

Excerpts From Internal Revenue Code

Sec. 6321. Lien For Taxes.

If any person liable to pay any tax neglects or refuses to say the same after demand, the amount (including any interest, additional amount, addition to tax, or assessable penalty, together with any costs that may accrue in addition thereto) shall be allen in favor of the United States upon all property and rights to property, whether real or personal, belonging to such person.

Sec. 6322. Period Of Lien.

Unless another data is specifically fixed by law, the iten imposed by section 6321 shell arise at the time the assessment is made and shall continue until the liability for the amount so assessed (or a judgment against the taxpayer arising out of such liability) is satisfied or becomes unenforceable by reason of lapse of time.

- Sec. 6323. Validity and Priority Against Certain Persons.
- (e) Purchaser's, Holders Of Security Interests, Mechanic's Lienors, And Judgment Lien Creditors. — The Iten Imposed by section 6321 shall not be valid as against any purchaser, holder of a security Interest, mechanic's flegol', or judgment lien creditor until notice thereof which meets the requirements of subsection (f) has been filed by the Secretary.
 - (n) Place For Filing Notice; Form.—
- (1) Place For Fuling The notice referred to in subsection (a) shall be filed -
 - (A) Under State Laws-
 - (i) Real Property: In the case of real property, in one office within the State (or the county or athor governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situated, and
 - (ii) Personal Property In the case of personal property, whether tangible or intangible, in one office within the State (or the county or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situated;
 - (B) With Clark Of District Court In the office of the clark of the United States district court for the judicial district in which the property subject to lien is altuated, whenever the Statu has not by lew designated one office which meets the requirements of authorizeraph (A), or
 - (C) With Recorder Of Deeds Of The District Of Columbia In the effice of the Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia of the preparty subject to the lien is situated in the District of Columbia.

(2) Situs Of Property Subject To Elen - For purposes of paragraphs (1) and (4), property shall be deemed to be situated -

(A) Real Property - in the case of real property, at its physical location; or

(B) Personal Property - In the case of personal property, nether tangible or intangible, at the residence of the taxonyer at the time the notice of lien is filled.

For purpoles of paragraph (2) (8), the residence of a corporation of partnership and if be deemed to be the place at which the principal executive ratios of the business is located, and the residence of a taxue residence is without the United States shall be deemed to have the District of Columbia.

(S) Form - The arm and content of the notice referred to in subsection, (a) whall be prescribed by the Secretary. Such notice shall be voted notwithstanding any either provision of law regarding the form or centent of a notice of lies.

- (g) Refiling Of Notice. For purposes of this section -
- (f) General Rule. Unless notice of lian is rafiled in the manner prescribed in paragraph (2) during the required rafiling period, such notice of lian shall be treated as filed in the date on which it is filed (in accordance with subsection (1)) after the expiration of such refiling period
- (2) Place For Filing. A notice of lien refilled during the required refilling period shall be effective only.

 - (i) such notice of lien is rati ed in the office in which the prior notice of lien was filed, and
 - (ii) In the case of real property, the fact of refilling its entered and recorded in an index to the extent required by subsection (f) (4), and
 - (B) in any case in which, 90 days or more prior to the date of a refilling of notice of lien under subparagraph (A), the

Secretary received written information (in the manner prescribed in regulations issued by the Secretary) concerning a change in the juxpayer's residence, if a notice of such lien is also filed in apportance with subsection (f) in the State in which such residence is located.

(3) Required Refling Period. — In the case of any notice of lien, the term "required refiling period" means—(A) the one-year period ending 30 days after the expiration of 6 years after the date of the assessment of the tax, and (B) the one-year period ending with the expiration of 6 years after the close of the preceding required refiling period for such notice of lies.

Sec. 6325. Release Of Lien Or Discharge Of Property.

- (a) Release Of Lien. Subject to such regulations as the Secretary may prescribe, the Secretary shall issue a certificate of release of any Lien imposed with respect to any liternal revenue tax not later than 30 days after the day on which.
- Liability Satisfied or Unenforcable The Secretary finds that the liability for the amount assessed, together with all distress in respect thereof, has been fully satisfied or has become legally unenforcable; or
- Bond Accepted. There is furnished to the Secretary and a control by him a bond that is conditioned upon the payment of the amount assaud, togother with all interest in respect thereof, within the time prescribed by law (including any axisosion in our uma), and that is in accordance with such requirements relating to terms, conditions, and form of the bond and surstless thereof, he may be specified by such regulations.

- (k) Disclosure of Certain Returns and Return Information For Tax Administration Purposes. —
- (2) Discinsure of amount of outstanding lien If a notice of tien has been fried pursuant to section \$323(f), the amount of the outstanding obligation secured by such lien may be disciosed to any person who furnishes satisfactory written evidence that he has a right in the property subject to such lien or intends to obtain a right in such property.
