightly materials.
- (i) Lounging or Storage in Common Elements. There shall be no playing, lounging, parking of baby carriages or playpens, bicycles, wagons, toys, vehicles, benches or chairs on any part of the Common Elements, except that bicycles may be stored in a common area designated for the purpose, and balcony and patio areas may be used for their intended purposes.
- (j) Prohibited Activities and Signs. No industry, business, trade, occupation or profession of any kind, commercial, religious, educational, or otherwise, designed for profit, altruism, exploration, or otherwise, shall be conducted, maintained, or permitted on any part of the Property, nor, except with the consent of the Board, shall any "For Sale" or "For Rent" signs or other window displays or advertising be maintained or permitted by any Owner on any part of the Property or in any Unit therein.
- (k) <u>Alterations of Common Elements</u>. Nothing shall be altered or constructed in or removed from the Common Elements, except upon the written consent of the Board.
- (I) Flooring. One-half inch (1/2") sound ansorbent underlayment must be installed under any hard surface flooring (i.e., woor parquet, tile) on floors two, three and four. All such underlayment must be approved, in writing, by the Board of Directors prior to installation of surface flooring. Any hard surface flooring installed prior to the effective date of this Amended and Restated Declaration is hereby grandfathered.
- (m) Parking Area. That part of the Common Elements identified in Exhibit A or the Plat(s) as Parking Area shall be used by the Owners for parking purposes of automobiles and passenger vehicles only, subject to the exclusive rights of the respective Unit Owners. As may be further provided in the rules and regulations, Owners may park or store any recreational vehicles, trailers, boats or other items, other than automobiles and passenger vehicles, in the Parking Area or Garage subject to the Rules and Regulations duly adopted by the Board.
- (n) <u>Certain Personal Professional Activities Permitted</u>. The Unit restrictions in sections (a) and (j) of this Article VII shall not, however, be construed in such a manner as to prohibit an Owner or Occupant from (1) maintaining a personal professional library, (2) keeping his personal business

records or accounts therein, (3) handling his personal business or professional calls or correspondence therefrom, or (4) maintaining what is customarily considered a house occupation. The intent of this restriction is to limit traffic, noise, refuse, advertising and other incidentals of operating a business which disturbs the quiet enjoyment of the Owners and Occupants and detracts from the appearance of the Building or lowers property values. In all instances, the decision of the Board as to whether a business is prohibited, shall be final.

# ARTICLE VIII SALE OR OTHER ALIENATION

- 8.01 Sale. Any Owner who wishes to sell his Unit Ownership to any person not related by blcoc or marriage to the Owner (including the beneficiary of any Unit held in Trust) shall give to the Board of Managers no less than thirty (30) days' prior written notice of the terms of any contemplated sale, together with the name and address of the proposed purchaser, and its or their financial and character references. The Board, acting on behalf of the other Unit Owners as hereinafter provided, shall at all times have the first right and option to purchase such Unit Ownership upon the same terms as the proposed sale, which option shall be exercisable for a period of forty-five (45) days following the date or receipt of such notice; provided, however, that if the proposed purchase shall be for a consideration, which the Board, in its reasonable opinion, deems inconsistent with the bona fide fair market value of such Unit Ownership, the Board may elect to exercise such option in the manner, within the period, and on the terms set forth in Section 8.02 below. If said option is not exercised by the Board within the aforesaid option period, or if said option is properly waived, the Owner may, at the expiration of said period (and at any time within sixty (60) days after the expiration of said period) contract to sell such Unit Ownership to the proposed purchaser named in such notice upon the terms specified therein, and, if he fails to close said proposed sale transaction within said sixty (60) days, his Unit Ownership shall again become subject to the Board's right of first option as herein provided.
- 8.02 Gift. Any Unit Owner who wishes to make a gift of his Unit Ownership or any interest therein to any person or persons who would not be heirs at law of the Owner under the Rules of Descent of the State of Illinois were he or she to die within ninety (90) days prior to the contemplated date of such gift, shall give to the Board not less than ninety (90) days' written notice of his or her intent to make such gift prior to the contemplated date thereof, together with the name and address of the intended donee and the contemplated date of said gift. The Board, acting on behalf of the Unit Owners as hereinafter provided, shall at all times have the first right and option to purchase such Unit Ownership or interest therein for cash at fair market value to be determined by arbitration as herein provided, which option shall be exercisable until the date of expiration as provided herein. Within fifteen (15) days after receipt of said written notice by the Board, the Board and the Owner desiring to make such gift shall each appoint a qualified real estate appraiser to act as arbitrators. The two arbitrators so appointed shall within ten (10) days after their appointment, appoint another qualified real estate appraiser to act as the third arbitrator. Within fifteen (15) days after the appointment of

said arbitrator, the three (3) arbitrators shall determine, by majority vote, the fair market value of the Unit Ownership or interest therein which the Owner contemplates conveying by gift, and shall thereupon give written notice of such determination to the Owner and the Board. The Board's option to purchase the Unit Ownership or interest therein shall expire forty-five (45) days after the date of receipt by it of such notice.

<u>Devise</u>. In the event any Owner dies leaving a will devising his or her Unit Ownership, or any interest therein, to any person or persons not heirs-at-law of the deceased Unit Owner under the Rules of Descent of the State of Illinois, and said will is admitted to probate, the members of the Board and their successors in office, acting on behalf of-the Unit Owners as hereinafter provided, shall have a like option (to be exercised in the manner hereinafter set forth) to purchase said Unit Ownership or interest therein either from the devisee or devisees thereof named in said will, or, if a power of sale is conferred by said will upon the personal representative named therein, from the personal representative acting pursuant to said power, for cash at fair market value which is to be determined by arbitration. Within sixty (60) days after the appointment of a personal representative for the estate of the deceased Owner, the Board shall appoint a qualified real estate appraiser to act as an arbitrator, and shall thereupon give written notice of such appointment to the said devisee or devisees or personal representative, as the case may be. Within fifteen (15) days thereafter, said devisee or devisees, or personal representative, as the case may be, shall appoint a qualified real estate appraiser to act as an arbitrator. Within ten (10) days after the appointment of said arbitrator, the two so appointed shall appoint another qualified real estate appraiser to act as the third arbitrator. Within fifteen (15) days thereafter, the three arbitrators shall determine, by majority vote, in a fair market value of the Unit Ownership or interest therein devised by the deceased Owner, and shall thereupon give written notice of such determination to the Board, and said devisee or devisees, or personal representative, as the case may be. The Board's right to elect to purchase the Unit Ownership or interest therein at the price determined by the three arbitrators shall expire sixty (60) days after the date of receipt by it of such notice if the personal representative of the deceased Owner is empowered to sell, and sha'l expire eight (8) months after the appointment of a personal representative who is not so er mowered to sell. The Board shall be deemed to have exercised its option if it tenders the required sum of money (directly or in escrow, pending title clearance) to said devisee or devisees or to said personal representative, as the case may be, within the said option periods. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to restrict the right of the Board or its authorized representative, pursuant to authority given to the Board by the Owners as hereinafter provided, to bid at any sale of the Unit Ownership or interest therein of any deceased Owner which said sale is held pursuant to an order or direction of the court having jurisdiction over that portion of the deceased Owner's estate which contains his or her Unit Ownership or interest therein.

