755 ILCS 45/3-3, Effective January, 1993**ILLINOIS STATUTORY SHORT FORM POWER OF ATTORNEY FOR PROPERTY**

(NOTICE: THE PURPOSE OF THIS POWER OF ATTORNEY IS TO GIVE THE PERSON YOU DESIGNATE (YOUR "AGENT") BROAD POWERS TO HANDLE YOUR PROPERTY, WHICH MAY INCLUDE POWERS TO PLEDGE, SELL OR OTHERWISE DISPOSE OF ANY REAL OR PERSONAL PROPERTY WITHOUT ADVANCE NOTICE TO YOU OR APPROVAL BY YOU. THIS FORM DOES NOT IMPOSE A DUTY ON YOUR AGENT TO EXERCISE GRANTED POWERS; BUT WHEN POWERS ARE EXERCISED, YOUR AGENT WILL HAVE TO USE DUE CARE TO ACT FOR YOUR BENEFIT AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS FORM AND KEEP A RECORD OF RECEIPTS, DISBURSEMENTS AND SIGNIFICANT ACTIONS TAKEN AS AGENT. A COURT CAN TAKE AWAY THE POWERS OF YOUR AGENT IF IT FINDS THE AGENT IS NOT ACTING PROPERLY. YOU MAY NAME SUCCESSOR AGENTS UNDER THIS FORM BUT NOT CO-AGENTS. UNLESS YOU EXPRESSLY LIMIT THE DURATION OF THIS POWER IN THE MANNER PROVIDED BELOW, UNTIL YOU REVOKE THIS POWER OR A COURT, ACTING ON YOUR BEHALF TERMINATES IT, YOUR AGENT MAY EXERCISE THE POWERS GIVEN HERE THROUGHOUT YOUR LIFETIME, EVEN AFTER YOU BECOME DISABLED. THE POWERS YOU GIVE YOUR AGENT ARE EXPLAINED MORE FULLY IN SECTION 3-4 OF THE ILLINOIS "STATUTORY SHORT FORM POWER OF ATTORNEY FOR PROPERTY LAW" OF WHICH THIS FORM IS A PART (SEE THE BACK OF THIS FORM). THAT LAW EXPRESSLY PERMITS THE USE OF ANY DIFFERENT FORM OF POWER OF ATTORNEY YOU MAY DESIRE. as my attorney-in-fact (my "agent") to act for me and in my name (in any way I could act in person) with respect to the following powers, as defined in Section 3-4 of the "Statutory Short Form Power of Attorney for Property Law" (including all amendments), but subject to any limitations on or additions to the specified powers inserted in paragraph 2 or 3 below:

The powers granted above shall not include the following powers or shall be modified or limited in the following particulars (here you may include any specific limitations you deem appropriate, such as a prohibition or conditions on the sale of particular stock or real estate or special rules on borrowing by the agent):

**Section 3-4 of the Illinois Statutory Short Form
 Power of Attorney for Property Law**

Section 3-4: Explanation of powers granted in the statutory short form power of attorney for property. This Section defines each category of powers listed in the statutory short form power of attorney for property and the effect of granting powers to an agent. When the title of any of the following categories is retained (not struck out) in a statutory property power form, the effect will be to grant the agent all of the principal's rights, powers and discretions with respect to the types of property and transactions covered by the retained category, subject to any limitations on the granted powers that appear on the face of the form. The agent will have authority to exercise each granted power for and in the name of the principal with respect to all of the principal's interests in every type of property or transaction covered by the granted power at the time of exercise, whether the principal's interests are direct or indirect, whole or fractional, legal, equitable or contractual; as a joint tenant or tenant in common or held in any other form; but the agent will not have power under any of the statutory categories (a) through (o) to make gifts of the principal's property, to exercise powers to appoint to others or to change any beneficiary whom the principal has designated to take the principal's interests at death under any will, trust, joint tenancy, beneficiary form or contractual arrangement. The agent will be under no duty to exercise granted powers or to assume control of or responsibility for the principal's property or affairs; but when granted powers are exercised, the agent will be required to use due care to act for the benefit of the principal in accordance with the terms of the statutory property power and will be liable for negligent exercise. The agent may act in person or through others reasonably employed by the agent for that purpose and will have authority to sign and deliver all instruments, negotiate and enter into all agreements and do all other acts reasonably necessary to implement the exercise of the powers granted to the agent.

