ORDER OF DEMOLITION

on the complaint of the Plaintiff, City of This cause coming on to be heard on, Chicago, a municipal corporation ("City"), by Stephen R. Paton, Corporation Counsel, against the following named Defendants:

The Court being fully advised of the premises of this proceeding and having heard the

The Court has jurisdiction of the parties hereto and the subject matter, which is the premises located at the following address: 6109 S. Paulina St., Chicago, Cook County, Illinois ("subject property"), legally described as:

LOT 45 IN BLOCK 2 IN ENGLEWOOD ON THE HILL, A SUBDIVISION OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 18, TOWNSHIP 38 NORTH, RANGE 14, EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, IN COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS.



- Located on the subject property is a two story, single family, frame building and a frame garage. The last known use of the subject building was residential.
- The subject building is dangerous, unsafe and beyond reasonable repair under the terms of the Illinois 3. Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-31-1 (1996) (Unsafe Buildings), in that:

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- The building located at the subject property ("building") is vacant and open. a.
- The building's masonry is missing siding. b.
- The building's glazing is broken or missing. c.
- The building's sashes are broken, missing or inoperable. d.
- The building's stair system has improper foundations and improper handrail height. e.
- The building's stair system has damaged decking and damaged handrails. f.
- The building's stair system has no joist hangers and no ledger bolts. g.
- The buil ling's studs have damaged headers and are missing studding. h.
- The building's joists are cracked. i.
- The building's electrical system is stripped and inoperable, with exposed wiring and missing j. fixtures.
- The building's plumbing system is stripped and inoperable and missing fixtures. k.
- The building's heating system is stationed and inoperable, missing ductwork, missing furnace, and 1. vandalized.
- The building's plaster is broken or missing. m.
- The building's flooring is warped and missing. n.
- The building's garage is vacant and open. 0.



- There has been no work in progress since the beginning of this case at the subject property. 4.
- The Court finds that it would take major reconstruction of a responsible owner to bring the subject 5. building into full compliance with the Municipal Code, and that the subject building is beyond reasonable repair. The Court further finds that demolition of the subject building is the least restrictive alternative available to effectively abate the conditions now existing there.

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WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- A. The Court finds that the City has met its obligations under Section 21-410 of the Property Tax Code and that property tax certificate holders are subject, inter alia, to Sections 21-95, 21-100, 21-105, and 22-35 of the Property Tax Code. The property tax certificate holder WHEELER-DEALER LTD. AKA WHEELER FINANCIAL, INC. is dismissed as a party defendant.
- B. Defendants, unknown owners and non-record claimants, having been notified by publication, and having failed to appear, answer, or otherwise plead as of the default date of **June 20, 2014**, are in default and all allegations in the complaint are deemed admitted against Defendants in default.
- C. Judgment is entered in favor of Plaintiff City of Chicago and against Defendants on Counts I and IV of the City's complaint seeking demolition authority.
- D. The remaining count, of the City's complaint are voluntarily withdrawn.
- E. Pursuant to the judgment entered above, 65 ILCS 5/11-31-1, and the City's police powers under Article VII of the Illinois Constitution, are City is granted authorization to demolish the building on the subject property, and is entitled to a lien for the costs of demolition, court costs, and other costs enumerated by statute, and/ or other statutory remedies.
- G. The City's performance under this order will result in a statutory in rem lien that attaches only to the subject parcel of real estate. If the City seeks a personal judgment against any individual party to this action, it will proceed by separate motion directed to that party
- H. Defendants with either possession or control of the subject property chall immediately remove any and all persons occupying the subject property and all personal property from said premises instanter so that said premises will be completely vacant and free of personal property before demolition is commenced. The City's Department of Human Services is authorized to assist in the relocation of any tenants.
- I. Pursuant to Illinois Supreme Court Rule 304(a), this is a final and appealable order and the Court finds that there is no just reason for delaying the enforcement or appeal of this order.
- J. The Court reserves jurisdiction of this cause to enforce the terms of this order and for the purpose of ascertaining the demolition costs for entry of a money judgment against the defendant owners, as defined by the applicable statutes and ordinances.

K. This case is off call.

L. The City agrees to waive any litigation or fines that May be assessed against Jenel Williams.