#### 8.04 Involuntary Sale.

(a) In the event any Unit ownership or interest therein is sold at a judicial or execution sale (other than a mortgage foreclosure sale), the person

acquiring title through such sale shall, before taking possession of the Unit so sold, give thirty (30) days' written notice to the Board of his intention so to do, whereupon the members of the Board of Managers and their successors in office, acting on behalf of consenting Unit Owners as hereinafter provided, shall have an irrevocable option to purchase such Unit Ownership or interest therein at the same price for which it was sold at said sale. If said option is not exercised by the Board within said thirty (30) days after receipt of such notice, it shall thereupon expire and said purchaser may thereafter take possession of said Unit. The Board shall be deemed to have exercised its option if it tenders the required sum of money (directly or in escrow pending title clearance) to the purchaser within said thirty (30) day period.

- required to be paid under the provisions of any mortgage or trust deed against his Unit Ownership, the Board shall have the right to cure such default by paying the amount so owing to the party entitled thereto, and shall thereupon have a lien therefor against such Unit Ownership, which Lien shall have the same force and effect and may be entorced in the same manner as provided in Article VI.
- Any right to purchase or lease which the Board may have or obtain under the provisions of this Article may be transferred, with the consent of the Unit Owners, as hereinafter provided, to one or more of the Unit Owners so as to enable the said Unit Owner or Owners to acquire the subject Unit or interest as a personal investment, provided that the Board is reasonably assured that such Unit Owner or Owners have the financial capacity to undertake such purchase or lease and will puffill the requirements of said purchase or lease within all stipulated time periods.
- R.06 Consent of Voting Members. The Board shall not exercise any option hereinabove set forth to purchase any Unit Ownership or interest inerein, or transfer its rights to any single Unit Owner or group of Unit Owners, without the prior written consent of the Voting Members holding at least seventy-five percent (7(1%)) of the voting rights in the Association, and whose Unit Ownerships are not the subject matter of such option. The Board may bid to purchase at any sale of a Unit Ownership or interest therein, which said sale is held pursuant to an order or direction of a court upon the prior written consent of the aforesaid Voting Members, which said consent shall set forth a or interest therein. If the requisite consent is obtained any of the aforesaid options shall be exercised by the Board of Managers solely for the use and benefit of all Owners, including the minority of Owners not consenting thereto.
- 8.07 Release, Waiver and Exceptions to Option. Upon the written consent of two (2) of the Board members, any of the options contained in this Article VIII may be released or waived, and the Unit Ownership or interest therein which is subject to an option set forth in this Article may be sold, conveyed, given or devised free and clear of the provisions of this Article.

8.08 Proof of Termination of Option. A certificate executed and acknowledged by the acting President or Secretary of the Board, stating that the provisions of this Article VIII as hereinabove set forth have been met by an Owner, or duly waived by the Board, and that the rights of the Board hereunder have terminated, shall be conclusive upon the Board and the Owners in favor of all persons who rely thereon in good faith, and such certificate shall be furnished to any Owner who has, in fact, complied with the provisions of this Article or in respect to whom the provisions of this Article have been waived, upon request at a reasonable fee, not to exceed Ten Dollars (\$10.00).

## 8.08 Financing of Purchase under Option.

- Acquisition of Unit Ownerships or any interests therein under the provisions of this Article shall be made from the maintenance fund. If said fund is insufficient, the Foard shall levy any assessment against each Owner in the ratio that his percentage of ownership in the Common Elements as set forth in Exhibit B bears to the total of all such percentages applicable to Units subject to said assessment (thus, excluding the percentage of any Unit Ownership being the subject of the purchase), which assessment shall become a lien and be enforceable in the same manner as provided in Article VI.
- (b) The Board, in its discretion may borrow money to finance the acquisition of any Unit Ownership or interest therein authorized by this Article; provided, however, that no financing may be secured by an encumbrance or hypothecation of any portion of the Property other than the Unit Ownership or interest therein to be acquired. The loan documents evidencing such borrowing may be executed by the members of the Board, a nominee of the Board, or by a land trust of which the Board shall be the beneficiary.
- 8.10 <u>Title to Acquired Interests</u>. Unit Ownerships or interests therein acquired pursuant to the terms of this Article shall be held of record in the name of the members of the Board and their successors in office, or such nominee as they shall designate, for the benefit of all the Owners. Said Unit Ownerships or interests therein shall be sold or leased by the Board in such manner as it shall determine. All proceeds of such sale and/or leasing shall be deposited in the maintenance fund and credited to each Owner in the same proportion in which the Board could levy a special assessment under the terms of Section 8.09(a) above.
- 8.11 Responsibility of Transferees for Unpaid Assessments. In a voluntary transfer of a Unit, the transferee of the Unit shall be jointly and severally liable with the transferor for all unpaid assessments against the latter up to the time of transfer, without prejudice to the transferee's right to recover from the transferor the amounts paid by the transferee therefor. However, any such transferee shall be entitled to a statement from the Board or President, or managing agent of the Association, as the case may be, setting forth the amount of the unpaid assessments against the transferor due the

Association and such transferee shall not be liable for, nor shall the Unit conveyed be subject to a lien for, any unpaid assessments made by the Association against the transferor in excess of the amount therein set forth.

#### ARTICLE IX LEASING

#### 9.01 Leasing Of Units

- (a) No Unit, or interest therein, shall be leased by a Unit Owner, in accordance with an Amendment recorded against the Original Declaration On November 14, 1990. As of that date, no existing lease could be renewed nor could any new lease agreements be entered into.
- (b) Effective with the recording of this Amended and Restated Declaration, the restriction on leasing a Unit shall not apply to the rental or leasing of units to the immediate family members of the Unit Owner. For purposes of this Section, "immediate family members" shall include the parents, children, siblings, grandparents or grandchildren of a Unit Owner. Other close relatives, such as nieces and nephews, may lease a unit with the prior written approval of the Board.
- (c) Any Unit being leased our in violation of this section or any Unit Owner found to be in violation of the rules and regulations adopted by the Board of Directors may be subject to a flat or daily line to be determined by the Board of Directors upon notice and an opportunity to be heard.
- (d) In addition to the authority to levy fines against the Unit Owner for violation of this section or any other provision of the Deparation, By-Laws or rules and regulations, the Board shall have all rights and remedies, including but not limited to the right to maintain an action for possession against the Unit Owner and/or their tenant, or an action at law for damages.
- (e) Any action brought on behalf of the Association and/or the Board of Directors to enforce the provisions of this section shall subject the Unit Owner to the payment of all costs and attorney's fees at the time they are incurred by the Association. All unpaid charges as a result of the foregoing shall be deemed to be a lien against the Unit and collectible as any other unpaid regular or special assessment, including late fees and interest on the unpaid balance.

# ARTICLE X INSURANCE/CONDEMNATION/RESTORATION

10.01 Insurance. The Association at all times shall maintain:

- (a) Property Insurance. Property insurance (1) on the Common Elements and the Units, including the Limited Common Elements and except as otherwise determined by the Board of Managers, the bare walls, floors, and ceilings of the Unit, (2) providing coverage for special form causes of loss, and (3) in a total amount of not less than the full insurable replacement cost of the insurance property, less deductibles, but including coverage for the increased costs of construction due to building code requirements, at the time the insurance is purchased and at each renewal date.
- against claims and liabilities arising in connection with the ownership, existence, use, or management of the Property in a minimum amount of \$1,000,000, or a greater amount deemed sufficient in the judgment of the Board, insuring the Board, the Association, the management agent, and their respective employees and agents and all persons acting as agents. The Unit Owners must be included as additional institute parties but only for claims and liabilities arising in connection with the ownership, existence, use, or management of the Common Elements. The insurance must cover claims of one or more insured parties against other insured parties.

