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Last Will and Testament

JOHN L. GRIFFITH

JOHN L. GRIFFITH, a resident of the State of Illinois, County of Cook and Village of Kenilworth, do hereby declare this to be my last will and testament and I revoke all other wills and codicils that I may have made.

ARTICLE ONE

The expenses of my last illness, my funeral and the administration of my estate, wherever situated, and all inheritance, estate or succession taxes, including interest and penalties, payable by reason of my death, shall be paid out of and charged generally against the principal of my residuary estate without apportionment or proration. My executor shall not seek contribution or reimbursement for any such payments, except to the extent my executor has the right, by law or otherwise to seek contribution or reimbursement for taxes payable by reason of property over which I have the power of appointment.

ARTICLE TWO

I give all of my personal and household effects not otherwise effectively disposed of, such as jewelry, clothing, automobiles, furniture, furnishings, silver, books and pictures, including policies of insurance thereon, to KATHERINE J. GRIFFITH, my wife, hereinafter referred to as "my wife", if she survives me for a period of thirty (30) days, or if she does not so survive me, to such of my children who survive me for thirty (30) days, (to the exclusion of the descendants of any of them who do not so survive me) in shares of substantially equal value, to be divided as they agree, or, if they fail to agree within six months after the date of my death, as my executor determines. My children on the date hereof are my daughters, JOANNE GRIFFITH LAPP, born February 1, 1946 and KATHERINE GRIFFITH GOESSELE, born February 9, 1945, and my son JOHN L. GRIFFITH, Jr., born November 3, 1952.

ARTICLE THREE

I give and devise to my daughter, JOANNE GRIFFITH LAPP, all of my right, title and interest in my family's farm in Waterford, Wisconsin, including all buildings located thereon. This devise is to include all land which is operated as a part of this farm at my death, whether acquired by me as a part of my original inheritance from my mother, ALICE KELLY GRIFFITH, or thereafter, from any source. The judgment of my executor as to the includability of any realty or personality under this section shall be final. If my daughter, JOANNE GRIFFITH LAPP, fails to survive me for thirty (30) days, then I give, devise and bequeath all of my right, title and interest in my said farm to my daughter's children, in equal shares. My daughter's children on the date hereof are my granddaughters, CYNTHIA LAPP and MELISSA LAPP.

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ARTICLE FOUR

I give and devise all of my right, title and interest in the improved real estate located at 1719 Howard Street, Evanston, Illinois, to my daughter, KATHERINE GRIFFITH GOESSELE and my son, JOHN L. GRIFFITH, Jr., in equal shares, or to the survivor of them, my entire interest, including all buildings and improvements thereon, and all rights and other interests pertaining thereto.

ARTICLE FIVE

I give all of my residuary estate, being all real and personal property, wherever situated, in which I may have any interest at the time of my death not otherwise effectively disposed of, but not including any property over which I have the power of appointment, as follows:

- (1) To my wife, if she survives me for thirty(30) days, or,
- (2) If my wife does not so survive me, to my descendants who survive me, per stirpes. As used in this instrument, the term "descendants" shall mean only my blood descendants and shall not include adopted children.


ARTICLE SIX

If my physician or the physician attending me certifies in writing to my children that in his judgment I am unable to manage my person or my estate, then I direct that my daughter, JOANNE GRIFFITH LAPP, be appointed as conservator of my person and my estate. If my daughter is unwilling or unable to act as my conservator, then I direct that my son, JOHN L. GRIFFITH, Jr., be appointed as my conservator.

The conservator of my person and my estate shall have all of the duties and powers granted to conservators under the laws of the State of Illinois in effect at the time of my incompetency.

ARTICLE SEVEN

- (1) I appoint my wife as the executor of this will. If my wife is unwilling or unable to act as executor, then I appoint my daughter, JOANNE GRIFFITH LAPP, as executor.
- (2) If the appointment of an executor of my estate is necessary or desirable in any jurisdiction outside of the State of Illinois, then I appoint as my executor in that jurisdiction any individual or corporation as may be designated in writing by my principal executor, to act without bond and to have all the powers and discretion with respect to my estate in that jurisdiction during administration that my principal executor is given with respect to the balance of my estate, to be exercised without court order.
- (3) I give the executor the following powers and discretions, in each case to be exercisable without court order:
 - (a) To sell at public or private sale, to retain, to lease, to borrow money and for that purpose to mortgage or to pledge, all or part of the real or personal property of my estate;
 - (b) To settle claims in favor of or against my estate;

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(c) To exercise or not to exercise any election or option granted to executors by the Internal Revenue Code in force at my death, even though such exercise or non-exercise increases or decreases estate principal or income, without adjustment to principal or income;

(d) To distribute the residue of my estate in cash or in kind or partly in each, and for this purpose the determination of my executor as to the value of any property distributed in kind shall be conclusive; and

(e) To invest and reinvest in stocks, bonds, notes and other income-producing property;

(f) To allot different kinds or disproportionate shares of property or undivided interests in property among the distributive shares, without regard to the income tax basis of such property or interests;

(g) To retain any person, firm or bank as agent, and to delegate in writing to such agent any ministerial right, power or discretion of the executor, including the rights to sign and endorse checks and have access to any safe deposit box; and

(h) To execute and deliver any deeds, contracts, mortgages, bills of sale or other instruments necessary or desirable for the exercise of the executor's powers and discretions.

(4) I direct that no security on the executor's bond be required of any executor named herein.

(5) Further, I grant to my executor any other powers and discretions allowed or allowable under the Illinois Probate Code in effect at the time of my death.

ARTICLE EIGHT

If any beneficiary of mine has not attained the age of twenty-one (21) at the time any property becomes distributable to him or to her, the executor may distribute any part or all of such property to a parent or adult relative of the beneficiary, as trustee (or to a custodian for the beneficiary under any Uniform Gifts to Minors Act), against such person's receipt.


