Excerpts From Internal Revenue Code

Sec. 6321. Lien For Taxes

If any person liable to pay any tax neglects or refuses to pay the same after demand, the amount (Including any interest, additional amount, addition to tax, or assessable penalty, together with any costs that may accrue in addition thereto) shall be a lien in tayor of the United States upon all property and rights to property, whether real or personal, belonging to such person.

Sec. 6322. Period Of Lien.

Unless another date is specifically fixed by law, the lien imposed by section 6321 shall arise at the time the assessment is made and shall continue until the liability for the amount so assessed (or a judgment against the taxpayer arising out of such fability) is satisfied or becomes unenforceable by reason of lapse of time.

Sec. 6323. Validity and Priority Against Certain Persons.

(a) Purchaser's, Holder's Of Security Interests, Mechanic's Lienors, And Judgment Lien Creditors.—The ion imposed by section 6321 shall not be valid as against any purchaser, holder of a security interest, mechanic's lenor, or judgment lien creditor until notice thereof which meets the requirements of subsection (f) has been filed by the Secretary.

## m Place For Filing Notice; Form.-

(t) Place For Filing - The notice referred to in subsection (a) shall be filed -

(A) Under State Laws

(f) Real Property • In the case of rest property, in one

office within the State (or the county, or other governmental
subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in
which the property subject to the fien is situated; and

(ii) Personal Property - In the case of personal property, whether tangible or Intangible, in one office within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situated; or

(B) With Clerk Of District Court-In the office of the clerk of the United States district court for the judicial district in which the properly subject to iten is situated, whenever the State has not by law designated one office which meets the requirements of subparagraph (A), or

(C) With Recorder Of Deeds Of The District Of Columbiain the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia, if the property subject to the Sen is situated in the District of

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(2) Situs Of Property Subject To Lien - For purposes of paragraph (1) and (4), property shall be deemed to be situated -

 (A) Feal Property - In the case of real property, at its physical location; or

(B) Fersonal Property - In the case of personal property, whether tangible or intangible, at the residence of the taxgayer at the time the notice of lien is filed,

For purposes of paragraph (2) (B), the residence of a corporation or partner hip: half be deemed to be the place at which the principal executive only e of the business is located, and the residence of a tarmy e whose residence is without the United States shall be dear ed to be in the District of Columbia.

(3) Form - The form and content of the notice referred to in subsection (a) shall to presurited by the Secretary, Such notice shall be valid notwith any other provision of law regarding the form or content of a notice of lien.

- (g) Refilling Of Notice. For purposes of this section -
- (1) **General Rule**, Unless notice of lien is reflied in the manner prescribed in paragraph (2) during the required refling period, such notice of lien shall be treated as filed on the date on which it is filed (in accordance with subsection (f)) after the expiration of such refliting period.
- (2) Place For Filling.—A notice of lien refited during the required refitting period shall be effective only

(A) H-

- (i) such notice of lien is refled in the office in which the orior notice of lien was filed, and
- (ii) in the case of real property, the fact of refiling is entared and recorded in an index to the extent required by subsection (f) (4), and
- (B) in any case in which, 90 days or more prior to the data of a refilling of notice of tien under subparagraph (A), the

Secretary received written information (in the manner prescribed in regulations issued by the Secretary) concerning a change in the taxosyer's residence, if a notice of such lien is also filled in accordance with subsection (i) in the State in which such residence is located.

(3) Required Refilling Period.—In the case of any notice of lien, the term "required refilling period" means.

(A) the one-year period ending 30 days after the expiration of 6 years after the dele of the assessment of the tax, and (B) the one-year period ending with the expiration of 6 years after the close of the praceding required retiling period for such notice of iten.

Sec. 6325. Release Of Lien Or Discharge Of Property.

(a) Release Of Lien. — Subject to such regulations as the Secretary may prescribe, the Secretary shall lasue a certificate of release of any lien imposed with respect to any internal revenue tax not later than 30 days after the day on which

(1) Liability Satisfied or Unanforceable - The Secretary finds that the liability for the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, has been fully satisfied or has become

egally unenforceable; or

(2) Bond Accepted-There is furnished to the Secretary and accorpind by him a bond that is conditioned upon the payment of the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, winn the time prescribed by law (including any extension of a ich time), and that is in accordance with such requirements relating to terms, conditions, and form of the bond and surelies thereon, as may be specified by such regulations.

(k) Disclosure of Certain Returns and Return Information For Tax Administration Purposes.—

(2) Disclosure of amount of outstanding item.-If a notice of lien has been filed pursuant to section 6323(f), the amount of the outstanding obligation secured by such lien may be disclosed to any person who furnishes satisfactory written evidence that he has a right in the property subject to such lien or intends to obtain a right in such property.