#### (c) Fidelity Bond; Directors and Officers Coverage.

- (1) The Association must obtain and maintain a fidelity bond covering persons, including the managing agent and its employees who control or disburse funds of the Association, for the maximum amount of coverage available to protect funds in the custody or control of the Association, plus the Association reserve fund.
- (2) All management companies that are responsible for the funds held or administered by the Association must be covered by a fidelity bond for the maximum amount of coverage available to protect those funds. The Association has standing to make a loss claim against the bond of the managing agent as a party covered under the bond.
- (3) For purposes of paragraphs (1) and (2), the fidelity bond must be in the full amount of Association funds and reserves in the custody of the Association or the management company.
- (4) The Board of Managers must obtain directors and officer's liability coverage at a level deemed reasonable by the Board, if not otherwise established by the Declaration or By-Laws. Directors and officer's liability coverage must extend to all contracts and other actions taken by the Board in their official capacity as directors and officers, but this coverage shall exclude actions for which the directors are not entitled to indemnification under the Illinois Condominium Property Act, the

General Not For Profit Corporation Act of 1986 or the Declaration and By-Laws of the Association.

- (d) Contiguous Units; Improvements and Betterments. The insurance maintained under paragraph (a) must include the Units, the Limited Common Elements except as otherwise determined by the Board of Managers, and the Common Elements. The insurance need not cover improvements and betterments to the Units installed by Unit Owners, but if improvements and betterments are covered, any increased cost may be assessed by the Association against the Units affected. Common Elements include fixtures located within the unfinished interior surfaces of the perimeter walls, floors, and ceilings of the individual units initially installed by the Developer. Common Elements exclude floor, wall, and ceiling coverings. "Improvements and betterments" means all decorating, fixtures, and furnishings installed or added to and located within the boundaries of the Unit, including electrical fixtures, appliances, air conditioning and heating equipment, water heaters, or built-in cabinets installed by Unit Owners.
- (e) <u>Payment cr Deductibles</u>. In the event of an insurance claim, the following is applicable:
  - (1) The Unit Owner of the Unit that caused damage to common areas or limited common areas, the Unit Owner shall be responsible for the repair of such damage.
  - (2) Unit to Unit damage, and any deductible that may be involved, shall be handled amongst the Unit Owner's and not the Association
- (f) Other Coverages. Within the discretion of the Board, the Association may carry any other insurance, including workers compensation, employment practices, environmental hazards, and equipment breakdown that the Board of Managers considers appropriate to protect the Association, the Unit Owners, or officers, directors, or agents of the Association.
- (g) <u>Insured Parties; Waiver of Subrogation</u>. Insurance policies carried pursuant to paragraphs (a) and (b) must include each of the following provisions:
  - (1) Each Unit Owner and secured party is an insured person under the policy with respect to liability arising out of the Unit Owner's interest in the Common Elements or membership in the Association.
  - (2) The insurer waives its right to subrogation under the policy against any Unit Owner of the Condominium or Members of the Unit Owner's household and against the Association and members of the Board of Managers.

- (3) The Unit Owner waives his or her right to subrogation under the Association policy against the Association and the Board of Managers.
- (h) <u>Primary Insurance</u>. If at the time of a loss under the policy there is other insurance in the name of a Unit Owner covering the same property covered by the policy, the Association's policy is primary insurance.
- by the property policy under paragraph (a) must be adjusted by and with the Association. The insurance proceeds for that loss must be payable to the Association, or to an insurance trustee designated by the Association for that purpose. The insurance trustee or the Association must hold any insurance proceeds in trust for Unit Owners and secured parties as their interests may appear. The proceeds must be disbursed first for the repair or restoration of the damaged Common Elements, the bare walls, ceilings, and floors of the Units, and then to any improvements and betterments the Association may insure. Unit Owners are not entitled to receive any portion of the proceeds unless there is a surplus of proceeds afte the Common Elements and Units have been completely repaired or restored or the Association has been terminated as trustee.
- Mandatory Unit Owner Coverage. The Board of Managers may, (j) under the Declaration and By-Laws or by rule, require Unit Owners to obtain insurance covering their personal liability and compensatory (but not consequential) damages to another Unit caused by the negligence of the Owner or his or her guests, residents, or invitees, or regardless of any negligence originating from the Unit. The personal liability of a Unit Owner or Association Member must include the deductible of the Owner whose Unit was damaged, any damage not covered by insurance required by this paragraph, as well as the decorating, painting, wall and floor coverings, trim, appliances, equipment, and other furnishings. If the Unit Owner does not purchase or produce evidence of insurance requested by the Board, the Directors may purchase the insurance coverage and charge the premium cost back to the Unit Owner. In the event is the Board liable to any person either with regard to its decision not to purchase the insurance, or with regard to the timing of its purchase of the insurance or the amounts or types of coverages obtained.
- (k) <u>Certificates of Insurance</u>. Contractors and vendors (except public utilities) doing business with the Association under contracts exceeding \$1,000 per year must provide certificates of insurance naming the Association, its Board of Managers, and its managing agent as additional insured parties.
- (I) <u>Settlement of Claims</u>. Any insurer defending a liability claim against the Association must notify the Association of the terms of the settlement no less than ten days (10) before settling the claim. The Association may not veto the settlement unless otherwise provided by contract or statute.

- (m) <u>Miscellaneous</u>. All policies of insurance of the character described in above in this Article X:
  - (1) shall name as insured the Board, as trustees for the Unit Owners, in the percentages established in Exhibit A to this Declaration; and shall also name as an assured the Insurance Trustee described in herein, as the respective interests of all of such assureds may appear;
  - (2) shall be without contribution as respects other such policies of insurance carried individually by the Unit Owners, whether such other insurance covers their respective Units or the additions and improvements made by such Unit Owners to their respective Unit;
  - (3) shall provide that notwithstanding any provision thereof which gives the insurer an election to restore damage in lieu of making a cash settlement therefore, such option shall not be exercisable in the event the Unit Owners elect to sell the Property or remove the Property from the provision's of the Act;
  - (4) shall contain an endorsement to the effect that such policy shall not be terminated for non-payment of premiums without at least ten (10) days' prior written notice to the First Mortgagee of each Unit Ownership;
  - include the payment of Common Expenses with respect to damaged Units during the period of reconstruction thereof. Notwithstanding the issuance of standard mortgage clause endorsements under the policies of insurance of the character described herein, any losses under such policies shall be payable, and all insurance proceeds recovered thereunder shall be applied and disbursed, in accordance with the provisions of this Declaration; and
  - (6) shall name as insureds the Association, the Board, its managing company, and the other agents and employees of such Association, Board and managing company and shall also provide coverage for each Unit Owner (but as to the insurance described above, only with respect to those portions of the Property not reserved for their exclusive use. In addition, all policies of insurance of the character described in this Article X shall contain an endorsement or clause whereby the insurer waives any right to be subrogated to any claim against the Association, its officers, members of the Board, the managing agent, their respective employees and agents, and the Unit Owners and Occupants.

