13-8-Z-4004

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A SPECIAL USE PERMIT TO ESTABLISH AND OPERATE AN AUTOMOTIVE REPAIR FACILITY AT 8254 LINCOLN AVENUE, SKOKIE, ILLINOIS IN A TX TRANSIT MIXED USE DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the owner, Oakton Kilbourn Corporation, of the following described real property:

LOTS 5, 6, 7 AND 8 IN BLOCK 3 IN NORTH SHORE "L" TERMINAL SUBDIVISION NUMBER 2, IN SECTION 21, TOWNSHIP 41 NORTH, RANGE 13, EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, IN COCK COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

more commonly described as 8254 Lincoln Avenue, Skokie, Illinois (the "Subject Property"), petitioned the Village of Skokie for a special use permit to establish and operate an automotive repair facility in a TX Transit Mixed-use district, on behalf of ATL Automotive, d/b/a All Tune & Lube ("ATL"); and

WHEREAS, this establishment had recently been located at 7008 Carpenter Road since 2002. In the new location all access will be from the rear of the building with no curb cut on Lincoln Avenue. The parking requirements have been met; and

WHEREAS, ATL provides basic maintenance automotive services with no engine, transmission or body work. ATL's work is mostly same date service. With a total of three employees, ATL's anticipated hours of operation are Monday through Friday 8:00 am to 6:00 pm, and Saturday mornings; and

WHEREAS, the Skokie Plan Commission, at a public hearing duly hold on July 18, 2013, for which proper legal notice had been achieved. Three parties testified parore the Plan Commission. One person was concerned about the potential noise that may be generated and two testified in support of ATL; and

WHEREAS, The Plan Commission went on to (a) make the appropriate findings of fact as required under Section 118-32 of the Skokie Village Code and (b) voted to recommend to the Mayor and Board of Trustees that the requested special use permit be granted subject to the conditions contained in the Plan Commission Report dated August 5, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees, at a public meeting duly held on August 5, 2013, concurred in the aforesaid recommendations and findings of fact of the Skokie Plan Commission;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Skokie, Cook County, Illinois:

<u>Section 1</u>: That the special use permit requested by the petitioner to establish and operate an automotive repair facility at the Subject Property, described above and commonly known as 8254 Lincoln Avenue, Skokie, Illinois, in a TX Transit Mixed Use district be and the same is hereby granted and approved subject to each of the conditions set forth below:

- 1. The petitioner shall develop the Subject Property in substantial conformance with the final Village approved site plan dated July 12, 2013, and floor plan received June 21, 2013.
- 2. Prior to occupancy, the parking lot must be restriped in accordance with the approved site plan.
- 3. Four outdoor planter boxes with live flowers or other ornamental plants are required on the public sidewalk between the windows in front of the use, placed so that a 5-foot wide sidewalk clearance is provided. The planter boxes are to be removed and stored inside during winter
- 4. The existing fence along the rear lot line can remain and must be extended 4 feet at the driveway entrance.
- 5. There shall be no automobile repair work or washing of vehicles from 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.
- 6. All repair work must be performed within a building at all times except inspecting vehicles; adding fluids; and changing tires, batteries, windshield wipers, or light bulbs.
- 7. Outside storage and display of items for sale or lease, tools, equipment, vehicles, parts, or supplies is prohibited.
- 8. Vehicles and boats are prohibited to be sold, advertised for sale, or, other than operational licensed vehicles owned by the establishment, remain outdoors on the property for more than 10 days.
- 9. Any vehicle outdoors in need of repair must be parked in a legal parking space and generally screened from view from any public street in rights-of-way abutting the lot or an abutting residential zoning district. Such vehicle is prohibited from being parked outdoors for more than 10 days.
- 10. Servicing of any vehicle over 8,000 pounds gross weight is prohibited.
- 11. Repair shall be limited to brakes, mufflers, upholstery work, tire repair and change, lubrication, tune-ups, and minor engine, mechanical, or electrical repair.
- 12. All fencing, walls, sidewalks, driveways, curbs, wheel stops, parking areas, signage, landscaping, structures, and any other facilities or infrastructure on the Subject Property shall be maintained in a good state of repair, and when needed, be repaired or replaced in a timely manner
- 13. All new construction, alterations, and remodeling shall meet current International Building and NFPA Life Safety Codes as amended.
- 14. All private and public sidewalks shall be maintained free of snow, ice, sleet, or other objects that may impede travel.

15. All off-street parking spaces shall be legibly striped and maintained.

- 16. Any plan to modify parking lot striping must be approved by the Director of Engineering.
- 17. The handicapped parking spaces shall be installed and maintained in compliance with State of Illinois Accessibility Standards and the Skokie Village Code, including required signage.
- 18. Vehicles shall not be allowed to be parked in or otherwise block common driveways, sidewalks, aisles, or other points of access at any time, shall only be parked in designated parking spaces, and shall not overlap the striped lines of designated parking spaces.
- 19. The owner of the Subject Property [and its tenant] shall ensure that employees park on the Subject Property.
- 20. No required parking space on the site may be for the exclusive use of any tenant.
- 21. The petitioner shall obtain all required permits and approvals for improvements to County, State, or Federal rights-of-way from the governing jurisdiction.
- 22. All signage shall conform to the Skokie Village Code. Any sign on the Subject Property that is in violation of that Code must be removed or modified to conform with the Village Code prior to the issuance of an occupancy permit.
- 23. All modifications to building elevations signage, and landscaping shall be subject to the review and approval of the Skokie Appearance Commission.
- 24. The petitioner shall submit to the Planning Division electronic files of the plat of survey, site plan, and landscape plan in their approved and finalized form. The files shall be scaled 2-dimensional drawing files on non-compressed, non-read only CD-ROM *.dwg AutoCAD format.
- 25. Prior to the issuance of building permits, the petitioner sinell submit to the Planning Division of the Community Development Department the name, address, and telephone number of the company and contact person responsible for site maintenance in compliance with the special use permit.
- 26. If work is to be performed on public property or if public property is utilized or impacted during construction and/or development, the owner shall provide, or shall cause the developer and/or contractor to provide, the Village of Skokie with a certificate of insurance naming the Village of Skokie as additionally insured for any and all claims related to any and all work. The owner shall hold, and shall cause the developer and/or contractor to hold, the Village of Skokie harmless and indemnify the Village for any and all claims for property damage or personal injury related to work on or use of public property.
- 27. The petitioner shall comply with all Federal and State statutes, laws, rules and regulations and all Village codes, ordinances, rules, and regulations.
- 28. Failure to abide by any and all terms of this Ordinance shall be cause for the Village to initiate hearings to determine whether the subject Ordinance, as well as any applicable business licenses, should be revised or revoked. The petitioner shall pay all costs related to any hearings conducted as a result of non-compliance with any of the

provisions of the enabling ordinance. The costs shall include but not be limited to court reporter fees, attorney fees, and staff time required researching and conducting said hearing.
