The Court having heard the evidence at trial and being fully advised in the cremises finds that:

1. The Court has jurisdiction of the parties hereto and the subject matter which is the building located at the common address of 5349 S. Laflin, Chicago, Illinois, and legally described as follows:

LOT 29 IN BLOCK 1 IN THE SUBDIVISION OF THE WEST ½ OF THE EAST ½ OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SECTION 8, TOWNSHIP 38 NORTH, RANGE 14, EAST OF THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, IN COOK, COUNTY ILLINOIS.

The Court further finds that demolition of the building on the subject property is the least restrictive alternative as of September 15, 2011.

#### WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- A. Judgment is entered in favor of Plaintiff City of Chicago and against Defendants on Counts V and VIII of the City's complaint seeking demolition.
- B. Counts I, II, III, IV, VI, VII, IX, and X of the City's complaint are voluntarily dismissed without prejudice.
- C. Defendants shall immediately remove any and all persons occupying the subject property and all personal property from said premises instanter so that said premises will be completely vacant and free of personal property before demolition is commenced.
- D. Pursuant to Illinois Supreme Court Rule 304(a), this is a final and appealable order and the Court finds there is no just reason for delaying the enforcement or appeal of this order.
- E. The Court reserves jurisdiction of this cause to enforce the terms of this order and for the purpose of ascertaining the demolition costs for entry of a money judgment against the defendant owners, as defined by the applicable statutes and ordinances.
- F. Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-31-1 and the City's police powers under Article VII of the Illinois Constitution, the City is gran eduluthorization to demolish the building on the subject property, and is entitled to a lien for the costs of demolition, court costs, and other costs enumerated by statute, and/or other statutory remedies.