- (n) Payment of Premiums. The Association, for the benefit of the Unit Owners and the First Mortgagee of each Unit Ownership, shall pay the premiums and obtain a binder on the policies of insurance described in this Article X at least thirty days (30) prior to the expiration date of the respective policies, and upon written request therefore, shall notify the First Mortgagee of each Unit Ownership of such payment within ten days (10) after the date on which payment is made.
- (o) Loss. Loss, if any, under any policies of insurance of the character described in this Article X shall be adjusted with the Board, and the insurance proceeds on account of any such loss shall be paid and applied as follows:
  - (1) To the Board, as trustee for each of the Unit Owners in their respective percentages of ownership in the Common Elements as established in this Declaration, in the case of any one loss, of Fifty Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$50,000.00) or less in the aggregate, which insurance proceeds, less the actual cost, fees and expenses, if any, incurred in connection with the adjustment of the loss, shall be applied to the payment or the cost of restoring the Property to substantially the same condition as it existed immediately prior to such damage or destruction, with each Unit and the Common Elements having the same vertical and horizontal boundaries as before, free from vendor's, mechanics', materialman's, and other similar liens; or
  - In the case of any one loss exceeding Fifty Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$50,000.00) in the agoregate, then the insurance proceeds shall be paid to the bank, which corporation is hereby designated by the Board to act as trustee for the Board (the "Insurance Trustee") pursuant to the Act for the purpose of collecting and disbursing the insurance proceeds described in this subparagraph (ii). If such entity (or its successor appointed pursuant hereto) shall fail or cease for any reason to act as the Insurance Trustee, then the Board shall pursuant to the Act, appoint as successor Insurance Trustee a corporation qualified to accept and execute trusts in the State of Illinois and having a capital of not less than Five Million and No/100 Dollars (\$5,000,000.00). Such proceeds, less the actual cost, fees, and expenses, if any, incurred in connection with the adjustment of the loss, and the fees of the Insurance Trustee, shall be applied by the Insurance Trustee to the payment of the cost of restoring the Property to substantially the same condition as it existed immediately prior to such damage or destruction, with each Unit and the Common Elements having the same vertical and horizontal boundaries as before. Such proceeds shall be paid by the Insurance Trustee to or for the account of the Association, from time to time as work progresses, in such manner as shall be required to facilitate the restoration of the Property in accordance with the provisions of the Act. The Association and the Insurance Trustee may, prior or subsequent to any such loss, enter into an insurance trust agreement further

implementing the provisions of the Act and this Declaration with respect to the collection and disbursement of proceeds of insurance by the Insurance Trustee.

#### 10.02 Repair or Reconstruction.

- (a) In the case of damage by fire or other disaster to a portion of the Condominium Property (a "Damaged Improvement") where the insurance proceeds are sufficient to repair or reconstruct the Damaged Improvement, then the proceeds shall be used by the Association to repair or reconstruct the Damaged Improvement.
- Condominum Property where the insurance proceeds are insufficient to repair or reconstructive Damaged Improvement as provided under the Act or the Damaged Improvement cannot be reconstructed as originally designed and built because of zoning, building or other applicable laws, ordinances or regulations, the following procedure shall be followed:
  - (1) A mee'ing of the Owners shall be held not later than the first to occur of (A) the expiration of thirty (30) days after the final adjustment of the insurance claims or (B) the expiration of ninety (90) days after the occurrence which caused the damage.
  - or reconstruction of the Damaged Improvement and an estimate of the cost of repair or reconstruction, together with an estimate of the amount thereof which must be raised by way of special assessment and a proposed schedule for the collection of a special assessment to pay the excess cost.
  - (3) A vote shall then be taken on the question of whether or not the Damaged Improvement shall be repaired or reconstructed based on the information provided by the Board under (ii) above, including the proposed special assessment. The Damaged Improvement shall be repaired or reconstructed and the proposed special assessment shall be levied only upon the affirmative vote of Voting Members representing at least three-fourths (3/4) of the votes cast.
  - (4) If the Voting Members do not vote to repair or reconstruct the Damaged Improvement at the meeting provided for above, then the Board may, at its discretion, call another meeting or meetings of the Owners to reconsider the question of whether or not the Damaged Improvement shall be repaired or reconstructed. If the Voting Members do not vote to repair or reconstruct the Damaged Improvement within one hundred eighty (180) days after the occurrence which caused the damage,

then the Board may (but shall not be obligated to) in its discretion (but subject to the provisions herein) Record a notice as permitted under the Act.

- (c) If the Damaged Improvement is repaired or reconstructed, it shall be done in a workmanlike manner and the Damaged Improvement, as repaired or reconstructed, shall be substantially similar in design and construction to the improvements on the Condominium Property as they existed prior to the damage, with any variations or modifications required to comply with applicable law.
- (d) If the Damaged Improvement is not repaired or reconstructed, then the damaged portion of the Building shall be razed, or secured and otherwise maintained in conformance with the rules or standards adopted from time to time by the Board.

#### 10.03 Condemnation.

- (a) In the case of a taking or condemnation by competent authority of any part of the Condominium Property, the Association shall, if necessary, restore the improvements in the remaining portion of the Condominium Property to conform as closely as possible to the general design, structure and materials used with respect to the improvements as they existed prior to the taking or condemnation. Any proceeds or awards paid to the Association shall be applied first to the cost of any restoration and any remaining portion of such proceeds or awards shall be, in the discretion of the Board, sither (1) applied to pay the Common Expenses or (2) distributed to the remaining Owners and their respective First Mortgagees, as their interests may appear, based on their current Undivided Interests. Each Owner appoints the Association as attorney-in-fact for the purpose of representing him in any condemnation proceedings or in negotiations, settlements and agreements with the condemnation authority for acquisition of the Common Elements or any part thereof.
- (b) In the event that part or all of one or more Units is taken or condemned, then the portions so taken or condemned shall be deemed to have been removed from the provisions of the Declaration and the Act and the court which has jurisdiction of the action shall adjust the Undivided Interests of the remaining Units in a just and equitable manner and as provided under the Act, and if the court fails to make such adjustment, such adjustment may be made by the Board. The President and Secretary of the Association shall execute and Record an instrument on behalf of the Association as required by the Act which amends this Declaration, effective as of the effective date of the taking or condemnation, to reflect the removal of property and adjustments, if any, in the Undivided Interests as a result of an occurrence covered by this Section. From and after the effective date of the amendment referred to in the preceding sentence, the Owner of a Unit which is removed in part or in whole from the

provisions of this Declaration shall only be liable for the payment of assessments based on the Undivided Interest, if any, allocated to the Unit in the amendment.

# ARTICLE XI ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION

#### 11.01 Dispute Resolution.

- (a) In the event of a dispute between two or more owners or any owner and the Board of Managers, the Board may convene a special closed meeting of the Board under Section 18(a)(9) of the Illinois Condominium Property Act for the purpose of arbitrating said dispute.
- (b) Written notice shall be sent by the Board not less than ten (10) nor more than thirty (30) days in advance.
- (c) The Board or its duly authorized committee, not to exceed three (3) members, shall convene a panel to hear all evidence and report to the Board of Managers as to findings and a recommendation.
- (d) The Board shall review such findings and consider same at its next open meeting and either accept or reject them.
- (e) Parties who voluntarily submit their dispute to the Board for arbitration or mediation agree to be bound by any findings rendered by the Board of Managers and shall carry out any required course or action.
- (f) All proceedings shall be subject to provisions of the Declaration regarding rule enforcement.
- (g) All costs incurred, including attorneys fees, will be shared equally between the parties.

