The Remedial Action Completion Report (received July 26, 2018/Log No. 18-67513), as prepared by APTIM Environmental & Infrastructures, Inc. for the above referenced Remediation Site, has been reviewed and approved by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency ("Illinois EPA"). This Report demonstrates the remediation objectives approved for the site, in accordance with 35 Illinois Administrative Code Part 742 are above the existing concentrations of regulated substances and the remedial action was completed in accordance with the Remedial Action Plan (received January 5, 2017/Log No. 17-63755) and 35 Illinois Administrative Code Part 740.

The Remediation Site, consisting of 0.32 acres, is located at 5 West Palatine Road, Palatine, Illinois. Pursuant to Section 58.10 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act ("Act") (415 ILCS 5/1 et seq.), your request for a no further remediation determination is granted under the conditions and terms specified in this letter. The Remediation Applicant, as identified on the Illinois EPA's Site Remediation Program DRM-1 Form (received December 24, 2013/Log No. 13-55589), is Village of Palatine.

This comprehensive No Further Remediation Letter ("Letter") signifies a release from further responsibilities under the Act for the performance of the approved remedial action. This Letter shall be considered prima facie evidence that the Remediation Site described in the attached Illinois EPA Site Remediation Program Environmental Notice and shown in the attached Site Base Map does not constitute a threat to human health and the environment and does not require further remediation under the Act if utilized in accordance with the terms of this Letter.

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Conditions and Terms of Approval

Level of Remediation and Land Use Limitations

- 1) The Remediation Site is approved for Residential and/or Industrial/Commercial land use.
- 2) The land use specified in this Letter may be revised if:
 - a) Further investigation or remedial action has been conducted that documents the attainment of objectives appropriate for the new land use; and
 - b) A new Letter is obtained and recorded in accordance with Title XVII of the Act and regulations adopted thereunder.

Preventive, Engineering, and Institutional Controls

The implementation and maintenance of the following controls are required as part of the approval of the remediation objectives for this Remediation Site.

The highway owner also agrees that the contaminated groundwater shall not be utilized as a potable or other domestic supply water.
- 4) Whereas the owner/operator is also the Highway Authority, the Illinois EPA agrees, through the use of a Highway Authority Agreement-Memorandum of Agreement (MOA), to allow contaminated groundwater and/or soils to remain beneath its highway right-of-way under Plum Grove Road to the East of the site located at 5 West Palatine Road, Palatine, Illinois. - iv) Violation of the terms and conditions of this No Further Remediation letter.

- 6) Where a groundwater ordinance is used to assure long-term protection of human health (as identified under Paragraph 5 of this Letter), the Remediation Applicant must record a copy of the groundwater ordinance adopted and administered by a unit of local government along with this Letter.

This certification, by original signature of each property owner, or the authorized agent of the owner(s), of the Remediation Site or any portion thereof wlo is not a Remediation Applicant shall be recorded along with this Letter.



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ORDINANCE NO. <u>0-133-14</u>

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE OF GROUNDWATER AS A POTABLE WATER SUPPLY WELLS OR BY ANY OTHER METHOD IN A LIMITED AREA OF PALATINE AS DEPICTED IN EXHIBIT A TO THIS ORDINANCE

Published in pamphlet form by authority of the Mayor and Village Council of the Village of Palatine on October 13, 2014

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ORDINANCE NUMBER	0-133-14
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AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE OF GROUNDWATER AS A POTABLE WATER SUPPLY BY THE INSTALLATION OR USE OF POTABLE WATER SUPPLY WELLS OR BY ANY OTHER METHOD IN A LIMITED AREA OF PALATINE AS DEPICTED IN EXHIBIT A TO THIS ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, certain properties in the Village of Palatine, Illinois have been used over a period of time for commercial or industrial purposes; and

WITEREAS, because of said use, concentrations of certain chemical constituents in the groundwater remeath the Village may exceed Class I groundwater quality standards for potable resource groundwater as set forth in 35 Illinois Administrative Code 620 or Tier 1 remediation objectives as set forth in 35 Illinois Administrative Code 742; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Palatine desires to limit potential threats to human health from groundwater contamination while facilitating the redevelopment and productive use of properties that are the source of said chemical constituents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALATINE, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

Section One: Use of groundwater as a potable water supply in the shaded area depicted on Exhibit A attached hereto prohibited.

