ORDER (*F DEMOLITION

This cause coming to be heard on ________, on the complaint of the Plaintiff, City of Chicago, a municipal corporation ("City"), by Stephen R. Patton, Corporation Counsel, against the following named Defendants:

PATRICE CHAMPAGNE;

CHICAGO TITLE LAND TRUST CO., AS TRUSTEE UNDER TRUST #1098771;

U.S. BANK, NA; and

UNKNOWN OWNERS, and NONRECORD CLAIMANTS.

The Court being fully advised of the premises of this proceeding and having heard the evidence finds that:

1. The Court has jurisdiction of the parties hereto and the subject matter, which is the premises located at the following address: 6244 S. Carpenter St., Chicago, Cook County, Illinois ("subject property"), legally described as:

LOT 18 IN BLOCK 2 IN SUBDIVISION OF THE SOUTH 10 ACRES OF THE EAST 1/2 OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 17, TOWNSHIP 38 NORTH, RANGE 14, EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, IN COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

2. Located on the subject property is a two-story brick building. The last known use of the subject building was residential.

The subject building is dangerous, unsafe and beyond reasonable repair under the terms of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-31-1 (1996) (Unsafe Buildings), in that:

BUILDING

- A. The building(s) located on the subject property ("the building") is vacant.
- B. Commonwealth Edison terminated electrical services to the building.
- C. The building's electrical systems are stripped and inoperable.
- D. The building's electrical systems are missing fixtures and have exposed wiring.
- E. The building's heating systems are stripped and inoperable.
- F. The building's heating systems have been vandalized and are missing a furnace.
- G. The ouilding's plumbing systems are stripped and inoperable and are missing fixtures.
- H. The build' is's flooring is missing in places and warped in places.
- I. The building's flooring has smoke, fire, and/or water damage.
- J. The building's glazing is broken or missing.
- K. The building's joists have smoke, fire, and/or water damage.
- L. The building's masonry has smoke, fire, and/or water damage.
- M. The building's plaster is broken or missing and has smoke, fire, and/or water damage.
- N. The building's roof has a damaged merrorane.
- 0. The building's roof has fire and water damage.
- P. The building's sashes are broken, missing, or inoperable.
- Q. The building's stair system has damaged decking and handrails.
- The Court finds that it would take major reconstruction of a responsible owner to bring the subject building into full compliance with the Municipal Code. The Court teather finds that demolition of the subject building is the least restrictive alternative available to effectively abate the conditions now Office existing there.

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- A. Judgment is entered in favor of Plaintiff City of Chicago and against Defendants on Counts I and IV of the City's complaint seeking demolition authority.
- The remaining counts of the City's complaint are voluntarily withdrawn.

- C. Pursuant to the judgment entered above, 65 ILCS 5/11-31-1, and the City's police powers under Article VII of the Illinois Constitution, the City is granted authorization to demolish the building on the subject property, and is entitled to a lien for the costs of demolition, court costs, and other costs enumerated by statute, and/ or other statutory remedies.
- D. The authority granted in Paragraph C above shall become effective in Managraph C above shall be come effective in Manag
- E. The City's performance under this order will result in a statutory <u>in rem</u> lien that attaches only to the subject pa cel of real estate. If the City seeks a personal judgment against any individual party to this action, it will preced by separate motion directed to that party.
- F. Defendants with either possession or control of the subject property shall immediately remove any and all persons occupying the subject property and all personal property from said premises instanter so that said premises will be completely vacant and free of personal property before demolition is commenced. The City's Department of Human Services is authorized to assist in the relocation of any tenants.
- G. Pursuant to Illinois Supreme Court Rule 304(a), this is a final and appealable order and the Court finds that there is no just reason for delaying the enforcement or appeal of this order.
- H. The Court reserves jurisdiction of this cause to enforce the terms of this order and for the purpose of ascertaining the demolition costs for entry of a money judgment against the defendant owners, as defined by the applicable statutes and ordinances.
