#### JUDGMENT FOR DIVORCE

This cause coming on to be heard on the Complaint for Divorce of the Plainting, LUCILLE MUNIS, and the answer of the Defendant, JOHN MUNIS, both parties being present in open Court, the Plaintiff being represented by HARRY R. BUOSCIO, of the firm of BUOSCIO & BUOSCIO and the Defendant being represented by CHARLES E. LINDELL, and the Court having heard the evidence of the Plaintiff in support of the allegations and charges contained in her Complaint for Divorce (acertificate of evidence is filed herewith) and the Court now being fully advised in the premises finds:

- 1. That the Court has jurisdiction of the subject matter hereof and the parties hereto.
- 2. That the Plaintiff is now and for more than one year last past, continuously and immediately preceding the filing of her Complaint for Divorce been an actual resident of the County of Cook and State of Illinois.
- 3. That on to-wit the 17th day of November, 1946, in Cook County, Illinois, the Plaintiff and Defendant were lawfully married to each other.

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- 4. That as a result of the marriage aforesaid, there were two children born unto the Plaintif and Defendent, both of whom are married or emancipated and no children were ever adopted by said parties.
- 5. That during all of the time the Plaintif and Defendant lived together as husband and wife the Plaintif always conducted herself as a good, true, faithful and affectionate wife.
- 6. That the parties cohabited and lived together from the time of their marriage until on or about April 1977 and since then have ceased to live together as husband and wife through no fault on the part of the Plaintif.
- 7. That the Plaintif has established by competent material and relevant proof all of the allegations and charges contained in her complaint for Divorce and the equities of the case are with the Plaintif.
- 8. That the parties hereto have entered into an oral agreement providing for the settlement of the matters relative to their property and other rights which agreement has been recited to the Court for its consideration and approval and in incorporated herein.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DICKEE and the Court by virtue of the power authority therein vested in the atatute in such case made and provided DOTH ORDER, ADJUDGE AND DECREE, as follows:

1. That the bonds of matrimony existing between the Plaintif
LUCILLE MUNIS and the Defendant, JOHN MUNIS, be and the same are
dissolved accordingly and the parties are divorced from each other.

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- 2. That the marital residence located 10834 S. Avenue N. Chicago Illinois and legally described as follows:
  - (1) Lot 15 in Block 57 in Ironworker's Addition being a subdivision of the West one-half of the Northwest quarter of Section 17, Town 37 North, Range 15, East of the Third Principal Meridian.

is to become the sole and exclusive property of the wife and the husband shall have no further interest therein. That the husband shall execute any and all documents, deeds, and assignments to transfer, assign and convey and release any and all of his right, title and interest in said property to the wife or her nominee. Said property is free and clean of all liens.

- 3. That the property located 10840 S. Avenue N. Chicago, Illinois and legally described as follows:

is to become the sole and exclusive property of the husband and the wife shall have no further interest therein and the wife shall execute any and all documents, deeds, and asignments to transfer, assign and convey and release any and all of her right, title and interest in said property to the husband or his nominee. That the husband shall assume and pay the existing mortgage on said property and indemnify the wife from any obligation thereunder.

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- 4. That the joint savings account held at the East Side Savings and Loan Association in the approximate amount of \$2,100.00 shall become the sole and absolute property of the wife and the husband shall have no further interest therein and the wife shall be entitled to the entire account including principal and interest.
- 5. That the forty-three (43) \$25.00 U.S. Savings Bonds held jointly by the parties hereto are to be cashed and used to pay the \$1,000.00 debt dur and owing to the wife's father in the total amount of \$1,000.00. That any deficiency after redemption of said bonds is to be made up equally between the husband and the wife so that said debt is paid in full within thirty (30) days of the effective date hereof.
- 6. That the husband shall retain the credit union account held at the Republic Steel Credit Union presently existing in his own name. That he will supply the wife or her attorney with the necessary authorization to obtain complete company records in to how said account has been held since its inception. If it is found that the said account was at any time held jointly between the husband and wife, then said account is to be divided equally between the husband and wife, otherwise said account shall remain the sole property of the husband.
- 7. That the wife agrees to waive any and all rights to alimony past, present and future and to be forever barred therefrom and the humand also agrees to waive any and all rights of alimony past, present and future and to be forever barred therefrom.
- 8. That each of the parties hereto shall retain the personal property in their respective possessions with the exception of the stereo presently in the possession of the husband which is to become the sole and exclusive property of the wife and is to be turned over to the wife instanter.

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- 9. That each of the parties hereto shall pay their own respective attorney's fees and costs incurred.
- 10. That each of the parties, his or her heirs, executors, or administrators, upon demand of the other, at any time hereafter, shall execute and deliver to the other party any and all instruments and documents as may be designated herein or may be reasonably necessary to make effective the provision of this Judgment for Divorce and to release his or her respective interest in any property belonging to or awarded to the other.
- ll. Except as otherwise provided herein, each of the parties does hereby forever relinquish, release, waive and quit claim to the other party hereto any and all claims and rights of dower and homestead and all property rights and claims which he or she now has or may hereafterhave, as husband and wife, widower, widow or otherwise, or by reason of the marital relation now existing between the parties hereto or by virtue of any present or future laws of the United States of America or of any other country, or in or to, or against the property of the other party of his or her estate, whother now owned or hereafter aquired by such other party. Each of the parties hereto further covenent and agree for himself and herself and his or har heirs executors, administrators, and assigns, for the purpose of enforcing any of the rights relinquished under this paragraph.

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12. That the court reserves jurisdiction of the subject matter of this case and of the parties hereto for the purpose of enforcing the terms of this Judgment for Divorce.
