THIS CAUSE coming to be heard on Plaintiff's Motion for Default and Judgment Against Defendant STEVEN PAIK, an individual, d/b/a MAYWOOD CLEANERS, the Plaintiff, PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, ex rel. Drycleaner Environmental Response Trust Fund Council of Illinois, appearing by and through its attorney, LISA MADIGAN, Attorney General of the State of Illinois, for the entry of an order of judgment by default against the Defendant, STEVEN PAIK, an individual, d/b/a MAYWOOD CLEANERS, due notice being given and the Court being duly advised in the premises therein does find:

The Defendant, STEVEN PAIK, an individual, d/b/a MAYWOOD CLEANERS, has violated Section 60(a) of the Drycleaner Environmental Response Trust Fund Act ("Act"), 415 ILCS 135/60(a) (2016), and Section 1500.30(a) of the Illinois Administrative Code, 35 Ill. Adm. Code 1500.30(a), from 2014 through the filing date of this Order, and the following relief is granted:

I. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

- 1. Upon the date of service of this Default Judgment Order on the Defendant, the Defendant shall cease operation of any and all drycleaning machines located at the drycleaning facility, identified as Maywood Cleaners, at 311 Madison Street, Maywood, Cook County, Illinois ("Facility").
- 2. Within 24 hours of the date of service of this Default Judgment Order on the Defendant, the Defendant shall post the following message on all public entrances to the Facility:

THIS DRYCLEANING FACILITY IS NOT LICENSED TO CONDUCT DRYCLEANING ACTIVITIES

Pursuant to a Court Order, this drycleaning facility is no longer able to dry clean materials on-site. No drycleaning activities shall occur on the premises until such time that the operator is fully licensed with the Drycleaner Environmental Response Trust Fund Council of Illinois. This drycleaning facility shall remain open to return any materials left here before June 19, 2017 and may continue to operate as a drop store after that date, if the operator so chooses.

- 3. Within ten (10) days of the date of service of this Default Judgment Order on the Defendant, the Defendant shall have any and all drycleaning machines located at the Facility professionally drained of all drycleaning solvent in accordance with any applicable regulations. This includes the following:
 - a. All solvent in the solvent tanks must be removed:
 - b. Filters must be removed, properly drained, and disposed of;
 - c. Any lines that may contain solvent must be drained; and
 - d. The residual solvent or other contaminants remaining in the dry leaning machine must be cleaned out and properly disposed of.

The removed drycleaning solvent shall immediately be disposed of at a facility properly licensed to accept such wastes.

4. Within fourteen (14) days after the drycleaning solvent is drained from the

Facility, the Defendant shall submit all invoices and receipts related to the draining and disposal of drycleaning solvent at the Facility to the Drycleaner Environmental Response Trust Fund Council of Illinois ("Council") at the following address:

- 5. Within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Default Judgment Order on the Defendant, the Defendant shall have any and all drycleaning machines located at the Facility professionally removed.
- 6. Withir, fourteen (14) days after the drycleaning machines are removed from the Facility, the Defendant shall submit all invoices and receipts related to the removal of the drycleaning machines at the Facility to the Council at the address listed in Paragraph 4, above.

II. : LICENSE FEE AND LATE PENALTY FEE PAYMENTS

- 1. Within ten (10) days of the date of service of this Default Judgment Order on the Defendant, the Defendant shall submit solvent purchase receipts and solvent purchase logs for the years 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016 to the Council at the address listed in Section 1.4, above.
- 2. Within fourteen (14) days of the date the Council informs the Defendant in writing of the appropriate license amounts as determined by Section 1500 30(c) of the Illinois Administrative Code, 35 Ill. Adm. Code 1500.30(c), the Defendant shall pay that amount to the Council as directed below.
- 3. Within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Default Judgment Order on the Defendant, the Defendant, pursuant to Section 69(b)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 135/69(b)(1) (2016), shall pay \$12,965 in penalty fees to the Council as directed below.
 - 4. Within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Default Judgment Order on

the Defendant, the Defendant, pursuant to Section 69(b)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 135/69(b)(1) (2016), shall pay \$545 in penalty fees for the year 2017 to the Council as directed below.
