

Sec. 6321. Lien For Taxes

If any person liable to pay any tax neglects or refuses to pay the same after demand, the amount (including any interest, additional amount, addition to tax, or assessable pensity, together with any costs that may accrue in addition therete) shell be a tien in fevor of the United States upon all property and rights to property, whether rest or personal, belonging to

Sec. 6322. Period Of Lien.

Unless another date is specifically fixed by law, the lien imposed by section 6321 inhell arise at the time the assessation is made and shall continue until the liability for the amount so assessed for a judgment against the taxpayer arising out of such liability) is satisfied or becomes unenforceable by reason of lapse of time

Sec. 6323. Validity and Priority Against Certain Persons.

(a) Purchaser's, Holders Of Security Interests, Machanic's Lienors, And Judgment Lien Creditors.—The lien imposed by section 6321 shall not be valid as against any purchaser, holder of a security interest, mechanic's lienor, or judg-ment lien creditor until notice thereof which meets the requirements of subsection (f) has been filed by the Secretary.

Place For Filing Notice; Form.—

(1) Place For Filling - The notice referred to in subbelt cd llade (a) noited-

(A) Under State Laws

(I) Real Property - In the case of real property, in one office within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the lews-of-such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situtated; and

(iii) Personal Property-In the case of personal property, whether tangible or intengible, in one office within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision); as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is altusted; except that State law merely conforming to reenacting Federal law establishing a national filing system does not constitute a second office for filling

as designated by the laws of such State; or (B) With Clark Of District Counting the office of the clark of the United States district court for the judicial district in which the property subject to lien is situated, whenever the State has not by law designated one office which meets the

equirements of subparagraph (A), or (C) With Recorder Of Deeds Of The District Of Columbla - In the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia, if the property subject to the lien is situated in the

District of Columbia

(2) Situs Of Property Subject To Lien - For purposes of paragraphs (1) and (4), property shall be deemed to be altrated-(A) Real Property - in the case of real property, at its physical focation; or

Sec. 6325. Rélease Of Lien Or Discharge Of Property.

(a) Release Of Lien. — Subject to such regu-lations as the Secretary may prescribe, the Secretary shall issue a certificate of release of any lien imposed with respect to any internal revenue tax not later than 30 days after the day on which .

(1) Liability Satisfied or Unenforceable - The Secretary finds that the liability for the amount assessed, togainor with all interest in respect thereof, has been fully satisfied or

has become logally unenforceable; or (2) Bond Accepted-There is furnished to the Serelary and accepted by him a bond that is conditioned upon the payment of the amount assessed, together with all interest in reviect thereof, within the time prescribed by law (including) any kiens' in of such time), and that is in accordance with such requirements relating to terms, conditions, and form of the bond and surelies thereon, as may be specified by such

(2) Disclosure of amount of outstanding lien.-If s. notice of tien has been filed pursuant to section 6323(f), the amount of the outstanding obligation secured by such tier may be disclosed to any person who furnishes satisfactor; er, evidence that he has a right in the property subject to such lien or intends to obtain a right in such property.

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