(a) **Real estate transactions.** The agent is authorized to: buy, sell, exchange, rent and lease real estate (which term includes, without limitation, real estate subject to a land trust and all beneficial interests in and powers of direction under any land trust); collect all rent, sale proceeds and earnings from real estate; convey, assign and accept title to real estate; grant easements, create conditions and release rights of homestead with respect to real estate; create land trusts and exercise all powers under land trusts; hold, possess, maintain, repair, improve, subdivide, manage, operate and insure real estate; pay, contest, protest and compromise real estate taxes and assessments; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to real estate which the principal could if present and under no disability.

(b) **Financial institution transactions.** The agent is authorized to: open, close, continue and control all accounts and deposits in any type of financial institution (which term includes, without limitation, banks, trust companies, savings and building and loan associations, credit unions and brokerage firms); deposit in and withdraw from and write checks on any financial institution account or deposit; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to financial institution transactions which the principal could if present and under no disability.

(c) **Stock and bond transactions.** The agent is authorized to: buy and sell all types of securities (which term includes, without limitation, stocks, bonds, mutual funds and all other types of investment securities and financial instruments); collect, hold and safekeep all dividends, interest, earnings, proceeds of sale, distributions, shares, certificates and other evidences of ownership paid or distributed with respect to securities; exercise all voting rights with respect to securities in person or by proxy, enter into voting trusts and consent to limitations on the right to vote; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to securities which the principal could if present and under no disability.

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(o) All other property powers and transactions. The agent is authorized to exercise all possible powers of the principal with respect to all possible types of property and interests in property, except to the extent the principal limits the generality of this category (o) by striking out one or more of categories (a) through (n) or by specifying other limitations in the statutory property power form.

(n) **Estate Transactions.** The agent is authorized to: (accept, receive), exercise, release, renounce, assign, demand, sue for, claim and recover any legal, beneficial, derivative, or other property interest or payment due or payable to or for the principal; assert any interest in and exercise any power over any asset, property subject to fiduciary control; establish a revocable trust solely for the benefit of the principal; hold terminals of the principal and is trustee of the principal and is then distributor of the estate of the principal; and, in general, exercise all powers which the principal could if present and under no disability; provided, however, that the agent may not make or change a demand or trust revocable by the principal or require the trustee of any trust for the benefit of the principal to pay income or principal to the agent unless specifically authorized to do so in the form.

(m) Borrowing transactions, the agent is authorized to borrow money; mortgage of property held as part of the personal property of the principal could be present and under no disability.

(ii) Business operations. The agent is authorized to: organize or continue and conduct any business (which, if it includes, without limitation, any learning, manufacturing, service, mining, retailing or other type of business operation) in any form, whether as a proprietorship, partnership, corporation, joint venture, sole proprietorship, or otherwise; and, in general, exercise all powers which relate to business interests and operations which the principal could at present and under no disability.

(x) **Commodity and option transactions.** The agent is authorized to buy, sell, exchange, design, or otherwise commodity futures contracts and option contracts for the principal with any securities or futures broker; and, in general, exercise all powers which respect to commodities and options which the principal could call and put options on stocks and stock indices traded on a regulated options exchange and receive for all proceeds of any such transaction, establish or continue option accounts for the principal with any securities or futures broker; and, in general, exercise all powers which respect to commodities and options which the principal could present and under no disability.

(iii) **Claims and litigation.** The agent is authorized to institute, prosecute, defend, absolve, settle and dispose of any claim in favor of or against the principal or any property interests of the principal; collect and receive for any claim or action of or against the principal or any other to whom the principal may have sold, leased, given, or otherwise transferred any interest in any property; employ attorneys and others and enter into contingencies agreements and other contracts as necessary in connection with litigation; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to claims and litigation which the principal could present and under no disability.