#### ARTICLE XII REMEDIES

- **12.01** <u>Violations</u>. Upon the occurrence of any one or more of the following events, the Board shall have the rights and remedies set forth in Section 12.02 of this Declaration:
  - (a) Failure by a Unit Owner to pay when due any sums required to be paid by such Unit Owner pursuant to the provisions of this Declaration for thirty (30) days after written notice of such non-payment shall have been given such Unit Owner; provided that such defaulting Unit Owner shall not be entitled to

written notice and opportunity to cure such failure if such Unit Owner has been given three (3) or more notices pursuant to this Section 12.01(a) during the twelve-month period immediately preceding the first day of such failure.

- (b) Violation or breach by a Unit Owner or an Occupant of any provision, covenant or restriction of the Act, this Declaration, the By-Laws, contractual obligation to the Board or Association undertaken by such Unit Owner, or rules and regulations promulgated by the Board, and continuation of such violation or breach for thirty (30) days after written notice thereof shall have been given such Unit Owner; provided that such defaulting Unit Owner shall not be entitled to written notice and opportunity to correct such violation or breach if Section 12.01(b) during the twelve-month period immediately preceding the first day of such violation or breach.
- **12.02** Remedies. Upon the occurrence of any one or more of the events described in Section 12.01, the Board shall have the following rights and remedies:
  - (a) The Board shall have the right to immediate possession of the defaulting Unit Owner's Unit after service by the Board on such Unit Owner, in the manner set forth herein, of a notice to quit and deliver up possession, which right may be enforced by an action for possession under Article IX of the Code of Civil Procedure, as amended.
  - (b) For a violation or breach described in Section 12.01(b) hereof, the Board shall have the right:
    - (1) to enter upon that part of the Property where such violation or breach exists and summarily abate and remove or do whatever else may be necessary to correct, at the expense of the defaulting Unit Owner, any such violation or breach or the cause of such violation or breach, and the Board, or its agents, shall not thereby be deemed guilty in any manner of trespass; or
    - (2) to enjoin, abate, or remedy by a proceeding at law of in equity the continuance of any such violation or breach provided, however, that no summary abatement shall be undertaken in connection with any alteration or demolition of improvements until judicial proceedings are instituted.
  - (c) Upon the occurrence of one of the events described in Section 12.01(a) hereof, including, without limitation, failure by a Unit Owner to pay his percentage share of Common Expenses or user charges, the Board shall have a lien on the interest of the defaulting Unit Owner in his Unit Ownership in the amount of any sums due from such Unit Owner; provided, however, that such lien shall be subordinate to the lien of a prior recorded first mortgage on the

interest of such Unit Owner. Except as hereinafter provided, the lien provided for in this Section 12.02(c) shall not be affected by any transfer of title to the Unit Ownership. Where title to the Unit Ownership is transferred pursuant to a decree of foreclosure or by deed or assignment in lieu of foreclosure, such transfer of title shall, to the extent permitted by law, extinguish the lien described in this Section 12.02(c) for any sums which became due prior to (1) the date of the transfer of title or (2) the date on which the transferee comes into possession of the Unit Ownership, whichever occurs first. However, the transferee of a Unit Ownership shall be liable for his share of any sums with respect to which a lien against his Unit Ownership has been extinguished pursuant to the preceding sentence which are reallocated among the Unit Owners pursuant to a subsequently adopted annual revised or special assessment, and non-payment thereof by such transferee shall result in a lien against the transferee's Unit Ownership as provided in this Section 12.02(c).

- The Board shall have the power to issue to the defaulting Unit (d) Owner a ten (10) day notice in writing to terminate the right of said defaulting Unit Owner to continue as a Unit Owner and to continue to occupy, use, or control his Unit Ownership and ther supon an action may be filed by the Board against the defaulting Unit Owner for a decree declaring the termination of the defaulting Unit Owner's right to occupy, use or control the Unit owned by him and ordering that all the right, title and interest of said defaulting Unit Owner in the Property shall be sold at a judicial sale, upon such notice and terms as the court shall determine, except that the court shall enjoin and restrain the defaulting Unit Owner from re-acquiring his interest in the Unit Ownership at such judicial sale. It shall be a condition of any such sale, and the decree shall so provide, that the purchaser shall take the interest in the Unit Ownership sold subject to this Declaration. The proceeds of any such judicial sale shall first be paid to discharge court costs, court reporter charges, reasonable attorneys' fees, and all other expenses of the proceeding and sale, and all such items shall be taxed against the defaulting Unit Owner in said decree. Any balance of proceeds, after satisfaction of such charges and any unpaid assessments or other sums due hereunder or any liens, shall be paid to the defaulting Unit Owner. Upon the confirmation of such sale, the purchaser at such sale shall be entitled to a deed to the Unit Ownership and to immediate possession of the Unit sold and may apply to the court for a writ of assistance for the purpose of acquiring such
- (e) In addition to or in conjunction with the remedies set forth above, the Board or its agents shall have the right to bring an action at law or in equity against the Unit Owner or Occupant as permitted by law including, without limitation, an action (1) to foreclose a lien against the Unit Ownership, (2) for damages, injunctive relief, or specific performance, (3) for judgment or for the payment of money and the collection thereof, (4) for any combination of the remedies set forth in this Article or (5) for any other relief which the Board may deem necessary or appropriate. Any and all rights and remedies provided for in

the Act, this Declaration, any contractual obligation to the Board or Association undertaken by such Unit Owner, or rules and regulations promulgated by the Board may be exercised at any time and from time to time cumulatively or otherwise by the Board in its discretion. The failure of the Board to exercise any such rights or remedies to enforce any provisions of this Declaration, the By-Laws or rules and regulations of the Board shall in no event be deemed a waiver of the right to do so thereafter.

- (f) Upon the occurrence of one of the events described in Section 12.01(a), the Board may accelerate the maturity of the remainder of installments of Common Expenses due from such defaulting Unit Owner for the balance of the assessment year.
- proceedings or self-help in connection with the exercise of its rights and remedies under this Article, including, without limitation, court costs, reasonable attorneys' fees and all other fees and expenses, and all damages, together with interest thereon at the rate of eighteen percent (18%) per annum (or such lesser rate charged by law should 18% be held to be in excess of the maximum legal rate allowable by law), shall be ended to and assessed against the defaulting Unit Owner, and shall be added to and deemed part of his respective share of the Unit Ownership of such defaulting Unit Owner and upon all of the same upon and improvements thereto and upon all ois personal property in his Unit or located elsewhere on the Property.
- 12.03 Enforcement by Unit Owners. Any aggric ved Unit Owner may enforce the provisions of this Declaration, the By-Laws, or any rules and regulations promulgated by the Board by an action at law or in equity against the defaulting Unit Owner or Occupant upon a violation or breach described in Section 12.01(b) hereof against any person or persons either to restrain such violation or breach or to recover damages.

## ARTICLE XIII GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 13.01 <u>Severability</u>. Invalidation of all or any portion of any of the easements, restrictions, covenants, conditions and reservations, by legislation, judgment or court or shall not affect any liens, charges, rights, benefits and privileges and other provisions of this Declaration, which shall remain in full force and effect.
- 13.02 Notices. Any notice required to be sent to any Owner under the provisions of this Declaration shall be deemed to have been properly sent when mailed, postage prepaid, to the last known address of such Owner as it appears on the records of the Association at the time of such mailing, or upon personal delivery to the Owner's Unit.

