

Excerpts From Internal Revenue Cude

Sec. 6321. Lien For Taxes

If any person liable to pay any tax neglects or refuses to pay the same after demand, the amount uncluding any interest, additional amount, additional amount, additional amount, addition to tax, or assessable penalty, together with any costs that may accure in addition thereto) shall be after in favor of the United States upon all property and rights to property, whether real or personal, bolonging to such person.

Sec. 6322. Period Of Lien.

Unless another date is specifically fixed by law, the lien imposed by section 6321 shall arise at the time the assessment is made and shall continue until the liability for the amount so assessed (or a judgment against the taxpayer arising out of such flatly) is satisfied or becomes unenforceable by reason at lapse of time.

Sec. 6323. Validity and Priority Against Certain Persons.

(a) Purchaser's, Holders Of Security Interests, Mechanic's Lienors, And Judgment Lien Creditors.—The hen imposed by section 6321 shall not be valid as against any purchaser, holder of a security interest, mechanic's lienor, or judgment lien creditor until notice thereof which meets the requirements of subsection (f) has been filed by the Secretary.

n Place For Filling Notice; Form.—

(1) Place For Filing - The notice referred to in subsection (a) shall be filed -

(A) Under State Laws

(f) Real Property - In the case of real property, in one a office within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is affuated; and

(ii) Personal Property - In the case of personal property, whether langible or intangible, in one office within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property

subject to the lien is airuated; or

(B) With Clerk Of District Court in the office of the clark of the United States district court for the judicial district in which the property subject to flen is situated, whenever the State has not by law designated one office which meets the requirements of subparagraph (A), or

(C) With Recorder Of Deeds Of The District Of Columbia. In the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia, if the property subject to the lien is situated in the District of

Columbia

(2) Situs Of Property Subject To Lien - For purposes of paragraphs (1) and (4), property shall be deemed to be situated -

(A) Rep Property - In the case of real property, at its physical location, or

(B) Personal Property In the case of sensonal property, another tangible or intangicle, at the recisions of the tax-pay in at the time the notice of ten is fixed.

For jumpes of paragraph (2) (B), the residence of a corporation or par ners to shall be deemed to be the place at which the principal executive office of the business is located, and the residence of a far aver whose residence is without the United States shall be diemed to be in the Olstnot of Columbia.

- (g) Refilling Of Notice. For purposes of this
- (1) **General Rule.**—Uniess notice of lien is reflied in the manner prescribed in paragraph .2; during the required refling penod, such notice of lien shall be treated as filed on the date on which it is filed (in accordance with subsection (f)) after the expiration of such refiling period.
- (2) Place For Filling.—A notice of tien reflect during the required refilling period shall be effective only
 - (A) il-
 - (i) such notice of lien is ratifed in the office in which the prior notice of lien was filed, and
 - $^{(a)}$ in the case of real property, the fact of refilling is entered and recorded in an index to the extent required by subsection (I) (4), and
 - (B) in any case in which, 90 days or more prior to the data of a refiling of notice of lien under subparagraph (A), the

Secretary received written information (in the manner prescribed in regulations issued by the Secretary) concerning a change in the tarpayor's residence, if a notice of such lien is also filled in accommonce with subsection (f) in the State in which such residence is located.

(3) Required Refilling Period.—In the case of any notice of lien, the term 'required refilling period' means -

(A) the one-year period ending 30 days after the expiration of 6 years after the date of the assessment of the lax, and (B) the one-year period ending with the expiration of 6 years after the close of the preceding required refilling period for such notice of lien.

Sec. 6325. Release Of Lien Or Discharge Of Property.

(a) Release Of Lien. — Subject to such regulations as the Secretary may prescribe, the Secretary shall issue a certificate of release of any lien imposed with respect to any internal revenue tax not later than 30 days after the day on which.

(1) Liability Satisfied or Unenforceable - The Secretary finds that the liability for the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, has been fully satisfied or has become

logally unenforceable; or

(2) Bond Accepted There is lumished to the Secretary and to epited by him a bond that is conditioned upon the payment of the amount assessed, together with all Interest in respect there is, with in the time prescribed by law (including any extension of suc', time), and that is in accordance with such requirements relating to jumps, conditions, and form of the bond and sureties thereon as may be specified by such regulations.

Sec 3103. Confidentiality and Disclosure of Returns and Return Information.
