The Land Office is a part of the State Department, and is under the control of the Governor. It is the duty of the Land Office to manage the State lands, and to sell them when necessary for the public use.

The State lands are divided into three classes: (1) lands acquired by purchase, (2) lands acquired by donation, and (3) lands acquired by escheat.

The County lands are divided into three classes: (1) lands acquired by purchase, (2) lands acquired by donation, and (3) lands acquired by escheat.

CHAPTER IV. LANDS BELONGING TO THE CITY.

The City lands are divided into three classes: (1) lands acquired by purchase, (2) lands acquired by donation, and (3) lands acquired by escheat.

CHAPTER V. LANDS BELONGING TO THE TOWNSHIP.

The Township lands are divided into three classes: (1) lands acquired by purchase, (2) lands acquired by donation, and (3) lands acquired by escheat.

CHAPTER VI. LANDS BELONGING TO THE VILLAGE.

The Village lands are divided into three classes: (1) lands acquired by purchase, (2) lands acquired by donation, and (3) lands acquired by escheat.

The School District lands are divided into three classes: (1) lands acquired by purchase, (2) lands acquired by donation, and (3) lands acquired by escheat.