- 13.03 <u>Captions/Conflicts</u>. The Article and Section headings herein are intended for convenience only and shall not be construed with any substantive effect in this Declaration. In the event of any conflict between the statements made in the recitals to this Declaration and the provisions contained in the body of this Declaration, the provisions contained in the body of this Declaration shall govern.
- 13.04 Perpetuities and Other Invalidity. If any of the options, privileges, covenants or rights created by this Declaration would otherwise be unlawful or void for violation of (a) the rule against perpetuities or some analogous statutory provisions, (b) the rule restricting restraints on alienation, or (c) any other statutory or common law rules imposing time limits, then such provisions shall continue only until twenty-one (21) years after the death of the survivor of the now living lawful descendants of the President of the United States at the time of Recording of this Amended and Restated Declaration.
- 13.05 <u>Title Holding Land Trust</u>. In the event title to any Unit Ownership is conveyed to a title holding anst, under the terms of which all powers of management, operation and control of the Unit remain vested in the trust beneficiary or beneficiaries, then the beneficiaries thereunder from time to time shall be responsible for payment of all assessments, charges or payments hereunder and for the performance of all agreements, covenants and undertakings chargeable or created under this Declaration against such Unit Ownership. No claim shall be made against any such title holding trustee personally for payment of any lien er obligation hereunder created and the trustee shall not be obligated to sequester funds or trust property to apply in whole or in part against such lien or obligation. The amount of such lien or obligation shall continue to be a charge or lien upon the Unit Ownership and the beneficiaries of such trust notwithstanding any transfers of the beneficial interest of any such trust or any transfers of title to such Unit Ownership.
- 13.06 <u>Non-Waiver of Covenants</u>. No covenants, restrictions, conditions, obligations or provisions contained in this Declaration shall be deerned to have been abrogated or waived by reason of any failure to enforce the same, irrespective of the number of violations or breaches which may occur.
- 13.07 Waiver of Damages. Neither the Trustee, nor its beneficiary, nor their respective representatives or designees, shall be liable for any claim whatsoever arising out of or by reason of any actions performed pursuant to any authorities granted to or delegated to it by or pursuant to this Declaration, or in the Trustee's (or its beneficiary or their respective representative's or designee's) capacity as developer, contractor, Owner, manager or seller of the Property, whether or not such claim (a) shall be asserted by any Owner, occupant, the Board or the Association, or by any person or entity claiming through any of them; or (b) shall be on account of injury to person or damage to or loss of property wherever located and however caused; or (c) shall arise out of contract or (except in case of gross negligence) out of tort or malfeasance. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the foregoing enumeration includes all claims for, or arising by reason of, the property or any part thereof being or becoming

out of repair or containing any patent or latent defects, or by reason of any act or neglect of any Owner, Occupant, the Board, the Association, and their respective agents, employees, guests, and invitees, or by reason of any neighboring property or personal property located on or about the Property, or by reason of the failure to function, or disrepair of, any utility services (heat, air conditioning, electricity, gas, water, sewage, etc.).

- 13.08 Amendments to Declaration. The provisions of Article II, Article III, Article VI, Section 8.06 and Section 13.08 of this Declaration may be changed, modified, or rescinded by instrument in writing setting forth such change, modification or rescission, signed and acknowledged by the Board, all of the Owners and all mortgagees having bona fide liens of record against Unit Ownerships. Other provisions of this Declaration (except Section 13.07, which may never be changed without the written consent of the Trustee) may be changed, modified or rescinded by an instrument in writing setting forth such change, modification or rescission, signed and acknowledged by the Board, the Owners having at least three-fourths (3/4ths) of the total vote and containing an affidavit by an officer of the Board certifying that a copy of the change, modification or rescission has been mailed by certified mail to all mortgagees having bona fide liens of record against any Unit Ownership, not less than ten (10) days prior to the date or such affidavit. The change, modification or rescission shall be effective upon the recording of such instrument in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds, in Cook County, Illinois, provided, bowever, that no provision in this Declaration may be changed, modified or rescinded so as to conflict with the provisions of the Act.
- Master Association for the purpose of administering and maintaining the Common Areas surrounding and adjacent to the Barcelona Apartment Homes Building No. 5 Condominium Association and all other Residential Associations located on the property. Each Residential Association shall provide representation and all Unit Owners in each Residential Association shall be a Member, except for the Building No. 1 Residential Association. All of the Common Areas are subject to the Declaration of Easements, Covenants and Restrictions for the Barcelona Apartment Flor es Association, hereinafter referred to as "Master Association."
- 13.10 <u>Board of Directors</u>. The Board of Directors of such Barcelona Master Association shall be composed of one member of each Board of Managers of each separate Condominium within the entire Condominium Development other than Building No. 1, and the terms of office of each Director shall run concurrently with his term of office as a member of the Board of Managers of any such individual Condominium.

#### 13.11 Common Facilities and Maintenance

(a) <u>Swimming Pool and Recreational Facilities</u>. The Articles of Incorporation, or By-Laws, or the rules and regulations of such Barcelona Master Association shall contain provisions for the maintenance, insurance, upkeep,

repair, landscaping, materials, supplies, labor, furniture, structural alterations, services, gardening, cleaning, decorating, replacement and taxation of the swimming pool and all other recreational facilities, if any, available for the common use of all Owners of Units in the Entire Condominium Development, and for the levying of assessments on all members for the providing of such monies as and when may be required, from time to time, for such purposes.

- Roadways, Walkways, Exterior Parking Areas and Landscaped (b) Areas in the Prime Condominium Area. The Articles of Incorporation, or By-Laws, or the rules and regulations of such Barcelona Master Association shall contain provisions for the maintenance, insurance, upkeep, repair, landscaping, materials, labor, supplies, furniture, structural alterations, services, gardening, cleaning, replacement and taxation of the roadways, walkways, exterior parking areas, inderground improvements and landscaped areas contained within the Prime Concorninium Area, and all other areas, if any (excluding, however, the swimming pocil) available for the common use of all Owners of Units in the Prime Condominium Area, and for the levying of assessments on all Owners of Units in the Prime Condominum Area only for the purpose of providing such monies as and when may be required from time to time for such purposes.
- 13.12 Sale of a Building. In the event that any one of the buildings contained within the Entire Condominium Development shall not be submitted to the Condominium Act but shall be sold as a whole, the Owner or Owners acquiring such building so sold shall become members of the aforementioned Barcelona Master Association; provided, noviever, that said Owner or Owners shall not own or control nor hold any interest in the aforementioned Barcelona Master Association in excess of that share thereof to which all Units in such building so sold would otherwise be entitled.

CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATION
an Illinois not-for-profit corporation

#### ARTICLE I Name of Corporation

1.01 NAME OF CORPORATION: The name of this corporation is Barcelona Apartment Homes – Building No. 5 Condominium Association.

## ARTICLE II Purpose and Powers

- **2.01** PURPOSES. The purposes of this Association are to act on behalf of its members collectively, as their coverning body for civic functions and other purposes, with respect to the preservation, care maintenance, replacement, improvement, enhancement, operation and administration of both real and personal property and for the promotion of the health, safety and welfare of the members of the Association, all on a not-for-profit basis. These By-Laws are attached as Exhibit B to the Amended and Restated Declaration of Condominium Ownership for the Barcelona Apartment Homes Building No. 5 Condominium Association ("Declaration"). All terms used herein shall have the meanings set forth in the Declaration.
- 2.02 <u>POWERS</u>: The Association shall have and exercise all powers as are now or may hereafter be granted by the General Not For Proit Corporation Act of the State of Illinois, the Illinois Condominium Property Act ("Act"), the Declaration and these By-Laws.
- 2.03 PERSONAL APPLICATION: All present or future Owners, tenants, future tenants, and their agents and employees, and any other person that might use the facilities of the Condominium Property in any manner, shall be subject to the provisions of the Declaration and these By-Laws. The acquisition or rental of a Unit or the act of ratified and will be complied with.