Except for such uses or methods in existence before the effective date of this ordinance, the use or attempt to use as a potable water supply groundwater from within that area at and adjacent to 5 West Palatine Road. Palatine, IL as depicted on Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof by the installation of drilling of wells or by any other method is hereby prohibited, expressly including points of withdrawal by the Village of Palatine.

Section Two: Penalties.

Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of up to \$750 for each violation.

Section Three: Definitions.

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"Person" is any individual, partnership, co-partnership, firm, company, limited liability company, corporation, association, joint stock company, trust, estate, political subdivision, or any other legal entity, or their legal representatives, agents or assigns.

"Potable water" is any water used for human or domestic consumption, including, but not limited to, water used for drinking, bathing, swimming, washing dishes, or preparing foods.

Section Four: Repealer.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repeated insofar as they are in conflict with this ordinance.

Section Five: Several lity.

If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or under any circumstances is adjurged invalid, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or of any portion not adjudged invalid.



HIGHWAY AUTHORITY AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into this 25th day of November, 2015 pursuant to 35 III.

Adm. Code 742.1020 by and between the Village of Palatine "Owner/Operator" and Illinois Department of Transportation "Highway Authority," collectively known as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, Village of Palatine is the owner or operator of one or more leaking underground storage tanks presently or formerly located at 5 West Palatine Road in Palatine of Cook County, Illinois 60067("the Site");

WHERFAS, as a result of one or more releases of contaminants from the above referenced underground sto age tanks "the Release(s)", soil and/or groundwater contamination at the Site exceeds the Tier 1 residential remediation objectives of 35 III. Adm. Code 742;

WHEREAS, the soil and/or groundwater contamination exceeding Tier 1 residential remediation objectives extends or may extend into the Highway Authority's right-of-way;

WHEREAS, the Owner/Operator is conducting corrective action in response to the Release(s);

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to prevent groundwater beneath the Highway Authority's right-of-way that exceeds Tier 1 remediation objectives from use as a supply of potable or domestic water and to limit access to soil within the right-of-way 'nat exceeds Tier 1 residential remediation objectives so that human health and the environment are protected during and after any access;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1: The recitals set forth above are incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.
- 2. The Illinois Emergency Management Agency has assigned incident number(s) 950010 and 20111144 to the Release(s).
- 3. Attached as Exhibit A is a scaled map(s) prepared by the Owner, Operator that shows the Site and surrounding area and delineates the current and estimated future exten, of soil and groundwater contamination above the applicable Tier 1 residential remediation objectives as a result of the Release(s).
- 4. Attached as Exhibit B is a table(s) prepared by the Owner/Operator that lists eac' i contaminant of concern that exceeds its Tier 1 residential remediation objective, its Tier 1 residential remediation objective and its concentrations within the zone where Tier 1 residential remediation coincitives are exceeded. The locations of the concentrations listed in Exhibit B are identified on the map(s) in Exhibit A.
- 5. Attached as Exhibit C is a scaled map prepared by the Owner/Operator showing the area of the Highway Authority's right-of-way that is governed by this agreement ("Right-of-Way"). Because Exhibit C is not a surveyed plat, the Right-of-Way boundary may be an approximation of the actual Right-of-Way lines.
- 6. The Highway Authority stipulates it has jurisdiction over the Right-of-Way that gives it sole control over the use of the groundwater and access to the soil located within or beneath the Right-of-Way.
- 7. The Highway Authority agrees to prohibit within the Right-of-Way all potable and domestic uses of groundwater exceeding Tier 1 residential remediation objectives.

8. The Highway Authority further agrees to limit access by itself and others to soil within the Right-of-Way exceeding Tier 1 residential remediation objectives. Access shall be allowed only if human health (including worker safety) and the environment are protected during and after any access. The Highway Authority may construct, reconstruct, improve, repair, maintain and operate a highway upon the Right-of-Way, or allow others to do the same by permit. In addition, the Highway Authority and others using or working in the Right-of-Way under permit have the right to remove soil or groundwater from the Right-of-Way and dispose of the same in accordance with applicable environmental laws and regulations. The Highway Authority agrees to issue all permits for work in the Right-of-Way, and make all existing permits for work in the Right-of-Way, subject to the following or a substantially similar condition:

As a condition of this permit the permittee shall request the office issuing this permit to identify sites in the Right-of-Way where a Highway Authority Agreement governs access to soil that exceeds the Tier 1 residential remediation objectives of 35 III. Adm. Code 742. The permittee shall take all measures necessary to protect human health (including worker safety) and the environment during and after any access to such soil.

