

Excerpts From Internal Revenue Code

Sec. 6321. Lien For Taxes

If any person listile to pay any tax neglects or refuses to pay the same effect demand, the amount finduding any interest senditional amount, addition to tax, or assessable penalty. Together, with any costs that may accrue in addition thereto, shall be a lien in layor of the United States upon 39 property and rights to prodomy whether real or personal, belonging to such person.

Sec. 6322. Period Of Lien.

Unless another data is specifically fixed by law, the lien imposed by section 6321 shall arise at the time the lassessment is made and shall continue until the habitity for the amount so assessed (or a judgment against the taxpayer artising out of such liability) is settified or becomes unenforceable by reason of lapse of time.

Sec. 6323. Validity and Priority Against Certain Persons.

(a) Purchaser's, Holders Of Security Interests, Mechanic's Lienors, And Judgment Lien Creditors.—The lien Impos-

ad by section 6321 shall not be valid as against any purchaser, nolder of a security interest, mechanit's lishor, or judyment lian creditor until notice thereof which meets the requirements of subsection (f) has been filled by the Secretary.

## m Place For Filing Notice; Form.-

 Place For Filing - The notice referred to in subsection (a) shall be filed-

(A) Under State Laws

(i) Real Property - In the case of real property, in one office within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the taws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situated; and

(ii) Personal Property-In the case of personal property, whether tangible or intengible, in one office within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situated; except that State law merely conforming to reenacting Federal law establishing a national filing system does not constitute a second office for fitting as designated by the taws of such State, or

(3) With Clark Of District Court-in the office of the clark of the United States district court for the judicial district in which the property subject to lien is situated, whenever the State has not by law designated one office which meets the requirements of subgeragranh (A), or

requirements of subparagraph (A), or (C) WAN Recorder Of Deeds Of The District Of Columbia - In the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia, if the property subject to the lien is situated in the District of Columbia.

(2) Situs Of Property Subject To Lien - For purposes of paragraphis (1) and (4), property shall be deemed to be situated. (A) Real Property - in the case of real property, at its physical location; or

(1) Personal Property-in the case of personal property, whether tangible or intangible, at the residence of the taxpayer at the tim, the riouse of lien is field.

For numbers of paragraph (2) (B), the residence of a corporation or partnership shall be deemed to be the place at which the principal executive office of the business is located, and the residence of a "ur ayer whose residence is without the United States shall be use med to be in the District of Columbia.

(3) Form - The loin also content of the notice referred to in subsection (a) shall be prescribed by the Secretary. Such notice shall be valid notwing at fing any other provision of law regarding the term or contact of a notice of tien.

(g) Refilling Of Notice.—For purposes of this section-

(1) **General Rule.**—Unless notice of lien is reflied in the manner prescribed in paragraph (2) during the required refliing period, such notice of lien shall be treated as filed on the date on which it is filed (in accordance with subsection (f) after the expiration of such refliing period.

(2) Place For Filing.—A notice of lies refiled during the required refiling period shall be effective only-

(A) #-

(i) such notice of lien is reflied in the office in which the prior notice of lien was filed, and

(iii) in the case of real property, and the fact of retiling is entered and recorded in an index to the extent required by subsection (f) (4). and

(B) in any case in which, 90 days or more prior to the date of a refilling of notice of lien under subparagraph (A), the

Sec. 6325. Release Of Lien O Discharge Of Property

(a) Release Of Lien.—Subject to such region lations as the Secretary may prescribe, the Secretary shall issue a certificate of telease of any lien imposed with respect to any laternal revenue tax not lister than 30 days after the earn which.

(1) Liability Satisfied or Unanforceable - The secretary finds that the liability for the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, has been fully satisfied enas become legally unenforceable; or

Sec. 6103. Confidentiality and Disclosure of Aeturns and Return Information

(a) Disclosure of Certain Return and Return information For Tax Administration Purposes.—

(2) Disclosure of amount of outstanding lien. If notice of lien has been filed pursuant to section 6323(f), she amount of the outstanding obligation secured by such lies may be disclosed to any person who turnishes selected written evidence that he has a right in the property subject, such lien or intends to obtain a right in such property.
