#### ORDER OF DEMOLITION

This cause coming on to be heard on Nov. 26, 2011, on the Plaintia, City of Chicago, a municipal corporation's ("City"), by Mara S. Georges, Corporation Counsel of the City of Chicago, against the following named defendants:

Christopher Boulahanis; Unknown Owners and Non-Record Claimants.

The Court being fully advised in the premises and having heard the evidence after a trial on the merits, finds that:

1. The Court has jurisdiction of the parties and the subject matter, which is the property located at: 11401 S. Wentworth Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, ("subject property"), and legally described as follows:

LOTS 18,19 AND 20 IN BLOCK 7 IN VAN DER SYDE AND BARTLETT'S ADDITION TO PULLMAN IN SECTION 21, TOWNSHIP 37 NORTH, RANGE 14, EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, IN COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

This parcel is commonly known as 11401 S. Wentworth Avenue, Chicago, Cook County Illinois and has Permanent Index Number (PIN) of 25-21-228-001.

- 2. Located on the subject property is a two- story brick building and garage. The last known use of the building was commercial.
- 3. The Court finds that on or about March 16, 2009, and continuing to the present, dangerous and unsafe conditions existed at the subject property, in that:
  - The building located on the subject property ("the building") is vacant.
  - The building's electrical systems are fire damaged, stripped or inoperable.
  - The building's plumbing systems are fire damaged, stripped or inoperable.
  - d. The building's heating systems are fire damaged, stripped or inoperable.
  - e. The building's roof and rafters are fire damaged.
  - f. The building's masonry walls are leaning and bowed with large vertical cracks.
  - g. The building's sashes, frames, doors and trim are deteriorated.
  - h. The building s interior stair system is deteriorated.
  - i. The building's interior floors are deteriorated.
  - j. The building's plaster is broken and missing along the walls and ceilings.
  - k. The building's window glazing is broken or missing.
  - 1. There is trash and debris throughout the interior of the building.
  - m. There is trush and debris surgery ding the exterior of the building.
  - n. There was a fatality la the builds
- 4. The building located on the subject property is dangerous, hazardous, unsafe and beyond reasonable repair under the Unsafe Buildings Statute, 63 TACS 5/11-31-1 (1996).
- 5. Major reconstruction would be necessary to correct the conditions that currently exist at the subject property.
- 6. Demolition of the subject property as a whole, is the least restrictive alternative available to effectively abate the conditions now existing there.

#### WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- A. Judgment is entered in favor of Plaintiff City of Chicago and against Defendants on Counts I, III and IV of the City's Complaint for Demolition.
- B. All remaining Counts of the City's Complaint for Demolition were previously voluntarily dismissed without prejudice.
- C. Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-31-1 and the City's police powers under Article VII of the Illinois Constitution, the City is granted authorization to demolish the building on the subject property, and is entitled to a lien for the costs of demolition, court costs and other

costs enumerated by statute, and/or other statutory remedies.

- D. Pursuant to Illinois Supreme Court Rule 304(a), this is a final and appealable order and the Court finds no just reason for delaying the enforcement or appeal of this order.
- E. The Court retains jurisdiction of this cause to enforce the terms of this order and for the purpose of ascertaining against the Defendant(s) purpose of ascertaining the demolition and litigation costs for entry of a money judgment