- 9. This agreement shall be referenced in the Agency's no further remediation determination issued for the Release(s).
- 10. The Agency shall be notified of any transfer of jurisdiction over the Right-of-Way at least 30 days prior to the date the transfer takes affect. This agreement shall be null and void upon the transfer unless the transferee agrees to be bound by this agreement as if the transferee were an original party to this agreement. The transferee's agreement to be bound by the terms of this agreement shall be memorialized at the time of transfer in a writing ("Rider") that references this Highway Authority Agreement and is signed by the Highway Authority, or subsequent transferor, and the transferee.
- 11. This agreement shall become effective as a Highway Authority Agreement on the date the Agency issues a no further remediation determination for the Releastics). It shall remain effective as a Highway Authority Agreement until the Right-of-Way is demonstrated to be suitable for unrestricted use and the Agency issues a new no further remediation determination to reflect there is no longer a need for this agreement, or until the agreement is otherwise terminated or voided.
- 12. In addition to any other remedies that may be available, the Agency may bying suit to enforce the terms of this agreement or may, in its sole discretion, declare this agreement rull and void if any of the Parties or any transferee violates any term of this agreement. The Parties or transferee shall be notified in writing of any such declaration.
- 13. This agreement shall be null and void as a Highway Authority Agreement if a court of competent jurisdiction strikes down any part or provision of the agreement.
- 14. This agreement supersedes any prior written or oral agreements or understandings between the Parties on the subject matter addressed herein. It may be altered, modified or amended only upon the written consent and agreement of the Parties.

Prior to execution by the undersigned representative of the Department this Agreement constitutes an offer by Owner/Operator. The duly authorized representatives of Owner/Operator have signed this Agreement and this Agreement is binding upon them, their successors and assigns.
- 17. The IEPA and Illinois Attorney General "AG" must review and approve this Agreement, and this Agreement shall be referenced in the IEFA's "No Further Remediation" determination in the chain of title for the Site in the county where the Site is located. This Agreement shall be null and void as a Highway Authority Agreement should the IEPA or AB not approve it or should it not be referenced in the "No Further Remediation" determination, provided however, that this Agreement shall be effective between the Owner/Operator and the Department immediately upon signature by their representatives.
- 18. The Owner/Operator agrees to defend, indemnify and hold barmless the Department, and other highway authorities, if any, maintaining the highway Right-of-Way by an agreement with the Department, and the Department's agents, contractors or employees for all obligations asserted against or costs incurred by them, including reasonable attorney's fees and court costs, associated with the release of Contaminants from the Site, regardless whether said obligations or costs were caused by the negligence, but not the gross negligence, of them.
- 19. As an additional consideration, Owner/Operator agrees to reimburse the Department for reasonable costs to protect human health and the environment, including, but not limited to, identifying, investigating, handling, storing and disposing of contaminated soil and/or groundwater in the Right-of-Way as a result of the release of contaminants at this Site. It has been determined that the Department has incurred \$16,782.53 (Sixteen Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty-Two Dollars and Fifty-Three Cents) in reimbursable costs at the time this Agreement is executed by the undersigned representative of the Department. If future costs are incurred, a cashier's check made payable to "Treasurer, State of Illinois" shall be tendered to the Department of Transportation upon demand by the Department.
- 20. Violation of the terms of this Agreement by Owner/Operator, or their successors in interest, may be grounds for voidance of this Agreement as a Highway Authority Agreement. Violation of the terms of this Agreement by the Department will not void this Agreement, unless the IEPA has determined that the violation is grounds for voiding this Agreement as a Highway Authority Agreement and the Department has not cured the violation within such time as IEPA has granted to cure the violation.

- 21. This Agreement is in settlement of claims the Department may have arising from the release of Contaminants into the Right-of-Way associated with IEMA incident numbers 950010 and 20111144.
- 22. Prior to accessing or granting access to the soil as provided in Paragraph 8 herein, the Department will first give Owner/Operator written notice, unless there is an immediate threat to the health or safety to any individual or to the public, that it intends to perform a site investigation in the Right-of-Way and remove or dispose of contaminated soil or groundwater to the extent necessary for its work. Failure to give notice is not a violation of this Agreement. The removal or disposal shall be based upon the site investigation (which may be modified by field conditions during excavation). A copy of the site investigation report will be provided to Owner/Operator. If practicable, as reasonably determined by the Department, the Department may provide Owner/Operator with an opportunity to perform thr. Site investigation and to remove and dispose of the contaminated soil and/or groundwater necessary for the Department's work in advance of that work.