(i) Tax matters. The agent is authorized to sign, verify and file all the principal's federal, state and local tax returns, including joint returns and declarations of assimilated tax; to file, receive all tax refunds; claim, sue for and receive all tax credits; settle, negotiate and offer lax returns, including those before any legal action is taken by the taxing body and sign and deliver all tax documents on behalf of the principal; represent the principal before any agency or authority of the taxing body and sign and deliver all tax documents on behalf of the principal; waive rights and sign all documents on behalf of the principal to settle, pay and determine all tax liabilities; and, in general, exercise all powers for such purposes, waive rights and sign all documents on behalf of the principal to settle, pay and determine all tax liabilities; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to tax matters which the principal could at present and under no disability.

(ii) Social Security, Unemployment and military services benefits. The agent is authorized to: prepare, sign and file any claim of application for Social Security, Unemployment, Unemployment and military services benefits.

(g) Retirement plan contributions. The agent is authorized to: contribute to, withdraw from and deposit funds in any type of retirement plan without limitation, any tax qualified or nonqualified pension, profit sharing, stock bonus, employee savings and other retirement plan, individual retirement annuity or other type of employee benefit plan; select and change payment options for the principal under any type of self-directed retirement plan;

(ii) **Insurance and annuity transactions.** The agent is authorized to: procure, acquire, continue, renew, terminate or otherwise deal with any type of insurance or annuity contracts which the principal could if present and under no disability.

(e) **Safe deposit box transactions.** The agent is authorized to open, continue and have access to all safe deposit boxes, signs, renew, release or terminate any safe deposit contract; drill or surrender any safe deposit box; and, in general, exercise all powers which respect to safe deposit matters which the principal could at present and under no disability.

(d) **Tangible personal property transactions.** The agent is authorized to: buy and sell; lease; exchange; collect; possess and take title to all tangible personal property; move; store; ship; restore; maintain; repair; improve; manage; preserve; insure and keep tangible personal property; and, in general, exercise all powers with respect to tangible personal property which the principal could if present and under no disability.

11. INCORPORATION BY REFERENCE: This Rider is attached to and made a part hereof and supplements the printed form of Durable Power of Attorney as set forth above. The provisions of this Rider shall be as effective as though the same had been included in the printed form.

12. ADDITIONAL POWERS GRANTED TO AGENT:

(A) Agent shall have full power and authority to expend such sums of money necessary to provide for my care, comfort, support, maintenance, medical and hospital care, including retirement and nursing home care. Payments for such expenses may be made directly by my agent, or through such person or persons as the agent deems best adapted to provide for the care and support of the principal.

(B) Agent shall have full power and authority to change the names of any beneficiaries on any bank accounts, or any other assets owned by me, and shall have the full authority to withdraw any and all funds deposited by me in any jointly held bank accounts or other assets, it being my intention to reduce all such assets to my sole name, unless the joint tenant can prove that he or she had, in fact, a real interest in such asset. With respect to any joint tenancy assets which I created with my own such funds, I hereby declare that I never intended to make a gift of said property to the named joint tenant, but only intended that the joint tenant shall assist me in using said property for myself during my lifetime.

13. APPOINTMENT OF SUCCESSOR GUARDIAN: Upon the death, resignation, removal, or other inability of the said Joseph J. LaRocco to act as guardian hereunder, I hereby name the following to act as successor to such guardian named above:

- (A) RAYMOND P. CARROLL, of 79 West Monroe Street, Suite 510, Chicago, IL 60603;
- (B) EVA BRAXTON EVANS, of 46 North Central Avenue, Chicago, IL 60644.

14. ACCOUNTING: I hereby direct my agent shall make a verbal or written accounting of all of his or her acts and doings as agent to subject principal. Such accounting shall be not less frequently than monthly.

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15. **COMPENSATION OF AGENT:** It is my wish, and I hereby direct that each and every agent shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred upon my behalf and shall be paid reasonable compensation for the rendering of such service to me as agent.

16. **PERMANENT NATURE OF AGENTS POWER TO ACT:** Each of my agents named in this Illinois Statutory Short Form Power of Attorney For Property shall serve in the order named. If for any reason my first agent is unable or unwilling to act, then the next and each successor agent thereafter shall act in the order named. If for any reason any agent refuses to act or is unwilling to act, such agent shall not be deemed to have permanently waived his or her right to act and may exercise his or her right as agent with respect to any subsequent event or other matter which requires an approval or action by such agent.