#### ARTICLE III Offices

3.01 <u>REGISTERED OFFICE</u>: The Association shall have and continuously maintain in this state a registered office and a registered agent whose office is identical with such registered office, and may have other offices within or without the State of Illinois as the Board may from time to time determine.

3.02 PRINCIPAL OFFICE: The Association's principal office shall be maintained on the Property or at the office of the managing agent engaged by the Association.

#### ARTICLE IV Meetings of Members

- 4.01 <u>VOTING RIGHTS</u>: The Association shall have one class of membership. There shall be one individual with respect to each Unit who shall be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Owners (the "Voting Member"). If the Owner of a Unit is one individual, then such individual shall be the Voting Member. If the Record ownership of a Unit shall be in more than one individual or if the Owner is a trustee, corporation, partnership or other legal entity, then the Voting Member shall be designated by the Owner or Owners in writing to the Board, and if in the case of multiple individual Owners no designation is given, then the Board may, at its election, recognize an individual Owner of the Unit as 'no Voting Member for such Unit. Any or all Owners may be present at any meeting of the Owners, but the voting rights shall be vested exclusive in the Voting Members; provided, however, that a Voting Member may vote either in person or by proxy executed in writing by the Voting Member or his duly authorized attorney-in-fact and filed with the secretary before the meeting. No proxy shall be valid after eleven (11) months from the date of its execution. Each Voting Member shall have one vote for each Unit which he represents.
- 4.02 PLACE OF MEETING; QUORUM: Meetings of the Owners shall be held on the Condominium Property or at such other place in Cook County and convenient to the Owners as may be designated in any notice of a meeting. All meetings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules and provisions of parliamentary procedure. Voting Members holding twenty percent (20%) of the votes, represented in person or by proxy, shall constitute a quorum. The vote of a majority of the votes entitled to be cast by the Voting Members present or represented by proxy at a meeting at which a quorum is present, shall be necessary for the adoption of any matter voted upon by the Voting Members, unless a greater proportion is required by the Act, the Decla atic n or these By-Laws. The affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the votes entitled to be cast shall be required for the following actions:
  - (a) Merger or consolidation of the Association; and
- (b) Sale, lease, exchange, mortgage, pledge or other disposition of all, or substantially all of the property and assets of the Association.
  - (c) The purchase or sale of the land or of the Units on behalf of all Owners.
- 4.03 ANNUAL MEETINGS: The annual meeting of the Owners shall be held during the month of November each year, at such time and on such date designated by the Board.

- 4.04. SPECIAL MEETINGS: Special meetings of the Owners may be called at any time for the purpose of considering matters which, by the terms of the Declaration, require the approval of all or some of the Voting Members or for any other reasonable purpose. Said meetings shall be called by written notice, authorized by the President, a majority of the Board or by Voting Members representing at least twenty percent (20%) of the votes.
- 4.05 NOTICE OF MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS: Written notice of any membership meeting shall be mailed or personally delivered and posted conspicuously on the Condominium Property, giving Owners not less than ten (10) nor more than thirty (30) days' notice of the time, place and purpose of the meeting.

#### ARTICLE V Board of Managers

- administration of the Condominium Property shall be vested in the Board, which shall consist of five (5) persons ("Directors"). The Board may vote to increase or decrease the number of Directors, provided, however, that at no time shall the number of Directors be less than three (3). The Board shall have all of the powers granted to it under the Act, the Declaration, these 37-Laws and the General Not For Profit Corporation Act of the State of Illinois.
- 5.02 ELECTION: The total number of votes of all Voting Members shall be one hundred (100), and each Owner or group of Owners shall be entitled to the number of votes equal to the total of the percentage of ownership in Common Elements applicable to his or their Unit ownership as set forth in Exhibit B. The terms of at least one-third (1/3) of the persons on the Board shall expire annually and the Board member shall be elected to a term in excess of two (2) years. Each Director shall serve until his term expires or is terminated or until his successor shall have been excited and qualified. A Director may succeed himself in office.
- 5.05 ANNUAL MEETINGS: The Board shall hold an annual Board meeting within ten (10) days after the annual meeting of the Owners at such place as shall be fixed by the Directors at annual meeting of the Owners.
- 5.06 <u>REGULAR MEETINGS</u>: Regular meetings of the Board shall be held once a month, unless canceled by the Board, at such time and place as shall be determined at the annual meeting or, from time to time, by a majority of the Directors, and provided that not less than four (4) such meetings shall be held during each fiscal year.
- **5.07 SPECIAL MEETINGS**: Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President or by at least two-thirds (2/3) of the Directors then serving.
- 5.08 NOTICE OF BOARD MEETINGS: Notice of each meeting of the Board shall be mailed or personally delivered to each Director at least forty-eight (48) hours

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prior to the meeting and notice of any meeting of the Board concerning the adoption of the proposed annual budget or any increase or establishment of an assessment shall be given to each Owner in the same manner as provided in Section 4.05 of these By-Laws, unless a written waiver of such notice is signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice before the meeting is convened. Notice of each meeting of the Board shall also be conspicuously posted on the Condominium Property at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the meeting.

- law, shall be open to any Owner, subject to the exception for closed sessions, and, if required under the Act, notice of such meeting shall be mailed or personally delivered and posted conspicuously upon the Condominium Property at least forty-eight (48) hours prior thereto, unless a written waiver of such notice is signed by the person or personable rules governing the conduct of the Owners who attend meetings and Owners who do not comply with such rules may be removed from the meeting.
- 5.10 QUORUM: A najority of the Directors serving from time to time shall constitute a quorum for the election of the officers and for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board. Except as otherwise expressly provided herein or in the Directors present at a meeting at which a guorum is present.
- 5.11 <u>COMPENSATION/REIMBURSEIZENT FOR EXPENSES</u>: No Director shall be compensated by the Association for services rendered to the Association, except as expressly provided in a resolution duly adopted by the Board and no less than two-thirds (2/3) of the Unit Owners. Upon the presentation of receipts or other appropriate documentation, a Director shall be reimbursed by the Association for reasonable out-of-pocket expenses incurred in the course of the performance of his duties as a Director.
- removed from office, with or without cause, by action of two-thirds (2/3) of the Voting Members at any annual meeting or at a special meeting called for such purpose or by action of the Board if said Director misses three (3) successive meetings without cause. Any Director whose removal has been proposed by the Owners shall be given an opportunity to be heard at a meeting. Any Director may resign at any time by submitting his written resignation to the Board. If a Director ceases to be an Owner or a Voting Member, he shall be deemed to have resigned as of the date of such cessation. A successor to fill the unexpired term of a Director who resigns or is removed may be appointed by the Voting Members at the same meeting, or by a majority of the remaining Directors at any regular meeting or at any special meeting called for such purpose, and any successor so appointed shall serve the balance of his predecessor's term.
- 5.13 POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD: The Board shall have all of the powers and duties granted to it or imposed upon it by the Act, the Declaration, these

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By-Laws and the Illinois General Not For Profit Corporation Act, including, without limitation, the following powers and duties.

