#### JUDGMENT

On July 16, 1981, Potitioner, by PHILIP H. HART of CONSUMER LAW OFFICES, attorney, proceeded to trial and it appearing to the Court that said Respondent had due notice thereby by appearence pro se, according to the Statutes in effect. That the petitioner and the respondent stipulated to have this matter neard as a default case.

And the Court having heard testimony taken in open Court in support of said Petition; a Certificate of which evidence has been filed terein; and the Court being fully advised in the premises:

#### FINDS:

- That it has jurisdiction of the parties and the subject matter.
- 2. That one of the parties at the time the action was commenced was domiciled in the State of Illinois and said domicile has been maintained for 90 days next preceding the making of the Findings.
- 3. That the Petitioner has resided in Illinois for 24 years.
- 4. That the parties were lawfully married at Nidlethian on November 24, 1974 and said Certificate was registered in Cook County, Illinois.
- 5. (a) That no children were born, or adopted of the marriage.
  - (b) That the wife is not pregnant.
- 6. That Petitioner is 24 years old; works as a sales representative and earns \$1100 net per month; and presently resides at: 3624 West 148th Street, Midlothian, Illinois 60445.
- 7. That Respondent is 25 years of age; works as a policeman and earns \$980 net per month; and presently resides at: 15101 Lamon, Midlothian, Illinois 60445.
- That Petitioner by competent evidence, established that without cause or provocation by the Petitioner, the Respondent has been guilty of extreme and repeated mental cruelty.
- 9. That the court has considered, approved, reserved or made provisions for the maintenance of either spouse and the disposition of the property as per the following agreement:

#### WITNESSETE:

#### WHEREAS:

- The parties were lawfully married on November 24, 1974, at Midlothian, Cook County, State of Illinois.
- Irreconcilable difficulties and differences have arisen between them as a result of which they separated in August 1980.
- As a result of this marriage, no children were born to said parties.

No children were adopted by them and the wife is not now pregnant.

- The wife has filed, gainst the husband, an action for Dissolution of Marriage in the Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois, County Department, Domestic Relations Division, under Docket Number 21 D 10684.
- The parties consider it to their best interests to settle between themselves the question of maintenance and to fully settle their rights of property and other rights growing out of the marital or any other relationship now or previously existing between them and to settle any rights which either of them now has or may hereafter have or claim to have against the other.
- The wife has employed and had benefit of counsel of PHILIP H. HART of CONSUMER LAW OFFICES, her attorney. The husband has declined to seek representation by an attorney. The parties acknowledge that each has been fully informed of the wealth, property, estate and income of the other and that each has been fully informed of his or her respective rights in the premises.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions of this agreement, and other good and valauable considerations, it is hereby agreed between said parties as follows:

#### Right of Action . 1.

This agreement is not one to obtain or stimulate a dissolution of marriage.

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#### 2. Waiver of Maintenance

The husband shall, in consideration of the premises of this Agreement, waive and release any and all claims that he may have for Maintenance or Support. The wife shall, in consideration of the premises of this Agreement, waive and release any and all claims that she may have for Maintenance or Support.

#### 3. Real Estate

Upon the effective date of this agreement, the husband shall quit claim, convey and release all of his rights, title and interest in the marital name located at 3624 West 148th Street, Midlothian, Cook County, Illinois to the wife. The legal description of this realty is as follows:

The East ½ of the South ½ of Lot 13 in Midlothian Highlands, being a Subdivision of the East 693 feet of the North ½ of the Southwest ½ of Section 11, Township 36 North, Range 13 East of the 3rd Principal Maridian, in Cook County, Illinois

The wife shall hold the husband free, clear and harmless as to any liens encumbrances, suits and obligations against said realty.

#### 4. Furniture and Furnishings

All of the furniture, furnishings, and personal items contained in the marital residence has been divided in a just and amicable manner.

#### 5. Bank Accounts

Each party shall keep their own bank account.

#### 6. <u>Debts</u>

Each of the parties shall be responsible for the payment of their respective debts that he or she incurred since the separation of the parties in August of 1980.

#### 7. Tax Returns

Commencing with the calendar year of 1981 and in all subsequent years the parties shall file separate tax returns.

#### 8. Execution of Documents

Each of the parties, his or her heirs, executors or administrators, upon demand of the other, at any time hereafter, shall execute and deliver to the other party, any and all instruments and documents as may be

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designated herein or as may be reasonably necessary to make effective use of the provisions of this agreement and to release his or her respective interests in any property (real or personal) belonging to or awarded to the other, the intention being that the property settlement provided for in this agreement shall constitute a complete adjustment of the property rights of the parties hereto.

#### 9. Modifications

The parties agree that the terms hereof, shall not be orally modified. That any amendments shall be in writing, dated and signed by both parties

#### 10. Incorporation of Agreement

In the event that either party obtains a judgment of dissolution of marriage, this agreement and all of its provisions shall be incorporated into the judgment of dissolution of marriage, either directly or by reference, but in no event shall this agreement be effective or of any validity unless a judgment of dissolution of marriage is entered. The Court on entry of the judgment of dissolution of marriage shall retain the right to enforce the provisions and terms of the agreement.
