JUDGMENT FOR DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE

This day came again the Petitioner, JAMES ALFRED MITCHELL,
by his attorney, SAM FRANK ADLER, and the Respondent, GWENDOLLIA
MITCHELL, having filed her Appearance and Response by and through
her attorney, MARSHALL E. LOBIN; and upon the Stipulation of the
parties that this cause be heard as a default matter; and the Petitioner
appearing in open court, in his own proper person and by his said
attorney; and the court having heard the testimony in open court
of the Petitioner in support of the allegations contained in his
Petition for Dissolution of Marriage; and the court having considered
all of the evidence and now being fully advised in the premises,
FINDS:

- A. That this Court has jurisdiction of the parties hereto and of the subject matter hereof;
- B. That the Petitioner was domiciled in the State of Illinois at the time the Petition for Dissolution of Marriage was commenced and has maintained a domicile in the State of Illinois for ninety (90) days next preceding the making of the findings;

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- C. That the parties were married on December 27, 1968 in Chicago, Illinois, and that said marriage was registered in Cook County, Illinois.
- D. That two children were born to the parties, namely:
 SHARITA MITCHELL, age 15, born July 18, 1970 and MARCUS MITCHELL,
 age 18, born March 17, 1967, and that no children were adopted
 by the parties and that the Respondent is not pregnant.
- E. That the Court finds that the parties have lived separate and apart for a continuous period in excess of six months and irreconcilable differences have caused the irretrievable breakdown of the marriage and the Court determines that the efforts at reconciliation have failed and would be impractical and not in the best interest of the family.
- F. That the Petitioner has proved the material allegations of his Petition for Dissolution of Marriage by substantial, competent and relevant evidence; and that a Judgment for Dissolution of Marriage should be entered herein.
- G. That the parties hereto have entered into a written Agreement concerning the respective rights of each party in and to the property, income or estate which either of them now has or may hereafter acquire, including a division of the marital property, which Agreement has been presented to this Court for its consideration. Said Agreement was entered into freely and voluntarily between the parties hereto; it is not unconscionable and ought to receive the approval of this Court; and said Agreement is in words and figures as follows:

AGREEMENT

The Petitioner, JAMES ALFRED MITCHELL, and the Respondent, GWENDOLLIA MITCHELL, have entered into this agreement and the Petitioner has received the counsel of his attorney, namely, .SAM FRANK ADLER, and the Respondent has had the counsel of her attorney, namely, MARSHALL E. LOBIN, and after due deliberation and consideration of each of the parties, the parties hereto have entered into this agreement, feeling that it is fair, equitable and just and that they intend to be bound thereby.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED between the parties as follows:

- That this cause shall be heard as an uncontested matter upon the Petitioner's Petition for Dissolution of Marriage and the Respondent's response thereto.
- 2. That JAMES ALFRED MITCHELL is 42 years of age and is employed with the United States Postal Service as a truck driver.
- That GWENDOLLIA MITCHELL is 37 years of age and is employed as a Communication Officer for the Department of Mental Health in the State of Alabama.

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- 4. That GWENDOLLIA MITCHELL shall have the custody of the parties' minor child, namely, SHERITA MITCHELL, age 15, born July 18, 1970.
- 5. That JAMES ALFRED MITCHELL shall have the right of reasonable visitation with said child.
- 6. That each of the parties shall keep the personal property and automobiles that they now have in-their possession and have——full title to the same.
- 7. That the parties shall continue to have the property at 9347 South Elizabeth, Chicago, Illinois, held in joint tenancy but that the property shall be sold and that the net proceeds from said property shall be divided equally between the parties.
- 8. That JAMES ALFRED MITCHTLL shall waive and be barred from any rights to the real estate of (WENDOLLIA MITCHELL located at Route No. 1, Box 6B in Sweetwater, Alabama.
- 9. That JAMES MITCHELL shall pay to CWINDOLLIA MITCHELL the sum of \$ 60 per mech (which represents 20% of his net pay from his job) as and for child support, which sun shall be paid directly through the Slock of the Circuit court of Cook County.
- 10. That both parties shall pay any bills they have incurred since they separated and hold each other harmless.
- 11. That JAMES ALFRED MITCHELL shall pay the extraordinary medical expenses of the parties' minor child and maintain health and hospitalization for said child until said child reaches majority.
- 12. That JAMES ALFRED MITCHELL shall keep the parties' minor child SHERITA MITCHELL as the sole beneficiary on his life insurance on his job until such time as said child reaches her majority.