- (a) Subject to the provisions of the Declaration, to engage the services of a manager or managing agent to assist the Association in performing and providing such services as the Association is required to provide to its members under the Declaration;
- (b) To provide for the designation, hiring and removal of such employees and such other personnel, including attorneys and accountants, as the Board may, in its discretion, deem necessary or proper for the effective auministration of the Association;
- To provide for any maintenance, repair, alteration, addition, improvement or replacement of the Common Elements for which the Association is responsible under the Declaration and these By-Laws;
- (d) To estinate and provide each Owner with an annual budget as provided for in the Declaration;
- (e) To set, give not co of, and collect assessments from the Owners as provided in the Declaration;
  - (f) To pay the Common Expenses;
  - (g) To adopt rules and regulations as provided in the Declaration;
- (h) To delegate the exercise of its power to committees appointed pursuant to Section 7.01 of these By-Laws;
- (i) To own, convey, encumber, lease or otherwise deal with Units or other real property conveyed to or purchased by the Association;
- (j) To incur liabilities, to borrow funds if necessary for Association purposes; to secure any of its obligations by pledge or assignment of the right for future income and accounts receivable; and
- (k) To keep detailed, accurate records of the receipts and expenditures affecting the use and operation of the Condominium Property.

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#### ARTICLE VI Officers

- 6.01 OFFICERS: The officers of the Association shall be a President, a Secretary and a Treasurer and such assistants to such officers as the Board may deem appropriate. All officers shall be elected at each annual meeting of the Board and shall hold office at the discretion of the Board. Officers may succeed themselves in office. Other than the President, a person may hold more than one office.
- 6.02 <u>VACANCY OF OFFICE</u>: Any officer may be removed at any meeting of the Board by the affirmative vote of the majority of the Directors in office, either with or without cause, and any vacancy in any office may be filled by the Board at any meeting thereof.
- 6.03 POWERS OF OFFICERS: The respective officers of the Association shall have such powers and duties as are from time to time prescribed by the Board and as are usually vested in such officers of an Illinois Not-For-Profit Corporation including, without limitation, the following:
  - (a) The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Association and shall preside at all meetings of the Owners and at all meetings of the Board and shall execute amendments to the Declaration and these By-Laws, as provided for in the Act, the Declaration and these By-Laws;
  - (b) The Secretary shall keep minutes of all meetings of the Owners and of the Board and shall have custody of the corporate seal of the Association and have charge of such other books, papers and documents as the Board may prescribe, and shall be responsible for giving and receiving all notices to be given to or by the Association under the Act, the Declaration or these By-Laws;
  - (c) The Treasurer shall be responsible for Association funds and securities and for keeping full and accurate accounts of all receipts and disbursements in the Association books of accounts kept for such propose. The Treasurer shall be responsible for the deposit of all monies and other valuable effects in the name and to the credit of the Association in such depositories as may from time to time be designated by the Board.
- **6.04** OFFICERS' COMPENSATION: The officers shall receive no compensation for their services except as expressly provided by a resolution duly adopted by two-thirds (2/3) of the Voting Members.

## ARTICLE VII Committees Designated By Board

7.01 <u>BOARD COMMITTEES</u>: The Board, by resolution adopted by a majority of the Directors in office, may designate one or more committees, each of which shall consist of two or more Directors, which committees, to the extent consistent with law

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and as provided in said resolution, shall have and exercise the authority of the Board in the management of the Association; but the designation of such committees and delegation thereto of authority shall not operate to relieve the Board, or any individual Director, of any responsibility imposed upon it or him by law.

- 7.02 SPECIAL COMMITTEES: Other committees not having and exercising the authority of the Board in the management of the Association may be designated by a resolution adopted by a majority of the Directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present. Except as otherwise provided in such resolution, members of each such committee shall be Owners. Any member thereof may be removed by the person or persons authorized to appoint such member whenever in their judgment the best interests of the Association shall be served by such removal.
- 7.03 TEFM: Each member of a committee shall continue as such until the next annual meeting of the Board and until his successor is appointed, unless the committee shall be sooner terminated, or unless such member shall be removed from such committee, or unless such member shall cease to qualify as a member thereof.
- 7.04 CHAIRMAN: On a member of each committee shall be appointed chairman.
- 7.05 <u>VACANCIES</u>: Vacancies in the membership of any committee may be filled by appointments made in the same manner as provided in the case of the original appointments.
- 7.06 QUORUM: Unless otherwise provided in the resolution of the Board designating a committee, a majority of the whole committee shall constitute a quorum and the act of a majority of the members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the committee.
- 7.07 <u>RULES</u>: Each committee may adopt rules for its own covernment not inconsistent with the Declaration, these By-Laws or with rules adopted by the Board.

#### ARTICLE VIII Instruments, Checks, Deposits and Funds

8.01 EXECUTION OF INSTRUMENTS: The Board may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents of the Association, in addition to the officers so authorized by these By-Laws, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument (including amendments to the Declaration or these By-Laws which must be executed by the Association) in the name of and on behalf of the Association and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances. In the absence of any such authorization by the Board, any such contract or instrument shall be executed by the President or a Vice President and attested to by the Secretary or an Assistant Secretary of the

- of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Association shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the Association, and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Board. In the absence of such determination by the Board, such instruments shall be signed by the Treasurer or an Assistant Treasurer and countersigned by another Board member of the Association.
- **8.03 BANK ACCOUNTS**: All funds of the Association not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Association in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board shall elect.
- 8.04 <u>SPECIAL RECEIPTS</u>: The Board may accept on behalf of the Association any contribution, gift, request, or devise for the general purposes or for any special purpose of the Association.

## ARTICLE IX Fiscal Management

- 9.01 FISCAL YEAR: The fiscal year of the Association shall be determined by the Board and may be changed from time to time as the Board deems advisable.
- 9.02 ANNUAL STATEMENT: Within a reasonable time after the close of each fiscal year, the Board shall furnish each Owner with an itemized accounting of the Common Expenses for such fiscal year actually incurred or paid, together with an indication of which portion of the Common Expenses were incurred or paid for capital expenditures or repairs or the payment of the real estate taxes, and with a tabulation of the amounts collected pursuant to the Annual Assessment budget, and showing the net excess or deficit of income over expenditures plus reserves.
- 9.03 ASSESSMENT PROCEDURE: Annual assessments and special assessments shall be made and collected as provided in Section 6 of the Declaration, and the provisions of Section 6 are incorporated herein by reference.

#### ARTICLE X Books and Records

10.01 <u>BOOKS AND RECORDS</u>: The Association shall keep correct and complete books and records of accounts and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its members, the Board, and committees having any of the authority of the Board, and shall keep at the registered or principal office of the Association a record giving the names and addresses of the members. All books and records of the Association may be inspected by any Owner, or his agent, mortgagee or attorney, for any proper purpose at any reasonable time.

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#### ARTICLE XI Seal

11.01 <u>SEAL</u>: The Board may provide for a corporate seal which shall be in the form of a circle and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the Association and the words "Corporate Seal", Illinois.

#### ARTICLE XII Amendments

12.01 AMENDING THE BY-LAWS: These By-Laws may be amended or modified from time to time by action or approval of Unit Owners owning at least two-thirds (2/3) of the total ownership interest in the Common Elements. Such amendments shall become effective upon recording such amendments; provided, however, that no provision in these By-Laws may be amended so as to conflict with the Declaration or the Act.
