

SECTION A

A.1 CHOICE OF LAW

This Lease shall be governed by Federal law.

A.2 DEPINITIONS

As used in this contract, the following terms have the following meanings:

- a. "Contracting officer" means the person executing this contract on behalf of the Postal Service, and any other employee who is a properly authorized contracting officer; the team includes, except as otherwise provided in the contract, the authorized representative of a contracting officer acting within the limits of the authority conferred upon that person.
- b. "Buccessful offeror," "offeror," "onthintor," or "lessor" are interchangeable and refer to the party whose proposel to recepted by the Postal Service.
- c. "Lesso" and "agreement" are interchangeable and refer to this document, including all itders and attachments thereto.

A.3 EXECUTION AND NOTICE REQUIREMENTS

- a. All co-owners and all other persons having or to have a legal Lichtest in the property must execute the Lease. The offeror must subnit ribiquete evidence of title.
- b. Markal status of all individuals must be shown. If the offeror is married, the insuband or wife of the offeror must also execute the Lease.
- c. Where the offeror is an unincorporated firm or partnership, each member must sign.
- d. Where the offeror is an administrator or an executor of an estate, there must be furnished a certificate of the clerk of the court or certified copy of the court order: showing the appointment of the administrator or executor. Ingether with a certified copy of the will of the deceased. If there is no will, or in the event the will of the deceased does not specifically authorize the administrator or the executor to enter into a contract to feese the proposed quarters, it will generally be necessary to furnish, in addition to the above narmed items, a certified copy of the court order authorizing such administrator or executor to enter into a lease with the Postal Service.
- e. Where the offeror is a trustee, a certified copy of the instrument creating the trust must be furnished together with any other evidence necessary to establish the trustee's authority to fease.
- Where the offeror is a corporation, leases and lease agreements entered into must have the corporate seal affixed or in place thereof the statement that the corporation has no seal.
- g. Where the offeror is a corporation, municipal corporation, fraternal order or society, the Lease must be accompanied by documentary evidence affirming the authority of the agent, or agents, to execute the Lease to bind the municipal corporation, fraternal order or society for which he (or they) purports to act. The usual evidence required to establish such authority is in the form of extracts from the articles of incorporation, or bytaws, or the munities of the board of directors duly certified by the custodian of such records, under the corporate seal. Such resolutions, when required, must contain the essential stipulations embodied in the Lease. The names and official titles of the officers who are authorized to sign the Lease must appear in the document.

h. Notices. Any notice to Lessor provided under this Lesse or under any law or regulation must be in writing and may be hand delivered or mailed to Lessor at the address specified on page 3 of the Lesse, or at an address that Lessor has otherwise appropriately directed in writing. Any notice to the Postal Service provided under this Lesse or under any law or regulation must be in writing and may be hand delivered or mailed, addressed to "Contracting Officer, U.S. Postal Service" at the address specified on page 3 of the Lesse, or at an address that the Postal Service has otherwise directed in writing.

A.4 MORTGAGEE'S AGREEMENT

If there is now or will be a mortgage on the property which is or will be recorded prior to the recording of the lease, the offeror must notify the contracting officer of the facts concerning such mortgage and, unless in his sole discretion the contracting officer waives the requirement, the offeror must furnish a Mortgagee's Agreement, which will concent to this lease and shall provide that, in the event of foreclosure, mortgages, successors, and scaigns shall cause such foreclosures to be subject to the lease.

A.5 EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

- a. The contractor may not discriminate against employees or applicants because of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. The contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. This action must include, but not be limited to, employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticaship. The contractor excess to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applications of this cat se.
- b. The confluctor must, in all collectations or advertisements for employees placed by R or on its behalf, state that all qualified applicants will be considered for ampleyment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.
- c. The contractor must cent to each union or workers' representative with which the contractor has a collective bargaining agreement or other understanding, a notice, provided by \$1.5 contracting officer, advising the union or workers' representative of the contraction's commitments under this clause, and must post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants.
- d. The contractor must comply with all provisions of Executive Order (EO) 11246 of September 24, 1965, as amended, and in the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- e. The contractor must furnish all information and reports required by the Executive order, and by the rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary, and must permit access to the contractor's books, records, and accounts by the Postal Service and the Secretary for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with these rules, regulations, and orders.
- If the contractor falls to comply with this clause or with my of the said ruses, regulations, or orders, this contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended, in whole or in part; the contractor may be declared inelligible for further contracts in accordance with the Executive order; and other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked under the Executive order, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary, or as otherwise provided by taw.
- g. The contractor must insert this cleuse, including this paragraph g, in all subcontracts or purchase orders under this contract unless exempted by Secretary of Labor rules, regulations, or orders issued under the Executive