The Owner/Operator shall reimburse the reasonable costs incurred by the Department to perform the site investigation and to dispose of any contaminated soil or groundwater, provided, however, that if notice to Owner/Operator has not been given and there was no immediate threat to health or safety, reimbursement for those costs shall be limited to \$10,000.00. There is a rebuttable presumption that the Contaminants found in the highway Right-of-Way arose from the release of Contaminants from the Site. Should Owner/Operator not reimburse the reasonable costs under the conditions set forth herein, this Agreement shall be null and void, at the Department's option, upon written notice to Owner/Operator by the Department that those costs have not been reimbursed. Owner/Operator may cure that problem within twenty working days by making payment, or may seek to enjoin that result.

- 23. The Department's sole responsibility under this Agreement with respect to others using the highway Right-of-Way under permit from the Department is to include the following, or similar language, in the future standard permit provisions and to make an effort to notify its current permit holders of the following:
 - As a condition of this permit the permittee shall request the office issuing this permit to identify sites in the Right-of-Way where a Highway Authority Agreement governs access to soil that exceeds the Tier 1 residential remediation objectives of 35 III. Adv. Code 742. The permittee shall take all measures necessary to protect human health (including worker safety) and the environment during and after any access to such soil.

Owner/Operator hereby releases the Department from liability for breach of this Agreement by others under permit and agrees to defend and indemnify the Department against claims that may arise from others under permit causing a breach of this Agreement. Owner/ Operator agrees that its personnel, if any, at the Site who are aware of this Agreement will notify anyone they know is excavating in the Right-of-Way about this Agreement.

24. Should the Department breach this Agreement, Owner/Operator's sole remedy is for an action for damages in the Illinois Court of Claims. Any and all claims for damages against the Department, its agents, contractors, employees or its successors in interest arising at any time for a breach of paragraphs 7 and 8 of this Agreement are limited to an aggregate maximum of \$20,000.00. No other breach by the Department, its agents, contractors, employees and its successors in interest of a provision of this Agreement is actionable in either law or equity by Owner/Operator against the Department or them and Owner/Operator hereby releases the Department, its agents, contractors, employees and its successors in interest for any cause of action it may have against them, other than as allowed in this paragraph, arising under this Agreement or environmental laws, regulations or common law governing the contaminated soil or groundwater in the highway Right-of-Way. Should the Department convey, vacate or transfer jurisdiction of that highway Right-of-Way, Owner/Operator

may pursue an action under this Agreement against the successors in interest, other than a State agency, in a court of law.

25. This Agreement is entered into by the Department in recognition of laws passed by the General Assembly and regulations adopted by the Pollution Control Board which encourage a tiered-approach to remediating environmental contamination. This Agreement is entered into by the Department in the spirit of those laws and under its right and obligations as a highway authority.

Should any provisions of this Agreement be struck down as beyond the authority of the Department, however, this Agreement shall be null and void.





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

The discovery of this tank crompts Change Order #9 in an amount not to exceed \$29,921, with funding available in the environmental escrow. Eligible costs will be submitted to IEPA for reimbursement.

In response to Councilman Millar, Barry confirmed that the entire area has not been tested for contaminants.

Village Manager Reid Ottesen said the environmental escrow will be needed for remediation, and TIF funds would cover any additional remediation if needed.

