Agreed Order of Settlement with Permanent Injunction

This case coming before the Court to approve the terms of this Agreed Order of Settlement with Permanent Injunction between the Plaintiff C tv of Chicago ("City"), and Defendant Isaias ("Defendant").

The parties wish to resolve this case without a trial, and have read and voluntarily agreed to the terms of this Order. The Court makes the following findings of fact and lew, and orders Defendant to comply with each of the terms stated in this Order:

1. The Court has in personam jurisdiction over the parties and in rem jurisdiction over the property commonly known as 4636 S. Winchester Avenue, Chicago, Illinois ("the subject property"), and legally described as: 3851 W. 6242,

LOT 22 AND WEST 4 FEET OF LOT 21 IN BLOCK 8 IN JOHN F. EBERHART'S SUBDIVISION OF SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 14, TOWNSHIP 38 NORTH, RANGE 13, EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, IN COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

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- 2. The subject property contains a one-story, masonry single family residence with a basement ("subject building). The subject property's lot area is approximately 3,480 square feet, and is located in an RS-2 Residential District.
- 3. Defendant Isaias Herrera was the record owner of the subject property having obtained title Administrator's Deed on October 14, 2015 and recorded as document number 1530022022 on October 27, 2015
- 4. The City alleges in its Complaint for Equitable and Other Relief that beginning on or about May 17, 2016, the subject property contained a second dwelling unit in the basement in an RS2 District, in violation of Title 17 (the "Zoning Ordinance") and various other provisions of the Municipal Code of Chicago.
- Defend agrees to plead liable to all Counts of the City's Complaint. Judgment is entered in favor of the City on each of these counts and Defendant agrees to reimburse the City for the City's litigation costs in the amount of \$130.00 and court costs of \$60.00. Payment of the \$190.00 shall be made by certified check or money order payable to the "City of Chicago," and delivered by hand delivery or U.S. Mail to Kimberly White at 30 North LaSalle St., Suite 700, Chicago, Illinois, 60602 no later than September 30, 2016: 19/1/2016.
- 6. Defendant further agrees to incentry of a permanent injunction enjoining him, his successors, heirs, assignees, age its, end/or other person(s) working in concert with him or under his control, from maintaining a separate dwelling unit (as defined under Municipal Code of Chicago Section 17-17-0248) in the basement of the subject building. As part of this injunction, Defendant also agrees not to maintain the more than one dwelling unit in the subject building. The property has been deconverted in accordance with permit No. 100/251036, asked 7-20-16.
- 7. The parties subject to this Agreed Order shall allow City inspectors access to the full interior of the subject building for periodic inspection, to be conducted during regular business hours (Monday through Friday) to determine compliance, and continued compliance, with the terms of this Agreed Order and the Municipal Code of Chicago. If City inspectors are unable to gain access to the full interior of the subject building during any inspection, Defendant, or any other party subject to this Order, shall contact the City's attorney to schedule an immediate reinspection.
- 8. The Court shall retain jurisdiction of the injunctive portions of this Agreed Order solely for the purposes of enforcement or modification of the injunctions, upon proper motion. The Court shall retain jurisdiction of all other portions of this Agreed Order solely for the purpose of enforcement of the terms of this Agreed Order.
- 9. A violation of any of this Order's provisions shall result in:
 - a. A fine to the City in the amount of \$500.00 to \$1,000.00 per day of violation; and

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- Upon petition by the City, a hearing as to why Defendant, or any other party b. subject to this Agreed Order, should not be held in contempt of court for violation of this Order.
- 10. This is a final order and the Court finds no just reason for delaying enforcement. All parties waive their right to appeal this Order.
- 11. This case is taken off the Court's call.
