

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Excerpts From Internal Revenue Code

Sec. 6321. Lien For Taxes

If any person liable to pay any tax neglects or refuses to pay the same after demand, the amount (including any interest, additional amount, addition to tax, or assessable penalty, together with any costs that may accrue in addition thereto) shall be a sen in favor of the United States upon all property and rights to property, whether real or personal, belonging to such person.

Sec. 6322. Period Of Lien.

Unless another date is specifically fixed by law, the lien imposed by section 8321 shall arise at the time the assessment is made and shall continue until the liability for the amount so assessed (or a judgment against the taxpayer arising out of such [Rability) is satisfied or becomes unenforceable by reason of lapse of time.

Sec. 6323. Validity and Priority Against Certain Persons.

(a) Purchaser's, Holders Of Security Interests, Mechanic's Lienors, And Judgment Lien Creditors,—The lien imposed by section 3321 shall not be valid as against any purchaser, holder of a security interest, mechanic's lienor, or judgment lien creditor until notice thereof which meets the requirements of subsection (f) has been filled by the Secretary.

in Place For Filling Notice; Form. -

(1) Place for Filing - The notice reterred to in subsection (s) shall be filed -

(A) Under State Lews

(f) Rest Property - In the case of real property, in one a office within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situated; and

(ii) Personal Property In the case of personal property, whether tangible or intangible in one office within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is attuated; or

(B) With Clerk Of District Court-in the office of the clerk of the United States district court for the judicial district in which the property subject to fien is situated, whenever the State has not by law designated one office which meets the requirements of subparagraph (A), or

(C) With Recorder Of Deeds Of The District Of Columbiath the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia, if the property subject to the lien is altuated in the District of

Columbia.

(2) Situs Of Property Subject To Lien - For purposes of paragraphs (1) and (4), property shall be deemed to be situated -

(A) Real Property - In the case of real property, at its physical location; or

(B) Personal Property - In the case of personal property, whither tangible or intangible, ct the residence of the taxpays, at the time the notice of lian is filed.

For purposes of paragraph (2) (B), the residence of a corporation or partnirship shall be deemed to be the place at which the principal excession, office of the business is located, and the residence of a turnary whose residence is without the United States shall be to mad to be in the District of Columbia.

(3) Form - This form and content of the notice referred to in subsection (a) shall be priscribed by the Secretary. Such notice shall be valid not withstanding any other provision of law regarding the form or content of a notice of item.

- (g) Refiling Of Notice. For purposes of this section :
- (1) General Rule, —Unless notice of lien is reflied in the manner prescribed in paragraph (2) during the required refiling period, such notice of lien shall be treated as filed on the date on which it is filed (in accordance with subsection (f)) after the expiration of such refilling period.
- (2) Place For Filling.—A notice of ilen refiled during the required refiling period shall be effective only.

(A) if

- (i) such notice of lien is refilled in the office in which the prior notice of lien was filed, and
- (ii) in the case of real property, the fact of refilling is entered and recorded in an index to the extent required by subsection (f) (4), and
- (B) in any case in which, 90 days or more prior to the date of a reffling of notice of lien under subparagraph (A), the

Georetary received written information (in the manner prescribed in regulations issued by the Secretary) concerning a change in the tax payer's residence, if a notice of such iten is also field in accordance with subsection (f) in the State in which such residence is located.

(3) Required Refiling Period.—In the case of any notice of lien, the term 'required refiling period means.

(A) the one-year period ending 30 days after the expiration of 6 years after the date of the assessment of the tax, and (B) the one-year period ending with the expiration of 8 years after the close of the preceding required refiling period

for such notice of lien.

Sec. 6325. Release Of Lien Or Discharge Of Property.

- (a) Release Of Lien. Subject to such regulations as the Secretary may prescribe, the Secretary shall issue a certificate of release of any item imposed with respect to any internal revenue tax not later than 30 days after the day on which.
- (1) Liability Satisfied or Unenforceable. The Secretary finds that the liability for the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, has been fully satisfied or has become regally unenforceable, or
- (2) Bond Accepted-There is furnished to the Secretary and accepted by him a bond that is conditioned upon the payment of thi amount assessed, together with all interest in respect his and, within that time prescribed by law (including any extension of juch time), and that is in accordance with such requirements i valing to same, conditions, and form of the bond and sureties therein, is may be specified by such regulations.

- (k) Disclosure of Certain Returns and Return Information For Tax Administration Purposes.—
- (2) Disclosure of emount of outstanding fient if a notice of fier has been filed pursuant to section 6323(f), the amount of the outstanding obligation secured by such lien may be disclosed to any person who furnishes satisfactory written evidence that he has a right in the property subject to such fien or intends to obtain a right in such property.