order. The contractor must take such action with respect to any such subcontract or purchase order as the Postal Service may direct as a means of enforcing the terms and conditions of this clause (including sanctions for noncompliance), provided, however, that if the contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, fligation as a result, the contractor may request the Postal Service to enter into the fligation to protect the interests of the Postal Service.

h. Disputee under this clause will be governed by the procedures in 41 CFR 80-1.1

AS FACILITIES NO AND CRIMINATION

- a. As used in this clause, thy nerm "facility" means stores, shops, restaurants, caleteriae, restrooms, and any other facility of a public nature in the building in which the space covered by this lesse is located.
- b The lessor agrees that he will not discriminate by sagnation or otherwise against any person or persons because of raise, religion, color, age, sex, or national origin in furnishing, or by refusing to furnish, to such person or persons the use of any facility including any and all envices, privileges, accommodations, and activities provided thereby.
- 2. It is agreed that the feesor's noncompliance with the provisions of this clause shell constitute a material breach of this lesse. In The provision of such noncompliance, the Poetal Service may take appropriate action to enforce compliance, may terminate this leave, or may pursue such other nome? As a may be provided by law. In the event of termination, the lessor shall be sable for all excess costs of the Poetal Service in acquiring substitute space.
- d. The lessor agrees to include, or to require the inclusion of the foregoing provisions of this clause (with the terms "lessor" and lease" appropriately modified) in every agreement or concession pursuant to which any person other than the lessor operates or has the right to operate any facility. The lessor ateo agrees that it will take such action with respect to any such agreement as the Poetal Bervice may direct as a means of enforcing this clause, including but not limited to termination of the agreement or concession.

A.7 OFFICIALS NOT TO BENEFIT

No member of or delegate to Congress may be admitted to any part or share of this contract, or to any benefit arising from it. This prohibition does not apply to the extent this contract is with a corporation for the corporation's general benefit.

AS CONTINGENT PEES

- 8. The offeror werrants that no person or selling agency has been employed or resulted to solicit or obtain this contract upon an agreement or understanding for a construction, percentage, brokerage, or contingent lee, except bone fide employees or bone fide, established inormercial or selling agencies residented by the beautrior the purpose of obtaining business.
- b. For househ or violation of this warranty the Poetal Source has the right to arend their contract without bublilly, or at its sole discretion to deduct from the contract price or consideration or otherwise recover from others the full assistant of the cocumitation percentage, brokerage too or contingent less.

AS ASSIGNMENT OF CLAIMS

- is it this contract provides for payments aggregating \$10,000 or more, claims for moneys due or to become due from the Postal Service under it may be assigned to a bank, trust company, or other financing institution, including any Federal lending agency, and may thereafter be further assigned and reassigned to any such institution. Any assignment or reassignment must cover all amounts payable and must not be made to more then one party, except this assignment or reassignment may be made to one party as agent or trustee for two or more parties participating in financing this contract. No assignment or reassignment will be recognized as valid and binding upon the Postal Service unless a written notice of the assignment or reassignment, together with a true copy of the instrument of assignment, is filed with
 - 1. The contracting officer; and
 - 2.The surety or sureties upon any bonds
- b. Except with the written consent of the Contracting Officer, assignment of this contract or any interest in this contract other than in accordance with the provisions of this clause will be grounds for termination of the contract for default at the option of the Postal Service.
- c. Nothing contained herein shall be construed so as to prohibit transfer of ownership of the demised premises, so long as such transfer is subject to this agreement.

