Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the purposes of the corporation are exclusively charitable, and the organization shall not engage in any activities expressly prohibited by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended from time to time.

Said corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Fourth hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal Revenue Law).

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Trustees shall, after paying or making provision of the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the Revenue Law), as the board of Trustees shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

The corporation shall not, however, engage in the business of accepting and executing trusts as provided for in "An Act to provide for the regulate the administration of trusts by trust companies", approved June 15, 1887, as now or hereinafter amended and regulations promulgated thereunder.
