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ORDINANCE NO. 87-1-14B

AN ORDINANCE VACATING LYMAN AVENUE

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Rosemont, upon application by adjoining property owners, has determined that the vacation of Lyman Avenue, as depicted and legally described on Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof, is necessary and in the best interest of the general public and the citizens of the Village of Rosemont, and within the spirit and purpose of the River Road Redevelopment Plan and Project, as Amended; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Rosemont has determined that Lyman Avenue as depicted on Exhibit A is no longer necessary for the use or benefit of the general public and the citizens of the Village of Rosemont.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ROSEMONT, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1: Provided that the Village of Rosemont receives by February 2, 1987 the sum of \$292,524.37 (\$23,401.95 square feet x \$12.50 per square foot) Lyman Avenue as depicted and legally described on Exhibit A be and the same is hereby vacated and closed, subject to the provisions of this Ordinance, inasmuch as said area, is not required for public use and the public interest will be served by such vacation.

SECTION 2: The vacation of Lyman Avenue by this Ordinance shall have no effect upon existing utility lines, if any, within the area of such vacation.

SECTION 3: Provided the Village receives the timely payment referred to in Section 1 of this Ordinance the Mayor Pro Tem, Village Clerk, Village Engineer, village agents and attorneys are authorized and directed to perform any acts necessary to implement the vacation including the execution of the Plat of Vacation attach-

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ed hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A and recordation of a certified copy of this ordinance and Exhibit A with the Recorder of Deeds of Cook County, Illinois.

SECTION 4: This ordinance and each of its terms shall be the effective legislative act of a home rule municipality without regard to whether such ordinance should (a) contain terms contrary to the provisions of current or subsequent non-preemptive state law; or (b) legislate in a manner or regarding a matter not delegated to municipalities by state law. It is the intent of the corporate authorities of the Village of Rosemont that to the extent that the terms of this ordinance should be inconsistent with any non-preemptive state law, that this ordinance should supercede state law in that regard within its jurisdiction.

SECTION 5: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval but shall subsequently be published in pamphlet form as provided by law.