A.10 COMPLIANCE WITH OSHA STANDARDS

To the extant this agreement is for construction, alteration, and/or repairs, the lessor must (I) comply with applicable Occupational Safety and Hoalth Strindards, title 20 Code of Federal Regulations, Pert 1910, promulgated pursuant to the authority of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970; (II) comply with any other applicable Federal, State, or local regulation governing with any other applicable Federal, State, or local regulation governing with proper precautions to protect the health and safety of (a) any taborer or mechanic employed by the locator in performance of this agreement, (b) Postal Service employees, and (c) the public. The lessor must include this clause in national subcontracts of a low internal to refer to the subcontractor.

A.11 EXAMINATION OF RECUNDS

- a. The Poetal Service and its authorized apresentatives wiff, until three years after final payment under this contract or for any shorter period specified for particular records, have access to end the right to examine any directly pertinent books, documents, papers, or one records of the contractor involving transactions related to this contract.
- b. The contractor agrees to include in all subcontracts under this contract a provision to the affect that the Postal Service and its authorized representatives will, until three years after final payment under the subcontract, or for any shorter specified period for particular records, have access to and the right to examine any directly pertinent books, documents, papers, or other records of the subcontractor involving transactions related to the subcontract. A.12 CLEAN AIR AND WATER

The contractor agrees--

- a. To comply with all the requirements of section 114 of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7414) and section 306 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. 1318) relating to inspection, monitoring, entry, reports, and information, as well as other requirements specified in section 114 of the Clean Air Act and section 306 of the Clean Water Act, and all regulations and guidelines issued to implement those acts before the sward of this contract;
- b. That no portion of the work required by this contract will be performed in a facility fisted on the Emizonmental Protection Agency List of Violating Facilities on the date when this contract was awarded unless and until the EPA eliminates the name of the facility from the fielding:
- c. To use its best offorts to $ccnp^3$, with clean air standards and clean water standards at the facility in which the contract is being performed; and
- d. To insert the substance of this claus: into any nonexempt subcontract, including this paragraph d.

A.13 CLAMAS AND DISPUTES

- a. This contract is subject to the Contract Disputes Act of 1979 (41 U.S C. 601-613) ("the Act").
- b Except as provided in the Act, all disputes arising under or relian, in this contract must be resolved under this clause.
- c "Claim," as used in this clause, means a written demand or written assertion by one of the contracting parties seeking, as a matter of right, the payment of money in a sum certain, the edjustment or interpretation of contract turns, or other relief arising under or relating to this contract However, a written demand or written assertion by the centractor seeking the payment of money exceeding \$50,000 is not a claim under the Act until certified as required by subparagraph d.2 below. A voucher, involce, or other routine request for payment that is not in dispute when submitted is not a claim under the Act. The submission may be converted to a claim under the Act by complying with the submission and certification requirements of this clause, if it is disputed either as to liability or amount or is not acted upon in a reasonable time.
- A claim by the contractor must be made in writing and submitted to the contracting officer for a written decision. A claim by the Postal Service against the contractor is subject to a written decision by the contracting officer.
 - 2. For contractor claims exceeding \$50,000, the contractor must submit with the claim a certification that $\dot{\cdot}$
 - (a) The claim is made in good faith;
 - (b) Supporting data are accurate and complete to the best of the contractor's knowledge and belief; and
 - (c) The amount requested accurately reflects the contract adjustment for which the contractor believes the Postal Service is flable
 - (a) If the contractor is an individual, the certification must be executed by that individual.
 - (b) If the contractor is not an individual, the certification must be executed by-
 - (1) A senior company official in charge at the contractor's plant or location involved; or

- (2) An officer or general partner of the contractor having overall responsibility for the conduct of the contractor's offices.
- e. For contractor claims of \$50,000 or less, the contracting officer must, it requested in writing by the contractor, render a decision within 80 days of the request. For contractor-certified claims over \$50,000, the contracting officer must, within 90 days, decide the claim or notify the contractor of the date by which the decision will be made.
- The contracting officer's decision is final unless the contractor appeals or files a suit as provided in the Act.
- g. The Postal Service will pay interest on the amount found due and unpaid from-
 - The date the contracting officer receives the claim (properly certified if required); or
 - 2. The date payment otherwise would be due, if that date is later, until the date of payment.
- h. Simple interest on claims will be paid at a rate determined in accordance with the interest clause.
- i The contractor must proceed diffigently with performance of this contract, pending final resolution of any request for relief, claim, appeal, or action arising under the contract, and comply with any decision of the contracting officer.

