Excerpts From Internal Revenue Code

Sec. 6321. Lien For Taxes

If any person liable to pay any tax neglects or refuses to pay the same after demand, the amount, including any interest additional amount, addition to tax, or penalties payable together with any costs that may accrue in addition thereto, shall be a lien in favor of the United States upon all property and rights to property, whether real or personal, belonging to such person.

Sec. 6322. Period of Lien.

Unless another date is specified by law, the lien imposed by section 6321 shall arise at the time the assessment is made and shall continue until the liability for the amount so assessed for a judgment against the taxpayer ending the or such additional extension or becomes unenforceable by reason of lapse of time.

Sec. 6323. Validity and Priority Against Certain Persons.

Purchasers, Holders Of Security Interests, Mechanic's Liens, And Judgment Lien Creditors. — The lien imposed by section 6321 shall not be valid as against any purchaser, holder of a security interest, mechanic's lien, or judgment lien creditor, until notice in writing which meets the requirements of subsection (b) has been filed by the Secretary.

Protection For Certain Interests Even Though Notice Filed. — Even though notice of a lien imposed by section 6321 has been filed, such lien shall not be valid:

(a) Place For Filing Notice; Form. —

(1) Place For Filing. — The notice referred to in subsection (a) shall be filed—

(A) Under State Law—

(i) Real Property. — In the case of real property, in the office within the State for the county, or other governmental subdivision, as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situated; and

(ii) Personal Property. — In the case of personal property, whether tangible or intangible, in the office within the State for the county, or other governmental subdivision, as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situated;

(B) With Clerk Of District Court. — In the office of the clerk of the United States district court for the district in which the property subject to the lien is situated, whenever the State has not or is designated an office

which meets the requirements of subparagraph (A); or

(2) With Recorder Of Deeds Of The District Of Columbia. — In the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia, if the property subject to the lien is situated in the District of Columbia.

(b) Form. — (1) Property Subject To Lien. — For purposes of this section, property shall be deemed to be situated in the State in which the real property, or in the case of real property, of its principal center of

(2) Personal Property. — In the case of personal property, whether tangible or intangible, at the residence of the taxpayer, if the lien is filed in the office of the Secretary of the District of Columbia; or (B) the residence of a corporation or partnership shall be deemed to be the office at which the principal executive office of the business is located, and the residence of a taxpayer whose residence is within the United States shall be deemed to be in the District of Columbia.

(3) Form. — The form and content of the notice referred to in subsection (a) shall be prescribed by the Secretary. Such notice shall be void if, notwithstanding any other provision of law regarding the form or content of a notice of lien.

(c) Refiling Of Notice. — For purposes of this section—

(1) General Rule. — Unless notice of lien is retiled in the manner prescribed in paragraph (2), during the required refiling period, such notice of lien shall be treated as filed on the date on which it is filed (in accordance with subsection (a)) after the expiration of such refiling period.

(2) Place For Filing. — A notice of lien retiled during the required refiling period shall be effective only—

(A) if—

(i) such notice of lien is retiled in the office in which the first notice of lien was filed; and

(ii) in the case of real property, the fact of refiling is entered and recorded in an index in the office required by subsection (a)(1); and

(B) in any case in which 30 days or more prior to the date of a refiling of notice of lien under subparagraph (A) the Secretary received written information (in the manner prescribed in regulations issued by the Secretary) concerning a change in the taxpayer's residence if a notice of such lien is also filed in accordance with subsection (a) in the State in which such residence is located.

(d) Required Refiling Period. — In the case of any notice of lien, the term "required refiling period" means—

(A) the one-year period ending 30 days after the expiration of 6 years after the date of the assessment of the tax, and

(B) the one-year period ending with the expiration of 6 years after the close of the preceding taxable year, except for each series of tax.

Sec. 6325. Release Of Lien Or Discharge Of Property.

(a) Release Of Lien. — Subject to such regulations as the Secretary may prescribe, the Secretary may issue a certificate of release of any lien imposed with respect to any internal revenue tax if—

(1) Liability Satisfied or Unenforceable. — The Secretary finds that the liability for the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, has been fully satisfied or has become legally unenforceable; or

(2) Bond Accepted. — There is furnished to the Secretary and accepted by him a bond that is conditioned upon the payment of the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, within the time prescribed by law (including any extension of such time), and that it is in accordance with such requirements relating to terms, conditions, and form of the bond and sureties thereon, as may be specified in such regulations.

Sec. 6103. Confidentiality and Disclosure of Returns and Return Information.

(a) Disclosure Of Certain Returns and Return Information For Tax Administration Purposes. —

(2) Disclosure of amount of outstanding lien. — If a notice of lien has been filed pursuant to section 6321, the amount of the outstanding obligation secured by such lien may be disclosed to any person who furnishes satisfactory written evidence that he has a right in the property subject to such lien or intends to obtain a right in such property.
