- 3. That the Parties were lawfully married on May 31, 1958, and said marriage was registered at South Mill, North Carolina.
- 4. That the Plaintiff, CHRISTINE A. HILL is presently residing in Chicago, Illinois, and is employed as a licensed practical nurse, and is self-supporting.
- 5. That the Defendant, JACOB D. HILL is presently residing at an address unknown to CHRISTINE A. HILL.
- 6. That the following children were born to or adopted by the Parties, to wit: ROSLYN, age 30; SHECIA, age 27; both the natural children of CHRISTINE A. HILL and adopted by JACOL D. HILL; SUMNER, age 26, born September 19, 1958; YOLANDA, age 25, born July 20, 1955; DANIEL, age 21, born May 27, 1984; and BETTINE, age 19, born April 8, 1966; said children are new adults and emancipated. That, upon information and pelief of CHRISTIME A. HILL, no other children were born to or adopted by the Parties, and none are expected.
- 7. That the Parties have lived separate and apart since February 15, 1978, for a continuous period of not less than two years, and irreconcilable differences have caused the irretrievable breakdown of their parriage.
- 8. That the Parties acquired in joint tenancy during the crucse of the marriage the real property commonly known as 5039 West Kamerling, Chicago, Illinois, which is legally described as follows:

Lot 3 in Block 2 in Austin Park Subdivision, being a subdivision in the South Half (1/2) of the Northwest Quarter (1/4) of Section 4. Township 39 North, Range 13, East of the Third Principal Meridian, in Cook County, Illinois

- B. That CHRISTINE A. HILL is aw rded the personal property in her possession in the State of Illinois as her sole and separate property.
- C. That CHRISTIBE A. HILL be awarded the real property described in paragraph 8, free of any claim by JACOB D. HILL.
- D. That the Court reserves all other issues until personal juris-.
 diction is obtained over the Defendant.
- E. That this is a final judgment, and there is no just reason for delaying enforcement or appeal.
- F. That the Court retains jurisdiction for the purposes of enforcing this Judgment.
