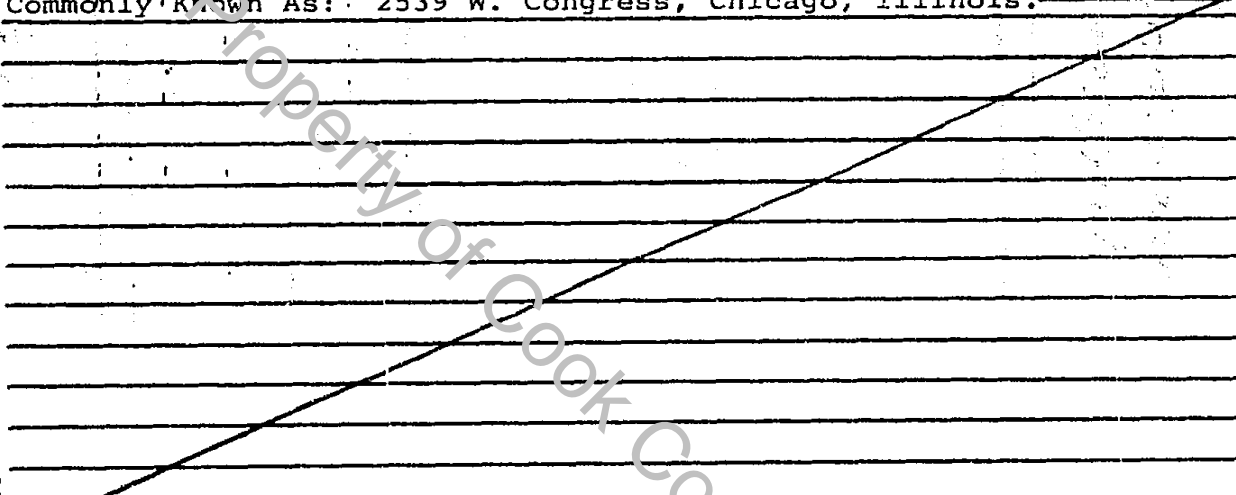

Irving Park Road, Chicago, Illinois 60634 his (her or their) heirs and assigns FOREVER, the said Real Estate hereinabove described.

The following provisions of the Revised Statutes of the State of Illinois, being Paragraph 752 of Chapter 120 is recited, pursuant to law:

"Unless the holder of the certificate for real estate purchased at any tax sale under this Act takes out the deed in the time provided by law, and files the same for record within one year from and after the time for redemption expires, the certificate or deed, and the sale on which it is based, shall, from and after the expiration of such one year, be absolutely null and void with no right to reimbursement. If the holder of such certificate is prevented from obtaining such deed by injunction or order of any court, or by the refusal or inability of any court to act upon the application for a tax deed, or by the refusal of the clerk to execute the same, the time he or she is so prevented shall be excluded from computation of such time."
