EMERGENCY ORDER OF DEMOLITION

The Court being fully advised of the premises of this proceeding and having heard the testimony of the City's inspector, finds that:

 The Court has jurisdiction of the parties hereto and the subject matter, which is the premises located at the following address: 3713 W. Chicago, Chicago, Illinois, and legally described as follows:

LOT 6 IN BLOCK 3 IN MORTON'S SUBDIVISION OF THE EAST ½ OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 11, TOWNSHIP 39 NORTH, RANGE 13, EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, IN COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

3. The Court having heard testimony and evidence finds that the building located on the subject property is dangerous, hazardous, unsafe and beyond reasonable repair under the Unsafe Buildings Statute, 65 ILCS 5/11-31-1 (1996) in that:

FRONT BUILDING

The building(s) located on the subject property ("the building") is vacant. a. The building's electrical systems are stripped or inoperable with exposed wiring and missing fixtures. The building's plumbing systems are stripped or inoperable with missing fixtures. The building's heating systems are stripped or inoperable with missing duct d. work and a missing furnace. The building's floors have been illegally altered and have holes. e. f. The building's glazing is broken or missing. The building's joists are over notched and have been illegally altered. g. The building's joists have smoke, fire, ar wor water damage. h. i. The building's masonry has loose or missing blick. The building's masonry has smoke, fire, and/or wate: damage. j. k. The building's masonry has altered structural members and wals. I. The building's plaster is broken or missing and has been illegally altered. The building's rafters have been illegally altered and are water damaged. m. The building's roof has been illegally altered and has a damaged membrane. n. 0. The building is fire damaged.



 Demolition of the subject property, as a whole, is the least restrictive alternative available to effectively abate the conditions now existing there.

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- A. The Court finds that the City has met its obligations under Section 21-410 of the Property Tax Code and that property tax certificate holders are subject, inter alia, to Sections 21-95, 21-100, 21-105, and 22-35 of the Property Tax Code. The property tax certificate holder (not applicable) is dismissed as a party defendant.
- B. Judgment is entered in favor of Plaintiff City of Chicago and against Defendants on Counts I and IV of the City of Chicago's complaint for demolition.
- C. The remaining counts of the City's complaint for demolition are voluntarily dismissed.
- D. Fursiant to 65 ILCS 5/11-31-1 and the City's police powers under Article VII of the Illinois Constitution, the City is granted authorization to demolish the building on the subject property, and is entitled to a lien for the costs of demolition, court costs, and other costs enumerated by statute, and/or other statutory remedies.
- E. The authority g ant d in Paragraph B. above shall become effective
- F. The City's performance under this order will result in a statutory in rem lien that attaches only to the subject parcel carbal estate. If the City seeks a personal judgment against any individual party to this action it will proceed by separate motion directed to that party.
- G. St. John's Healthcare Services, Inc. and Florence Anyasor is ordered to keep the property secure until it is demolished.
- H. Defendants with either possession or control of the subject property shall remove any and all persons, if any, occupying the subject property and all personal property from said premises no later than the effective date so that said premises will be completely vacant and free of personal property before demolition is commenced

- Pursuant to Illinois Supreme Court Rule 304(a), this is a final and appealable order. I. The Court finds no just reason for delay in the enforcement or appeal of this order.
- The Court reserves jurisdiction of this cause to enforce the terms of this order and for J. the purpose of ascertaining and approving the demolition and litigation costs.\
