The Court being fully advised of the premises of this proceeding and having hear! the evidence finds that:

1. The Court has jurisdiction of the parties hereto and the subject matter, which is the premises located at the following address: 7140 S. YALE AVE., Chicago, Cook County, Illinois ("subject property"), legally described as:

- 3. The subject building is dangerous, unsafe and beyond reasonable repair under the terms of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-31-1 (1996) (Unsafe Buildings), in that:
  - a. The building is vacant.
  - b. The building's masonry has washed out mortar joints, step or stress fractures and missing siding.
  - c. Inc building's window glazing is broken or missing.
  - d. The o'nicling's window sashes are broken and missing and are therefore inoperable.
  - e. The building's oof is missing shingles.
  - f. The building's stair system has damaged decking, handrails, and headers.
  - g. Sections of the building's mooring are missing.
  - h. The building's joists are cracked
  - i. The building's plaster is broken or missing.
  - j. The building has no working mechanical systems, including electrical, plumbing, and heating.

- 4. There has been no work in progress since the beginning of this case at the subject property.
- 5. The Court finds that it would take major reconstruction of a responsible owner to bring the subject building into full compliance with the Municipal Code, and that the subject building is beyond reasonable repair. The Court further finds that demolition of the subject building is the least restrictive alternative available to effectively abate the conditions now existing there.

#### WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDFRED THAT:

- A. Judgment is entered in favor of Plantiff City of Chicago and against Defendants on Counts I and IV of the City's complaint seeking demolition authority.
- B. The remaining counts of the City's complaint are voluntarily withdrawn.
- C. Pursuant to the judgment entered above, 65 ILCS 3/11-31-1, and the City's police powers under Article VII of the Illinois Constitution, the City is granted authorization to demolish the building on the subject property, and is entitled to a lien for the costs of demolition, court costs, and other costs enumerated by statute, and/ or other statutory remedies.
- D. The authority granted in Paragraph C. above shall become effective 11/15/16
- E. The City's performance under this order will result in a statutory in rem lien that attaches only to the subject parcel of real estate. If the City seeks a personal judgment against any individual party to this action, it will proceed by separate motion directed to that party.
- F. Defendants with either possession or control of the subject property shall immediately remove any and all persons occupying the subject property and all personal property from said premises instanter so that said premises will be completely vacant and free of personal property before demolition is commenced. The City's Department of Human Services is authorized to assist in the relocation of any tenants.
- G. Pursuant to Illinois Supreme Court Rule 304(a), this is a final and appealable order and the Court finds that there is no just reason for delaying the enforcement or appeal of this order.
