JUDGMENT ORDER

This matter coming on to be heard on plaintiff's motion for default judgment pursuant to Bankruptcy Rule 7055 (Rule F.R.Civ.P.), and the court being fully advised;

FINDS that the defendant-debtor, James Reddie Womack, Jr., received \$1,316 in unemployment benefits, by his false representations that he was unemployed when, in fact, he was employed and earned wages for that same period of time, and the court further finds in favor of plaintiff and against the defendant-debtor on the allegations of fact presented at paragraph 1-12 of the adversary complaint to determine dischargeability of debt;

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the debt owed by the defendant-debtor to the plaintiff is not dischargeable as it is a "debt for obtaining money by false pretences, a false representation, or actual fraud," pursuant to Section 523(a)(2) of the Bankruptcy Code, and that the defendant-debtor is liable to plaintiff for the sum of \$1,215, and that judgment therefor plus costs of \$60.00 is entered in favor of plaintiff against debtor defendant all in the sum of \$1,275.00