A.14 AFFIRMATIVE ACTION FOR HAND/CAPPED WORKERS

- The following clause is applicable if this contract provides for payments at gregoring \$2500 or more.
- a. The connector may not discriminate against any emptoyee or applicant because of physical or mental handicap, in regard to any position for which the employee or applicant is qualified. The contractor agrees to take affirmative action to simpley, advance in employment, and otherwise treat qualified handicapper individuals without discrimination in all employment practices, such as employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, reordinent, advertising, layoff or to ministion, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection for it sinking (including appranticeship).
- h. The contractor agrees to comply with the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor Issue: pure sant to the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended.
- c. In the event of the contractor's noncompliant a minth this clause, action may be taken in accordance with the rules and regulations and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- d. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants, notices in a form to be prescribed by the Director, Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs, provided by or through the contracting officer. These notices state the contractor's obligation under the taw to take affirmative action to employ and advance in employment qualified handlooped employees and applicants, and the rights of applicants and employees.
- e. The contractor must notify each union or worker's representative with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other understanding that the contractor is bound by the terms of section 503 of the Act and is committed to taking affirmative action to employ, and advance in employment, handicapped individuals.
- f. The contractor must include this clause in every subcontract or purchase order over \$2,500 under this contract unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary festual pursuant to section 503 of the Act, so its provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. must take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the Director of the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs may direct to enforce in these provisions, including action for noncompliance.

A.15 APPIRMATIVE ACTION FOR DISABLED VETERANS AND VETERANS OF THE VIETNAM BRA

If this contract provides for payments aggregating \$10,000 or more, the following clause is applicable.

- a. The contractor may not discriminate against any employee or applicant because that employee is applicant is a disabled veteran or veteran of the Vietnamiera, in regard to any position for which the employee or applicant is qualified. The contractor press to take all matter action to employ, advance in employment, and employment practices, such as employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment, advertising, layoff or termination, race or any or other forms of compensation, and selection for training (including apprenticeship).
- b. The contractor agrees that all autiable employment openings of the contractor existing at the time of the execution of the contract or occurring during its performance (including those not generated by this contract and those occurring at an establishment of the contractol other than the one where the contract is being performed, but excluding those of generated corporate affiliates) will be listed at an appropriate and office of the State employment service system where the opening occurs. The contractor further agrees to provide such reports to the local office is jurding employment openings and hirse as may be required. State and local government agencies holding Postal Service contracts of \$10,000 or none will also list all their suitable openings with the appropriate office of the State employment service.
- c. Listing of employment openings with the employment service system will be made at least concurrently with the use of any other recruitment source or effort and will involve the normal obligations attaching to the placing of a bone fide job order, including the acceptance of referrals of veterans and non-veterans. The fisting of employment openings does not require the hiring of any particular applicants or hiring from any particular group of applicants, and nothing herein is intended to relieve the contractor from any other requirements regarding nondiscrimination in employment.
- d. Whenever the contractor becomes contractually bound to the fisting provisions of this clause, it must advise the craployment service system in each State where it has establishments of the name and location of each hiring location in the State. The contractor may advise the State system when it is no longer bound by this clause.
- e. Paragraphs b, c, and if above do not apply to openings the contractor proposes to fill from within its own organization or under a customary and traditional employer/union hiring arrangement. But this exclusion does not apply to a particular opening once the contractor decides to consider applicants outside its own organization or employer/union arrangements for that opening.

f. Definitions

f. "All suitable employment openings" includes openings that occur in the following job categories: production and non-production; plant and office; laborers and mechanics; supervisory and non-supervisory; technical; and executive, administrative, and professional openings as are compendated on a salary basis of less than \$25,000 per year. This term includes full-time employment, temporary employment of more than three days' duration, and part-time employment. It does not include openings the contractor proposes to fill from within its own organization or under a customery and traditional employar/union hiring arrangement or openings is an aducational institution that are restricted.

