## Notice of Federal Tax Lien Under Internal Revenue Laws

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(NOTE: Certificate of officer authorized by law to take acknowledgments is not essential to the validity of Notice of Federal Tax lien Rev. Rul. 71-466, 1971 - 2 C.B. 409)

#### Excerpts From Internal Revenue Code

#### Sec. 6321. Lien For Taxes

If any person liable to pay any tax neglects or refuses to pa the same after demand, the amount (including any interest additional amount, addition to tax, or assessable ponalty together with any costs that may accrue in addition therefor shall be a lien in favor of the United States upon at property and rights to properly, whether real or personal, belonging to

### Sec. 6322. Period Of Lien.

Unless another date is specifically fixed by law, the lien Imposed by section 6321 shall arise at the time the assess-ment is made and shall continue until the lizbility for the amount so assessed (or a judgment against the taxpayer artaing out of such liability) is satisfied or necomes unenforceable by reason of lapse of time.

Sec. 6323, Validity and Priority Against Certain Persons.

(a) Purchaser's, Folders Of Security Interests, Mechanic's Llenors, And Judgment Lien Creditors,-The Hen Impos-

ed by section 6321 shall not be valid as against any purchaser, holder of a security interest, mechanic's lismo, or judy-mentillen creditor until notice thereof which meets the requirements of subsection (f) has been filed by the Secretary.

#### ρ Place For Filling Notice; Form.—

(1) Place For Filing . The notice referred to in subsection (a) shall be filed-

(A) Under State Laws

(i) Real Property - in the case of real property, in one office within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situtated; and

(ii) Personal Property-In the case of personal property, whether tangible or intengible, in one office within the State for the county, or other governmental within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is skualed; except that State law merely conforming to reenacting Federal law establishing a national filing system does not constitute a second office for filing

as designated by the laws of such State; or (B) With Clerk Of District Court-in the office of the clark of the United States district court for the judicial district in which the property subject to lien is situated, whenever the State has not by law designated one office which meets the

requirements of subparagraph (A), or (C) With Recorder Of Deeds Of The District Of Co-jumble - in the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia, if the property subject to the lien is situated in the District of Columbia.

(g) Refiling Of Notice.—For purposas of this

(1) General Rule. -- Unless notice of fien is refffed in the manner prescribed in paragraph (2) during the required refilling period, such notice of tian shall be treated as filed on the date on which it is filed (in accordance with subsection (f) after the expiration of such refiling period.

(2) Place For Filling .- A notice of tien refilled during the required refilling period shall be effective only-

(A) II-

(i) such notice of lien is relified in the office in which the prior notice of lien was filed, and

(3) Required Refiling Period.—In the case of any notice of flen, the term frequired refiling period

(B) the one-year period ending with the expiration of the years after the close of the preceding required refiling period for such notice of lien.

Sec. 6325. Release Of Lien Of Discharge Of Property

(a) Release Of Lien.—Subject to such regulations as the Secretary may preactibe, the Secretary shallsave a cartificate of release of any lien imposed with respec to any internal revenue tax not later than 30 days after the day

(1) Liability Satisfied or Unanforceable - The Secretary finds that the flability for the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, has been fully satisfied o

has become legally unenforceable; or

(2) Bond Accepted-There is furnished to the Secretary and accepted by him a bond that is conditioned upor the payment of the amount assessed, together with all interes thereof, within the time prescribed by law (including an extension of such time), and that is in accordance with such requirements relating to terms, conditions, and form of the bone and surelies thereon, as may be specified by such regulation.

(k) Disclosure of Certain Returns and Return information For Tax Administration Purposes.—

(2) Disclosure of amount of outstanding iten,-if a notice of lien has been filed pursuant to section 6323(f), the amount of the outstanding obligation secured by such lier may be disclosed to any person who furnishes estistation written evidence that he has a right in the property subject to such lien or intends to obtain a right in such property.
