### JUDGMENT FOR DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE

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'ON

THIS CAUSE, having come on to be heard on Petition for Dissolution of Marriage filled by KATHLHEN M, MOOD, and the respondent, THOMAS G, MOOD, having filed a Pro-Se Appearance and Stipulation that this matter or heard as a default, and on motion of JAMES P. WHITHEY, actorney for petitioner, the respondent is found to be in default; and the Court having heard the testimony found to be in default; and the Court having heard the testimony of petitioner in open Court, and being slyled in the premises;

I. Thet petitioner, KATHLEEN M. WOOM, was domiciled in the County of Cook and State of Illinois at the time this action was commenced, and that domicile had been maintained for ninety days next preceding the making of the findings heroin; and the Court has jurisdiction of the parties and the subject matter.

2. That the petitioner and respondent were lawfully

married on the 5th day of August, 1966 in Cook County, Illinois,

- 5. That the petitioner, KATHLEEN M. WOOD, is a fit and proper person to have the care, custody, control and education of the minor child, JOHN WOOD, and the respondent, THOMAS G. WOOD, shall have the right of reasonable visitation as provided in the Marital Settlement Agreement entered into by the parcies and made a part of this Judgment.
- 5. That the parties have entered into a written Marital Settlement Agreement which is fair and reasonable, said Agreement amended to conform to Oral testemony of petitioner, and said Agreement was entered into freely and voluntarily by the parties.

  THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED:

### AGREBMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this Aday of May, 1988, by and between KATHLEEN M. WOOD, hereinafter referred to as the "wife", and THOMAS G. WOOD, hereinafter referred to as the "husted";

WITNESSETH:

THAT WHEREAS, the wife has commenced an action for the Dissolution of Marriage, and for a final adjudication continuous the marital property rights of the parties hereto; and

WHEREAS, said parties desire to settle and adjust amicably certain matters arising out of redd cause of action;

NOW THEREFORE, in the event a Judgment for Dissolution of Marriage shall be entered in the processings now pending in the Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois, in respect to the matters set forth in the Petition therein filed;

IT IS HEREBY MUTUALLY AGREED, by and between the parties hereto, as follows:

- 1. That the wife shall receive as her own personal and separate property, free and clear of any claim of any nature, kind of description, all of her personal belongings.
- 2. That the husband shall receive as his own personal and separate property, free and clear of any claim of any nature, kind or description, all of his personal belongings.
  - 3. That the husband shall relinquish any and all interest

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in the marital home, commonly known as 7319 West 114th Street, Worth, Illinois, together with all household furniture and furnishings contained therein. The wife shall retain possession of the home so long as she remains unmarried, and so long as she resides in said home without a male resident, other than her childres. The husband shall continue to make mortgage payments as they become due, and will hold the wife harmless from any deficiency arraing from delinquent mortgage payments. In the event the wife remarries, sets up residence with a male companion, or otherwise moves from the marital home, the home is to be appraised, and/or sold, and the proceeds equally divided between the parties, or the wife may, if she so desires, purchase the husband's share. (Legal Description attached as "Exhibit A").

- 4. The husband shall keep a 1972 Ford LTD automobile which he has now in his possession, and he shall relinquish all claims to a 1980 Thunderbird automobile now in the possession of the wife.
- 5. The parties agree to be equally responsible for all of the outstanding debts in existence at the time of Dissolution, particularly a deficiency judgment which arose from the foreclosure of a Ford Van automobile no longer in their possession.
- 6. The husband shall be responsible for the payment of all Court costs and attorney's fees incurred for the fileing, preparation and presentation of the Dissolution of Marriage litigation.
- 7. The parties hereto each release unto the other, any and all rights, liens, claims or charges in, to, or upon any and all property, real, personal or mixed, of the other, and each of them

does renounce, quitclaim and convey any right, title or interest to the estate now owned or possessed by the other, or that they may hereafter acquire, and that upon the death of either one, the property, both real, personal and mixed, then owned by the said parties, shall pass by his or her Last Will & Testament, or by the laws of descent, as the case may be, free from any and all rights or claims of the other party.

:8. A copy of this Agreement may be exhibited and presented for the Court's approval at a hearing on the Petition for Dissolution of Marriage, and be incorporated with the Certificate of Evidence, and form a part of the Judgment for Dissolution.

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### AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT

THIS AMENDMENT to the Marital Settlement Agreement made on May 31, 1988, by and between KATHLEEN M. WOOD and THOMAS C. WOOD, and supplemented by testimony of KATHLEEN M. WOOD, in open Court on June 16, 1988, is made and entered into this 27 day of July, 1988, to ratify the prior Agreement and include provisions for child custody, child support and maintenance as agreed upon by the parties hereto, and provides:

- 9. That the wife shall have the care, custody, control and education of the minor child of the parties, JOHN WOOD, and the husband shall pay to the wife, as and for child support, the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per week; and the parties, recognizing that JOHN WOOD is permanently disabled, agree that said child support payments will be made on a permanent basis, to continue beyond his 18th birthday, until such time as he is deceased, or is otherwise emancipated from the care, custody, control and education of the wife. Said payments shall he made through the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois.
- 10. That the mortgage payments hereinbefors described, to be made by the husband, are to be made through the Cicrk of the Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois, distributed to the wife, who will be responsible for payment to the mortgage companies.
- 11. The wife reserves her right to claim maintenance from the husband, if and when the marital home is sold and mortgage payments, now serving as maintenance to the wife, cease. The husband waives his right to claim maintenance from the wife.
  - 12. The husband agrees to maintain, and keep current, a

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policy of life insurance on his life, in which JOHN WOOD is the named beneficiary.

13. The husband shall have the right of reasonable visitation with the minor child, JOHN WOOD, said visitation to continue beyond the time JOHN WOOD reaches majority and is in the care custody and control of the wife, and said visitation shall include every other weekend outside of the custodial home.

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
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