- to students of that Institution. Under the most compelling circumstances, an employment opening may not be suitable for linting, including situations in which the needs of the Postal Service cannot reasonably be otherwise supplied, when listing would be contrary to national security, or when the requirement of listing would otherwise not be in the best interests of the Postal Service.
- 2. "Appropriate office of the State employment service" means the local office of the Federal/State national systems of public employment offices with assigned responsibility for serving the area where the employment opening is to be filled.
- 3. "Openings the contractor proposes to fill from within its own organization" means employment openings for which persons outside the contractor's organization (including any affiliates, subsidiaries, and the parent companies) will not be considered and includes any openings the contractor proposes to fill from regularly established "recall" lists.
- 4. A.17 HAZARDOUS/TOXIC CONDITIONS CLAUSE

In accordance with applicable Federal Laws and Regulations, State and local laws, and EPA Standards, no hazardous/toxic or unhealthful materials may be present in or on any postal facility. Furthermore, sites cannot have contaminated soil, water or undisclosed underground storage tanks. By execution of this lease the leaser certifies:

- (1) The property and improvements are free of all contamination from petroleum products or may hazardous/toxic substances or wastes, as defined by applicable Str.e or Federal law.
- (2) There are no undischool underground storage tanks or associated piping on the property.
- (3) The demised premises contained in a frable or potentially frieble asbestoe material. "Frieble asbeston material" means any material containing more than 1% asbestos by works that hand pressure can crumble, pulvertze, or reduce to pounder within any.

If contaminated soil, water, underground storage tanks or piping, or friable asbestos or any other hazardous/toxic meterial as deliverably applicable local, State or Federal law is subsequently identified on the promises, the lessor agrees to remove such material upon notification by the U.S. Postal Service at lessor's sole cost in accordance with EPA and/or State gui relines. If the lessor fails to remove the asbestos or hazardous/toxic material, live Postal Service has the right to accomplish the work and deduct the cost, flus administrative costs, from future rent payments or recover these costs from Lessor by other means, or may, at its sole option, cancel this lease. A.18 ADVENTISING OF CONTRACT AWARDS

Except with the contracting officer's prior approval, the contractor agrees not to refer in its commercial advertising to the fact that it was awarded a Postal Service contract or to imply in any manner that the Postal Service Endorses its products.

A.19 RECORDING

This agreement or a memorandum hereof, must be recorded at the expense of the Linson, upon the request of the Postal Service contracting officer. Said expense must include all fees required for or incident to recording.

A.20 SUBLEASE

The Postal Service may sublet all or any part of the premises or assign this lease but shall not be relieved from any obligation under this lease by reason of any subletting or assignment.

A.21 ALTERATIONS

The Postal Service shall have the right to make alterations, attach fixtures and erect additions, structures or signs in or upon the premises hereby leaned (provided such alterations, additions, structures, or signs shall not be

detrimental to or inconcistent with the rights granted to other tenants on the property or in the building in which said premises are located); which fixtures, additions or structures so placed in, upon or attached to the said premises shall be and remain the property of the Postal Service and may be removed or otherwise disnosed of by the Postal Service. Prior to expiration or termination of this lease the Postal Service may remove such alterations and improvements and restore the premises to as good condition as that existing at the time of entering upon the same under the lease, reasonable and ordinary wear and tear and damages by the elements or by circumstances over which the Postal Service has no control, excepted. 

The Lessor shall, except as otherwise specified herein and except for damage resulting from the negligence of Postal Service agents or employees, maintain the demised premises, including the building and any and all equipment, flutures, and appurtenances, whether severable or non-severable, hundahed by the Lessor under this lesse, in good repair and tenantable condition. For the purpose of so maintaining said premises and property, the Lessor may at reasonable times, and upon reasonable notice to the facility manager, enter and inspect the same and make any necessary repairs thereto. Additionally, the Lessor shall designate maintenance repairmen for electrical emergencies, plumbing emergencies and for heating, ventilating and air conditioning and other emergencies (windows, doors, locks and other elements), who may be called by the Postal Service in the event of any emergency situation involving maintenance when the Lessor's agent cannot be contacted within a reasonable time
- b.
