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Excerpts From Internal Revenue Coda

Sec. 6321. Lien For Taxes

If any person liable to pay any tax neglects or refuses to pay the same after demand, the amount (including any interest. additional amount, addition to tax, or assessable penalty, together with any costs that may accrue in addition thereto; shall be a filen in fever of the United States upon all property and rights to property, whether real or personal, belonging to such person.

Sec. 6322. Period Of Lien.

Unless another date is specifically fixed by law, the lien imposed by section 8321 shall arise at the time the assessment is made and shall continue until the liability for the frount so assessed (or a judgment against the laxpayer arising out of such liability) is satisfied or becomes unenforceable by reason of lapse of time.

Sec. 6323. Validity and Priority Against Certain Persons.

(a) Purchaser's, Holders Of Security Interests, Mechanic's Lienors, And Judgment Lien Creditors.—The lien Imposed by section 6321 shall not be valid as against any purchaser, holder of a security interest, mechanic's liency or judgment lien creditor until notice thereof which meets the requireents of subsection (f) has been filed by the Secretary.

m Place For Filing Notice; Form.—

(1) Place For Filing - The notice referred to in subeaction (a) shall be filed-(A) Under State Laws

(I) Real Property - In the case of real property, in one office within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is siturated; and

(N) Personal Property-In the case of personal property, whether tangible or intangible, in one office within the State (or the county, or other governmental aubdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situated; except that State law merely conforming to resnacting Federal law establishing a national filling

system does not constitute a second office for filling as designated by the laws of such State; or (B) With Clark Of District Court-In the office of the clark of the United States district court for the judicial district in which the property subject to tien is situated, whenever the State has not by law designated one office which meets the

requirements of subparagraph (A), or (C) With Recorder Of Deeds Of The District Of Co-lumbia - in the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia, if the property subject to the lien is situated in the District of Columbia.

(2) Situs Of Property Subject To Lien - For purposes of paragraphs (1) and (4), property shall be deemed to be situated-(A) Real Property - In the case of real property, at its physical
