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

 - c. The building's glazing is broken or nivsing.
 - d. The building's flooring is missing, warped and smoke, fire, or water damaged.
 - e. The building's joists are cracked, and smoke, tite or water damaged.
 - f. The building's plaster is broken or missing.
 - g. The building's rafters are fire damaged. Lucich Charing wall is fire damaged
 - h. The building's electrical system has exposed wiring, missing fix uces, and is stripped and inoperable.
 - i. The building's heating system is missing ductwork, missing a furnace, and is stripped, inoperable, and vandalized.
 - j. The building's plumbing system is missing fixturesand is stripped and inoperable.
 - k. The building was found to be vacant and open.
 - 1. Cei lings have collapsed
 - m. The chimney has partially collapsed
 - n. Fourtation wall Fractured & moldy
- 4. Demolition of the subject property, as a whole, is the least restrictive alternative available to effectively abate the conditions now existing there.