HIGHWAY AUTHORITY AGREEMENT MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Memorandum of Agreement is entered by and between the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency ("Agency") and Village of Palatine ("Highway Authority"), collectively known as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, the Highway Authority is the owner or operator of one or more leaking underground storage tanks presently or formerly located at 5 West Palatine Road, Palatine, Illinois 60067 ("the Site");

VALPEAS, as a result of one or more releases of contaminants from the above referenced underground storage tanks ("the Release(s)"), soil and/or groundwater contamination at in: Site exceeds the Tier 1 residential remediation objectives of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 742;

WHEREAS, the soil and/or groundwater contamination exceeding Tier 1 residential remediation objectives extends or may extend into the Highway Authority's right-of-way adjacent to the Site;

WHEREAS, the Highway Authority is conducting corrective action in response to the Release(s);

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to prevent groundwater beneath the Highway Authority's right-of-way that exceeds Tier 1 residential remediation objectives from use as a supply of potable or domestic water and to limit access to soil within the right-of-way that exceeds Tier 1 residential remediation objective, so that human health and the environment are protected during and after any access;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. The recitals set forth above are incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.
- 2. The Illinois Emergency Management Agency has assigned incident numbers 950010 and 20111144 to the Release(s).
- 3. Attached as Exhibit A is a scaled map(s) prepared by the Highway Authority that shows the Site and surrounding area and delineates the current and estimated future extent of soil and groundwater contamination above the applicable Tier 1 residential soil remediation objectives as a result of the Release(s).
- 4. Attached as Exhibit B is a table(s) prepared by the Highway Authority that lists each contaminant of concern that exceeds its Tier 1 residential

remediation objective, and its concentrations within the zone where Tier 1 residential remediation objectives are exceeded. The locations of the concentrations listed in Exhibit B are identified on the map(s) in Exhibit A.

- 5. Attached as Exhibit C is a scaled map prepared by the Highway Authority showing the area of the Highway Authority's right-of-way that is governed by this agreement ("Right-of-Way"). Because Exhibit C is not a surveyed plat, the Right-of-Way boundary may be an approximation of the actual Right-of-Way lines.
- The Highway Authority stipulates it has jurisdiction over the Right-of-Way that gives it sole control over the use of the groundwater and access to the soil located within or beneath the Right-of-Way.
- 7. The Highway Authority agrees to prohibit within the Right-of-Way all potable and domestic uses of groundwater exceeding Tier 1 residential remediation objectives.
- 8. The Highway Arthority further agrees to limit access by itself and others to soil within the right-of-Way exceeding Tier 1 residential remediation objectives. Access stall be allowed only if human health (including worker safety) and the environment are protected during and after any access. The Highway Authority may construct, reconstruct, improve, repair, maintain and operate a highway upon the Right-of-Way, or allow others to do the same by permit. In addition, the Highway Authority and others using or working in the Right-of-Way under permit have the right to remove soil or groundwater from the Right-of-Way and dispose of the same in accordance with applicable environmental laws and regulations. The Highway Authority agrees to issue all permits for work in the Right-of-Way, and make all existing permits for work in the Right-of-Way, subject to the following or a substantially similar condition:

As a condition of this permit the permittee shall request the office issuing this permit to identify sites in the Right-of-Way where a Highwey Authority Memorandum of Agreement governs access to soil that exceeds the Tier I residential remediation objectives of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 742. The permittee shall take all measures necessary to protect human health (including worker safety) and the environment during and after any access to such soil.

- 9. This agreement shall be referenced in the Agency's no further remediation determination issued for the Release(s).
- 10. The Agency shall be notified of any transfer of jurisdiction over the Rightof-Way at least 30 days prior to the date the transfer takes effect. This

agreement shall be null and void upon the transfer unless the transferee agrees to be bound by this agreement as if the transferee were an original party to this agreement. The transferee's agreement to be bound by the terms of this agreement shall be memorialized at the time of transfer in a writing ("Rider") that references this Highway Authority Memorandum of Agreement and is signed by the Highway Authority, or subsequent transferor, and the transferee.

- 11. This agreement shall become effective on the date the Agency issues a no further remediation determination for the Release(s). It shall remain effective until the Right-of-Way is demonstrated to be suitable for unrestricted use and the Agency issues a new no further remediation determination to reflect there is no longer a need for this agreement, or until the agreement is otherwise terminated or voided.
- 12. In addition to any other remedies that may be available, the Agency may bring suit to enforce the terms of this agreement or may, in its sole discretion, aeclare this agreement null and void if the Highway Authority or a transferee violates any term of this agreement. The Highway Authority or transferee shall be notified in writing of any such declaration.
- 13. This agreement shall by mull and void if a court of competent jurisdiction strikes down any part or provision of the agreement.
- 14. This agreement supersedes any prior written or oral agreements or understandings between the Parties on the subject matter addressed herein. It may be altered, modified or amended only upon the written consent and agreement of the Parties.


