

- 2. The parties agree that from the sale of the house the first \$1,500.00 will go to the Petitioner, GINA HAYWOOD, and the balance of the net proceeds will be split evenly between the parties.

- D. This Court shall retain jurisdiction of this cause and over the parties hereto and the subject matter hereof for the purpose of enforcing all of the terms of this Judgment for Dissolution of Marriage including all the terms of the written agreement of the parties set forch herein.
- E. That GINA HAYWOOD will reacquire her maiden name of WILLIAMS and shall be hereinafter known as "GINA WILLIAMS".
