

Notice of Federal Tax Lien Under Internal Revenue Laws

As provided by sections 6321, 6322, and 6323 of the Internal Revenue Code, notice is given that taxes (including interest and penalties) have been assessed against the following-named taxpayer. Demand for payment of this liability has been made, but it remains unpaid. Therefore, there is a lien in favor of the United States on all property and rights to property belonging to this taxpayer for the amount of these taxes, and additional penalties, interest, and costs that may accrue.					91156171

Excerpts From Internal Revenue Crue

Sec. 6321, Lien For Taxes

If any person liable to pay any tax neglects or refuses to pay the same after demand, the amount linctuding any interest, additional amount, addition to tax, or assessible penalty, together with any costs that may accrue in addition theretol shall be a feel in favor of the United States upon all property and rights to property, whether real or personal, belonging to such person

Sec. 6322. Period Of Lien.

Unless another date is specifically fixed by law, the lian Imposed by section 6321 shall arise at the time the assessment is made and shall continue until the liability for the amount so assessed (or a judgment against the taxpayer arising out of such liability) is satisfied or becomes unenforceable by reason of lapse of time.

Sec. 6323. Validity and Priority Against Certain Persons.

(a) Purchaser's, Holders Of Security Interests, Mechanic's Lienors, And Judgment Lien Creditors.—The lien imposed by section 6321 shall not be valid as against any purchaser, holder of a security interest, mechanic's lienor, or judgment lian creditor until notice thereof which meets the requirements of subsection (f) has been filed by the Secretary.

(1) Place For Filing Notice; Form .-

 Piace For Filing - The notice referred to in subsection (a) shall be filed -

(A) Under State Laws

(i) Reat Property. In the case of reat property, in one office within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situated; and

(ii) Personal Property - In the case of personal property, whether tangible or intangible, in one office within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situated; or

(B) With Clerk Of District Court-In the office of the clerk of the United States district court for the judicial district in which the property subject to item is shuated, whenever the State has not by law designated one office which meets the requirements of subparagraph (A), or

(C) With Recorder Of Deeds Of The District Of Columbia-In the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia, if the property subject to the flen is situated in the District of Columbia. (2) Situs Of Property Subject To Lien - For purposes of paragraphs (1) and (4), property shall be deemed to be situated -

(A) Real Property - in the case of real property, at its only size incoming or

(B) Fersonal Property (in the case of personal property, mether rangicle or intangible at the residence of the tax-

- (ii) General Rule, —Unless notice of lien is reflect in the manner preschood in paragraph (2) during the required refiling behald such notice of lien shall be treated as filled on the date on which it is filled in accordance with subsection (f)) after the expiration of such returns phonoid.

(3) Required Refiling Period.—In the case of any notice of lien, the term 'required refiling period' means.

(A) the one-year period ending 30 days after the expiration of 6 years after the date of the assessment of the tax, and (B) the one-year period ending with the expiration of 6 years after the close of the preceding required refiling period for such notice of lien.

Sec. 6325. Release Of Lien Or Discharge Of Property.

(a) Release Cif Lien. — Subject to such regulations as the Secretary may prescribe, the Secretary shall issue a certificate of release of any lien imposed with respect to any internal revenue tax not later than 30 days after the day on

(1) Elability Satisfield or Unenforceable - The Secretary finds that the liability for the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, has been fully satisfied or has become

legally unanioropable; or

(2) Bond Accepted. There is furnished to the Secretary and account by him a bond that is conditioned upon the payment of the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, within the time prescribed by the (including any extension of sign time), and that is in accordance with such regularments relating to their, conditions, and form of the bond and sureties thereon as fally be specified by such regulations.

Sec. 5:03. Confidentiality and Disclosure or Returns and Return Information.

(k) Disclosure of Certain Returns and Return Information For Tax Administration Purposes.—

(2) Disclosure of amount of outstanding liented a notice of tien has been filed pursuant to section 6323(f), the amount of the outstanding optigation secured by such lien may be disclosed to any person who furnishes satisfactory written evidence that he has a right in the property subject to such filen or intends to obtain a right in such property.
